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### QUO VADIS, CGC?

hen the Apostle Peter fled Rome to avoid being crucified, he was said to have met the risen Jesus on the road outside the city. Peter asked him, "Quo vadis?" (Where are you going?) The Lord replied, "Romam eo iterum crucifigi." (To Rome to be crucified again.) This gave Peter the courage to resume his ministry in Rome, which ended in martyrdom when he was crucified upside-down.

As Cebu Gospel Church enters its second century of existence, it is appropriate to ask ourselves the same question as Peter asked the Lord: Where are you going, Cebu Gospel Church?

To answer this question, we must reflect on the past and consider our present, before we can look on to the future. This is why we have devoted a substantial amount of ink in these pages to celebrate the past history and present success of our Church, so that we are reminded of God's grace for the past century, and to help us focus on where we must go in the future.

Speaking of which, there is someone I would like to commend for going far beyond the call of duty to research and write about our century-long history. Even though she was not a member of the Literature Committee, and was asked to do so very late in the process, Jocelyn Po accepted without hesitation and delivered what amounts to a short novella that details our history in vivid detail. Thank you very much!

In my view, there are two main threats that face a church in these modern times.

1. The book of Revelation was addressed to seven congregations of Asia Minor (modernday Turkey). The harshest message by far was reserved for the church in Laodicea.

"I know your works: You are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth. For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked.

#### Revelations 3:14-17 ESV

Being lukewarm means that the faith is completely devoid of passion. A lack of faith, the Lord can handle, but faith without passion, without joy or love, sickens him. This kind of faith is something that all churches must be wary of today.

 Many churches in the United States are declining; there are dramatic decreases in the number of churches, as well as church-attending Christians particularly among the Millennials. Many reasons are given, including the hypocritical behavior of many church-goers, the increasing inward focus of many churches leading to a country club mentality, and the rise of mega-Churches. Whatever the reason, this is certainly a threat that Cebu Gospel Church may face in the future.

Beyond our Centennial celebration, we must refocus on our Church's vision (To be a Biblebelieving Filipino-Chinese Church that develops Christ-glorifying Christians.) and bear in mind the aspirations enumerated by Rev. Vicente Sia:

- Present our bodies as living sacrifices, holy and acceptable to God, and not conform to the world but be transformed by the renewal of our minds. (Romans 12:1-2)
- Pursue spiritual growth that is rooted and built up in Christ Jesus, and develop an intimate relationship with the Lord through prayer, meditation, worship, and the attendance of Bible study groups. (Colossians 2:6-7)
- 3. Equip the younger generation to fulfill the Great Commission given in Matthew 28:18-20.

While we do not face imminent death as Peter did, our challenge is no less formidable. For only with the grace of God can the chorus of our 100<sup>th</sup> Aniversary Hymn for Cebu Gospel Church to "shine a hundred years more" be fulfilled. Quo vadis, CGC?

# GOD'S ABUNDANT GRACE

he psalmist declares in Psalm 103 that our awesome God is a compassionate and gracious God. He is also "slow to anger, abounding in love." (Psalm 103:8) Our God is really a God of abundant grace. As we celebrate 100 years of His faithfulness to Cebu Gospel Church, we meditate on the four aspects of His Abundant Grace.

#### 1. Saving Grace – His Redemptive Grace

The saving grace of God is redemptive, for "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in him, shall not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16).

He initiated our salvation, because it is his heart's desire to be "patient with us, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9). He "wants also all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth." (1 Timothy 2:4)

Hence, His saving grace can be experienced by us through our simple faith on Him – that His blood shed on the cross on Calvary is sufficient to wash and forgive all of our sins.

But, it is efficient only to those who acknowledge Him as Savior and Lord. Ephesians 2:8-9 says "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast."

The free gift of salvation is offered to everyone. If you believe that He died for you on the cross, acknowledge that you are a sinner, confess your sins to Him, and ask for the washing of your sins through His blood, you are saved! You start the first step of the abundant grace of God!

Have you experienced God's saving grace?

#### 2. Sustaining Grace – His Restorative Grace

After we encountered Jesus and received His forgiveness of sin, we follow by doing what Ephesians 2:10 tells us: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works which God prepared in advance for us to do."

The result of God's redemptive saving grace is we start to be molded into the likeness of Christ, so we can follow and serve Him through the local church we belong to. We must deny ourselves and carry our own cross and follow Him.

We are gifted with spiritual gifts that will enhance our service for Him. Each of us will receive a specific gift, or even multiple gifts, given to us through His Holy Spirit. 1 Corinthians 12:11 says, "All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and He distributes them to each one, just as He determines."

As we grow the grace and knowledge furnished by our Lord Jesus Christ into spiritual maturity, and excel and flourish in our service for Him, we have the following principles that enhance our continuous growth in Him: (a) "apart from Him, we can do nothing," (John 15:5b); (b) we "can do all things through Him who gives us strength," (Philippians 4:13); and (c) Trust in the Lord with all our hearts, and lean not on our own understanding; in all our ways submit to Him, and he will make our paths straight." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Since we are all sinners saved by grace, once in a while we will stumble, get discouraged, and think about quitting our service for Him. Instead of looking at Him, we look sideways and look inside us. We get depressed, and feel weak and weary in our journey with Him.

His sustaining restorative grace will be upon us. Jude says in his doxology: "To Him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you before His glorious presence without fault and with great joy." (Jude 1:24)

But, before this verse, there is a formula to experience God's sustaining grace. Jude elaborated: (a) build ourselves up in our most holy faith; (b) pray in the Holy Spirit; (c) keep ourselves in God's love; (d) wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring us to eternal life. (v20-21). His sustaining grace is possible only if we have the four spiritual disciplines mentioned by Jude in his epistle. Therefore, we should do these four disciplines every day in our spiritual journey.

In 1 Peter 5:10, it says also, "And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong firm and steadfast."

Are you experiencing His sustaining grace?

#### 3. Strengthening Grace – His Reinvigorating Grace

All of us will testify with one accord that His sustaining grace is really very powerful. But when we walk with Him in our spiritual journey, we serve not only a disciple of, but as spiritual soldiers for Christ.

We fight the spiritual battle every day of our lives here on this Earth. The apostle Paul stated in Ephesians 6:10-12: "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

We are being attacked in three areas of our lives: physical, emotional, and spiritual. We are not immune to any kind of infirmity or sickness. Some of us might undergo a kind of struggle, as said in Romans 8:22-23: "We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies."

God's sustaining reinvigorating grace comes in when we experience Romans 8:26-27: "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.

And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God." Then, Romans 8:28 is manifested in our lives: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those of those love Him."

His sustaining grace was defined in Romans 8:32 – "He who did not spare His own Son, but give Him up for us all – how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" Jesus chose us, justified us, and was seated at the right hand of God to intercede for us. (v33-34) Therefore, God's sustaining grace will give us the victory we can claim every day – "we are more than conquerors though him who loved us." (v37)

We will proclaim, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (v38-39).

We can be strengthened and reinvigorated by His grace when we draw near the throne of grace. Hebrews 4:16 says, "Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

#### 4. Sufficient Grace - His Revitalizing Grace

All of us must be involved in the church ministry in one way or another. It is in accordance with the gift(s) we received from the Holy Spirit. Remember that we must not serve the Lord only in our own capacity, using our own skill and talent. Yes, we can utilize our own skill and talent, but this must be coupled with the spiritual gifting the Holy Spirit bestowed upon us.

As we serve Him, we will experience the personal struggle apostle Paul had regarding the thorn in his flesh. Paul can arguably be considered as the most gifted apostle – he wrote almost 13 of the New Testament epistles; he made three missionary trips, and he was also the most persecuted. Paul had the most esteemed, and highest education one can attain at his time, he could have been very boastful and proud. After all, was he not the best servant of God through the ages? But, the Lord permitted a "thorn in his flesh" to make Paul humble and meek so he could to serve Him!

Let us observe what he experienced in 2 Corinthians 12:7-10: "To keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I plead with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

His sustaining, revitalizing grace sustained the Universal Church throughout the ages. After two millennia and sixteen years in the historical record, millions of sustained Christians have experienced the grace sufficient for us; His power is made perfect in weakness! Did you experience this too? Say Amen! Now!

May the Lord and Head of the Universal Church continue to sustain us the four aspects of His abundant grace, until His second coming! These four must be sequential to each other, for without the first saving grace, you cannot experience the following three graces that are sustaining, strengthening, and sufficient! And, although it's made possible solely by grace, we have a part of experiencing it – it's all by faith in Him alone!

### GOD'S AMAZING GRACE

PHESIANS 2:8-9: For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast.

What is so amazing about God's grace? What is the meaning of G.R.A.C.E.?

#### **G**IFT OF GOD TO UNDESERVING SINNERS

For it is by grace you have been saved. So Grace is the gift of God to sinners.

GRACE IS ALL <u>GOD'S DOING</u>, He gives it to us, and our role is just to simply <u>accept the gift</u>.

God's Role:

- 1. So willingly has a big heart
- 2. No expectation of return

My Role:

- 1. We simply receive
- 2. Give thanks

When we give gifts, we give them to the person we love, not to those we don't. The person we love more, we give bigger portions. But this is not the case for God; his gifts are not based on us, but based on him. It is by the <u>great love of God</u> that we receive gifts which we do not deserve.

When Jesus was crucified, there were two criminals crucified beside him; one to his right, and the other to his left. One mocked Jesus while the other one admitted that he deserved to be crucified for the things he did. He asked Jesus to remember him when Jesus enters the Kingdom of God.

What did Jesus say? His response was: "Truly I say to you, today you shall be with Me in Paradise." Did the criminal do anything to deserve the gift of God? No, he just believed. And this is the same gift God has given to us – what we needed most.

#### REDEMPTION OF GOD TO SET US FREE

What are we to be freed from? None other than the bondage of sin.

No one can dare to say that he has no sin. No matter how much we try to be good and strive to reach the perfection which is the standard set by our Holy God, we miss the mark because of SIN. In Mark 10:17-27, a rich young man asked Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" He claimed that he follows all the Commandments. But when Jesus told him to sell everything he owned and follow him, he was saddened and turned away.

Why? Because he owned much property that he just couldn't easily let go. His actions proved that he loved earthly treasures more than surrendering his life to Christ. You cannot love money, and at the same time, love God.

YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED ALREADY. IT IS ONLY THROUGH GOD'S GRACE THAT OUR SINS WERE FORGIVEN.

Sinners can freely receive the forgiveness of sin, which speaks to our own unworthiness and the spontaneous redeeming act of God in Christ Jesus.

Psalm 103:2-3 says: "Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits – who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases." When God forgives us, he takes away the guilt. He heals the heart first and gives us peace. This is just like removing a BIG STONE that hinders us from growing.

2 Corinthians 5:21 says: "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." GOD PLACES HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS IN US AND ABSORBS OUR UNRIGHTEOUSNESS IN HIM.

#### ACCESS TO GOD'S BLESSING

What blessings do we receive from God? It is the transformation our lives.

When people in the Bible greet one another, they wish each other **grace** and **peace**. They do this because we receive grace from God, and so is our spiritual gift from Him. Jews greet each other with the word "shalom", which means peace.



When we combine the two words, they form a <u>complete</u> blessing. When you have the grace of God, then and only then you will have peace in your heart. Without the grace of God, you will find no peace and no assurance of Salvation.

Does that mean that Christian life is a bed of roses? No. Remember, a rose has many thorns, so Christians do experience problems. But in the midst of the struggle deep within you, you will find peace in knowing that God is with us in every circumstance we face, for our God will never leave nor forsake us. And we can do all things through Him who gives us strength. The presence of thorns accentuates a rose and make it all the more beautiful.

The same thing applies to Christians: God gives us trials to mold us, so that we can reach the next step in our growth and be like Christ.

#### CHARACTER OF GOD

When a person receives God's grace, it is only then that his life will start to transform. God can start to change our character and behavior. By receiving God's grace, we can start to imitate Christ. The grace of God is so powerful that it can change our old nature into a new one. A person who receives God's grace can feel changes in his or her life, and will start living for him.

Romans 6:22: But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life.

2 Corinthians 5:17 – Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, that person is a new creation: the old has gone, the new is here.

The Bible gave us the example of Zacchaeus, a tax collector. He was one of the Jews who were working for the hated Romans, were traitors to their own countrymen, and would collect more than required, keeping the extra for themselves. After he met Christ, his life was totally transformed.

Not only did he give half of his money to the poor, but he would also repay the people he cheated four times what he cheated them. Only a powerful God could transform one's life that radically.

#### ETERNAL LIFE IS GOD'S HOPE FOR MANKIND

What is men's greatest hope which only God can fulfill? It is none other than eternal life from God. By God's grace, we can have eternal life from God.

Brethren, do you realize that people outside Christ have no assurance of salvation? No hope, no future, and no direction? Grace is given by God through their acceptance of Jesus Christ. Then and only then could we have assurance of salvation.

As Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me". Jesus didn't say that he is a way, which is an indefinite article meaning not specific. But Christ used the article "the" which shows a definite thing. He is <u>the</u> only way to God the Father.

Salvation is free and is in the hand of our Lord Jesus Christ. For those who ask for forgiveness, they will be forgiven, and in return he will give them ETERNAL LIFE.

Cebu Gospel Church celebrated 100 years last March 20, 2016, and it is all through God's amazing grace. To God be the Glory!

blessed Centennial Anniversary to Cebu Gospel Church! One hundred years of God's faithfulness is indeed a milestone for a church's history. I pray that you will be faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ and His Word: the Bible.

Generation after generation may pass, but His Word will never change or pass away (Matthew 24:35). Let His Word be the final authority in your life and doctrine.

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Storms are meant to strengthen our faith and allow us to experience God in a real and powerful way. Their purpose is to prove to us that He is there. In the July 29 entry on his classic devotional book "My Utmost for His Highest," Oswald Chambers wrote:

In the Bible clouds are always associated with God. Clouds are the sorrow, sufferings, or providential circumstances, within or without our personal lives, which actually seem to contradict the sovereignty of God. Yet it is through these very clouds that the Spirit of God is teaching us how to walk by faith... The clouds are the dust of His feet' (Nahum 1: 3). They are a sign that God is there.<sup>1</sup>

Testing or trials are ordained by God so we may know Him on a deeper level. The disciples knew that Jesus can heal the sick, give sight to the blind, make the lame walk, and feed the five thousand.

But it took the death of Lazarus to show them that He can even raise the dead! The disciples have to go through a storm in the sea and reach their wits' end before they could say, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey Him!"<sup>2</sup>

As long as we abide in the Lord and His words abide in us, we can ask Him whatever we wish, and He will do it for us.<sup>3</sup> He is the same yesterday and today and forever.<sup>4</sup> And "because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions

## MARCHING WITH AN AIM

t's so wonderful to look back and recall our experiences in life. Our lives have different stories to tell, and every chapter of it unfolds different stories that we can share to others. It is amazing to see what God does when we allow ourselves to do His will.

One of God's calling in my life is to serve Cebu Christian School, presently known as the Philippine Christian Gospel School. I was invited to join the school, and served as the school's chaplain, and at the same time, disciplinarian. Since I knew that this was the will of my Heavenly Father, I had to submit to it. I started working in the school in 1977. "It has been imprinted in the hearts and minds of every student that serving God should always be a top priority."

As I recall, the population of the school was overwhelming, as there were almost two thousand students enrolled! It was also the same year when I got married to Maria Lee, who was at that time the directress of the school.

Being a chaplain of a school with so many students was really a challenge for me. When I accepted the invitation, I regarded the school as a place where I could lead students to know the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. I was encouraged and led by Christ to accept this role so that, in one way or another, I could lead teachers as well as parents to Christ. As school chaplain, I had to take good care of the chapel hour for students from grade one to fourth year.

At that time, we had a lot of Christian students and teachers who were also doing the ministry that God told them to do, and their existence was a great help to the school in order for it to achieve its mission and vision. The school's mission was to give the best education to the student, and to teach the students moral values based on the Bible.

Today, there are many professionals who graduated from the school and are grateful that they were able to study in a Bible-believing institution. It is great to know that there are students who are active in their home churches; there are those who are leaders, deacons and elders in different churches, and there are even those who are leading or pastoring churches in different places in the Philippines.

Every Saturday, I used to conduct Bible study for the students, and to my recollection, there were many students who have joined for years. During summer vacation, I conducted summer camps for the students in different locations in Cebu. These camps played a very important role, as many studentcampers were brought to the Lord Jesus Christ.

I also had the privilege of preaching in Cebu Gospel Church once a month, while I was chaplain of Cebu Christian School. I also joined the Cebu Gospel Church Choir when Mrs. Hattie Yu was the conductress. I was also invited to speak in different fellowships in Cebu Gospel Church. As chaplain, I wanted to encourage students to bring out the best in them by sharing their Godgiven talents, so I organized two singing groups in the school: the "Soul Searchers" and the "Joyful Courriers." Both were chorale groups consisting of 15-20 students, whose mission was to visit different churches, and to render special numbers on Sundays and also during special occasions.

The Soul Searchers traveled to different parts of the Philippines, holding evangelistic concerts. They have reached as far as Singapore and Bangkok, Thailand. The Soul Searchers are still active today in Cebu Gospel Church. At present, two members of this group are now serving as full-time pastors.

It is good to know that my students are now playing important roles in Cebu Gospel Church and in Philippine Christian Gospel School. There are also those who are serving the country as government officials. Knowing all these, I could say that our labor in the Lord will never go in vain. The seeds which have been sown in the school are clearly bearing so much fruit.

We just hope and pray that these students will stand firm and will be a channel of blessing to those around them. The Bible classes conducted in the school together with other Bible-oriented activities encouraged the students to make use of their talents for the glory of God. It has been imprinted in the hearts and minds of every student that serving God should always be a top priority.

We should always remember that school plays a vital role in building a person. The Bible should always be our daily guide as children of God, which is why we have to teach it to our children and our children's children. This book will shape and mold us to what we will become. The Bible clearly reminds us, "Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105) The Bible provides us with a guide, "How can a young man keep his way pure? By guarding it according to thy Word." (Psalm 119:9)



# STEPPING OUT IN FAITH

raise the Lord for His mighty works in Cebu Gospel Church for the past 100 years. My wife Christina and I were privileged to be called to serve in this church from 1974 to 1985.

42 years ago when we graduated from the seminary in Hong Kong, we heard about the urgent need of Cebu Gospel Church because the old pastor had a stroke. After much prayer, we decided to accept this calling of God. With simple faith, we stepped out into this "new & unfamiliar territory" three months after our marriage. We were young and inexperienced, we spoke neither Amoy nor Cebuano; yet the brothers & sisters in the church accepted us as one of their own and helped us to adapt to the new environment.

I began my ministry serving in the English Congregation and among the young people, while Christina helped the women and served in the music ministry besides assisting me.

Learning to speak the Amoy dialect wasn't easy for me at all. An older sister in Christ was kind enough to teach me to read the Bible using the Roman phonetics every day. It took me one whole year before I could preach in Amoy. Christina was smarter than me. She was able to give a sermon in Amoy in just four months. We felt a lot closer to the members when we spoke their language.

Our three children, Vivian, Karen and Calvin, were all born in the Philippines. The sisters were so nice to us and looked after Christina especially after she gave birth. They would cook all kinds of nutritious dishes for her (I was lucky to gain weight, too).

Even during ordinary days, the sisters would deliver fresh fruits, eggs, cakes, etc. to the parsonage. Oftentimes we were treated into their homes or restaurants for dinners and feasts.

We soon learned that the Amoy Christians love and respect their pastors. Their ancestors also loved God very much and respected God's servants. They are greatly blessed by God!

When we began our ministry, someone told us that Cebu was a big hard rock for the Gospel seed. We were not discouraged because we knew that "with God, nothing is impossible."

Visitation with prayers were our constant ministry during the week. Even though Satan's grip on people was strong, God still worked in miraculous ways.

One brother later admitted that previously he was a drunkard and he never paid attention to the gospel. But one day, he fell from the stairs after drinking heavily, and found himself still alive. He immediately decided to accept Jesus Christ whom he heard so many times. Another businessman boasted that he didn't need to repent because he could always go up to Heaven tugging on his children's clothes. I remember visiting him more than ten times and praying for him.

Finally God softened his heart and he accepted Jesus as his personal Savior. Later, he even became the chairman of the Brothers' Fellowship. Praise the Lord!

Six years into the ministry I prayed for further studies in the U.S., but Christina was very hesitant because of our financial situation. Miraculously, a missionary couple came for a church visit two weeks later.

When they heard about Christina's worries, the missionary asked, "How many Israelites did Moses lead across the Red Sea?"

Christina answered, "Two million."

"How many years were they in the wilderness?"

"Forty."

"Were they not clothed well and fed well and their shoes not broken? Now, how many are there in your family? Going to U.S. for how many years? Do you think if it's God's will, He will provide?"

After encouraging and praying for us, the missionary couple left. Our faith was much strengthened. We decided to lean on His promises for all our needs. Praise the Lord, He moved in mysterious ways.

Cebu Gospel Church, our relatives, and some individual brothers & sisters promised to support and pray for us.

During those two years, though sometimes we were uncertain of our tomorrows, yet God always sent His crows to deliver "meats" through the mail on time. He never fails! Hallelujah to our Almighty God and caring Father.

Upon graduation from Wheaton Graduate School, I returned with my family to Cebu. By the grace of God and recommendation of the church, I was ordained in 1983. The church started the Sunday School Education building project. Together we finished the project by faith, lacking nothing.



We continued to serve with more emphasis on discipleship among the young people. Our church has a good Christian school with a committed chaplain who worked closely with good Christian teachers.

Many young people accepted Christ. I encouraged them to join the 6 AM prayer meeting each Saturday. After the meeting, we would invite them to have breakfast in our parsonage upstairs. Then we would study the Bible together or do visitation.

We thank God that over the 11 years, about ten young people dedicated themselves and graduated from the seminary. Two of them returned to serve in the Church, one as a pastor and the other as the principal of Philippine Christian Gospel School.

Every time when Christina & I revisited Cebu, we are so excited to see many of the young people grow up to be mature leaders of the church, some even becoming elders and deacons. We are thrilled to see the establishment of Mandaue Gospel Church, which has now become independent. We are so thankful to God that our church helped in relief work of typhoon and earthquake victims, continues supporting evangelistic work among the local Filipino people, and puts emphasis in missions and support of seminaries.

On the Sunday preceding our Centennial Celebration, I shared the message entitled, "Always Remember These Things" (2 Peter 1:12-21). May we continue to stand firm upon our foundation of faith, and grow in God's word to attain abundance in Christ.

As our Centennial Song goes, "One hundred years she stood faithful and true, May Cebu Gospel Church glorify you!"

God is faithful! May His name be praised forever!

### I SERVED AS A MISSIONARY AND PASTOR OF CGC

y first contact with Cebu Gospel Church (CGC) happened in 1965 when Rev. Joseph Young, then senior pastor of CGC, came to Zamboanga City to recruit missionaries to support their inaugural Mission Emphasis Week. Pastor Mariano Yeo, pastor of Jolo Evangelical

Church, introduced me to Rev. Young, who then asked me to meet with him for a brief interview.

Several weeks later, I received his letter informing me that the Mission Board has decided to support me as one of the first three missionaries of Cebu Gospel Church. The other two were Pastor Guzman Ravelo of Tribal Missions and Pastor Quirino from the United Church of Christ in Cotabato City. As a missionary, I had to come to Cebu every Mission Emphasis Week to give my Annual Report. It was during these times that I came to know Rev. Peter Lim, Rev. Lim Hui Khim, Bible women Juanita Go Phek Eng, Tiu Kim Eng, Ong Leh Hua, Elders Go Hong Chiu, Sun Din Liuson, Joseph Que, Lim Kay Chun, C.J Huang, Lim Giok Su, and more.

In 1969, Rev. Joseph Young, who was then-pastor of Quezon City Evangelical Church, and was aware of my desire to become a full-fledged pastor, encouraged me to go to seminary. So I enrolled at Ebenezer Bible College in Zamboanga City.

But every September, I continued to attend the annual Mission Emphasis week in CGC until 1971 when I got married. The following year, the UECP Evangelistic Band requested us to write to the CGC Council to thank them for their support, and to request them to discontinue their support, because the United Evangelistic Band of the UECP will henceforth defray the cost of our studies. I thought that this signaled the end of my ties with Cebu Gospel Church.

Never did I dream that God had a better plan for us. Because in 1977, without our knowledge, Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) Manila approved a recommendation to assign me to Cebu to manage DYFR, their station in Cebu.

We arrived in Cebuin the fall of 1977, and began attending worship service and serving at CGC. I was always conscious of one thing – Cebu Gospel Church helped molded my ministry in the past, so I resolved, by God's grace, to give my all to repay them for all their kindnesses to me.

So immediately, my wife and I got ourselves involved in the various ministries of the Church. CGC began to invite me to speak regularly in the English and Chinese morning worship services. I started to attend the Christian Youth Fellowship and served as a counselor, thus becoming co-workers with Rev. and Mrs. Michael Tsang.

In all my years at Cebu Gospel Church which spanned more than two decades, I feel that the CYF of the 1970s made the greatest impact on me. Many of its members have now become our present leaders. Praise God for these faithful, dedicated and committed youth of the past who have given their best, especially during summer and winter conferences.

Soon, the Christian Education Department invited me to teach a Sunday School Class. In the meantime, I started to attend the Wednesday evening and Saturday morning prayer meetings, and also helped in the Carmel Fellowship.

Later on, the Joybells Singing group, under the tutelage of Deaconess Hattie Yu, asked me to lead their weeklv Bible Study. As if these were not enough, the Mission assigned Board also me to visit Surigao Gospel Church every month for visitation work, youth work, pulpit ministry and to officiate the Holy Communion.

1981, In Pastor and Mrs. Tsang left for the U.S for further study, leaving only Rev. Liang and Bible-woman Pilar Siao to handle both the English and Chinese congregations, and Bible-woman Go Phek Eng who was actively involved in visitation work.

In its desire to enlist us to join the Church staff on a full-time basis, the Church Council dispatched someone to give me a formal invitation. I politely told them I can't accept the offer, because I was working for FEBC. Their response was to increase my responsibilities tremendously to include weddings, memorial services, hospital visitations and many others.

Unfortunately, my partnership with Rev. Liang in the ministry was short-lived, because a year later, he went to be with the Lord. All the more, my load became heavier. I felt I was acting as a "semi-interim" pastor of the church while waiting for the return of Pastor and Mrs. Tsang.

In 1982, when I was at the height of my ministry at DYFR, the CGC Council, through the initiative of brother Nelson Ting (Sy Un), started discussing the possibility of sending me to China Evangelical Seminary (CES) in Taiwan for further studies.

At first, I did not pay much attention to this matter because I was not interested in going to Taiwan. I knew my limitations. Moreover, I was fully aware that CES is one of the two top Chinese seminaries in the world. Their medium of instruction was entirely in Mandarin. Many times, I asked myself if this was a joke. So, when brother Sy Un approached me the second time to encourage and convince me to accept, I was adamant in my decision. I politely told him I was not interested.

But God won't accept a "no" from me. Finally, I gave in to His demand, when God answered my prayer. His answer did not leave me any place to hide in. Towards the fall of 1983, my family left on a China Airlines flight to Taipei, and I enrolled in CES. Those were tough years for someone like me. But by God's grace, I was able to overcome all my shortcomings. The two kids were able to study at the local elementary school despite the high standards of Chinese education there.



In the summer of 1985, we returned to Cebu, all prepared to work with Pastor Tsang, only to find out that he had resigned and was preparing to leave for Austin, Texas. Praise God that despite his resignation, I was still able to work together with him for a few months until the Tsangs left for Hong Kong to await their immigrant visas from the U.S embassy.

One of the first things we have to do after our return was to prepare for the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Church. Everyone cooperated, and the Anniversary Celebration went well (praise God). Praise the Lord, the Celebration was well-attended, and various church delegates from Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao attended. Dr. Philip Teng (Kun Hui) of the Hong Kong Christian & Missionary Alliance Church was our guest speaker.

The next task we faced and solved was the perennial clamor to merge the English 8:00 AM and the Chinese 9:30 AM Sunday worship services. You see, although the two separate services have their own advantages, we discovered that by the late 80s, the English service was attracting more people especially from the younger generation, and the numbers in the Chinese worship have drastically decreased. Many from the Chinese congregation expressed alarm over the situation. Thus the incessant calls to merge the two.

The plan to merge has been on-and-off the agenda of the Church Council for several years. It has been studied and discussed, but to no avail; it was ultimately shelved for further prayer, study and future deliberation. But God, in His mercy, answered our prayers.

In 1987, for the first time in our church history, more than ten Church Elders and Deacons

attended the National Retreat in Baguio City. The Conference gave them a vision and a challenge for the Church. One of the results of that vision was the merging of the two services into a single bilingual service with interpretation.

The next problem that beset us was the ventilation of the Sanctuary. There were several views propounded as solutions; one of them was to install air-conditioners. The idea was right, but no one knew how to do it. The only answer we got was, "It can't be done. Impossible. The ceiling of the church is too high." The funny thing was all of us agreed.

Until I called up Architect Philip Recto (a famous architect who has designed most of the Chinese churches in the Philippines for free) to come from Manila and help us. He came on his own expense and told me directly, "No problem with air-conditioning." When I mentioned the high ceiling, he said, "Cool air goes down, hot air goes up." The Church Council immediately went into action and started the fundraising for the air-conditioners. Several months later, our Church became one of the first, if not the very first, air-conditioned churches in Cebu.

In the following years, God led me to call in Rev. Paul Huang from Bacolod, Rev. Himlal Pradhan, Rev. Mike Phua, Rev. Felix Ong from Dumaguete, Rev. John Ong from Iloilo, and Rev. Albert Ong and a delegate from Tacloban, to form the Visayas Christian Workers Fellowship, with the acronym CBDTI (Cebu, Bacolod Dumaguete, Tacloban, and Iloilo). The purpose was to foster closer fellowship among these churches by holding a CBDTI Youth Conference and a CBDTI Workers Retreat every other year.

But one of the most memorable experiences I cherished during my 14 years of ministry was the existence of the Monday and Saturday Bible study groups. The study groups were originally designed as a Christian growth Bible study, but God had a different plan. He turned it into an evangelistic Bible study. We praise God for the fruits of these Bible studies. Souls were converted and baptized – not only individuals, but also whole families. Many backsliders were restored, and even became laboring Church officers. Praise God, for up this time, these brethren are still laboring joyously in the ministry of the Lord in Cebu Gospel Church. **To GOD ALONE BE ALL THE GLORY AND HONOR!**

believed everyone have experienced grace in their lives, one way or the other. Grace is something you receive that you didn't deserve.

In our lives, there are many times when we could see His grace in action, but we tend to take it for granted.

As I look back, my own life is a grace from God. Why? Because I had lots of accidents, such as: almost drowning to death in a river; drinking gasoline that I mistook as water or 7-Up; falling down from the rooftop; getting hit by a car while riding a bicycle; and having a firecracker almost explode while it was still in my hand.

If I wasn't a Christian, I would believe that I have seven lives, just like a cat. But no, it's all through God's Grace why I'm still alive, and the incidents I mentioned turned out to be a near-miss or a minor accident. In fact, the most dangerous event of my life was when I delivered my son into this world. I almost died, to the point that my husband had to sign a waiver to absolve the hospital from responsibility in the case of my death or my son's death.

You see, my son was born with his umbilical cord wrapped around his neck, a condition called a **nuchal cord**. My OB/GYN had to use forceps to pull him out, and I bled profusely due to weak tissue. After I was stitched shut, I needed five bags of blood to be transfused to save my life. Throughout the ordeal, God had provided everything. Consider that during those days, not all hospitals maintain adequate supply of blood. In His Grace, God allowed me to confined in an affiliate hospital of the prestigious St. Luke's Medical Center, where we received a big discount.

So that's why it's all but the grace of God that up to today, I can continue to serve the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. As **Hebrews 4:16** says, "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

As my son grew up, we dedicated him to the Lord. Dedicating my son means to let God use him for whatever purpose He wants him to serve. I remember one pastor preaching about God asking Solomon what he wanted. Was is it wealth, power or wisdom? Solomon chose wisdom and knowledge so he could govern His people. I was praying in my heart: "Lord, my desire is for my son to have wisdom and knowledge as well so he could give glory unto your name."

Indeed, God answered our prayer, He gave my son the ability to read and count before Nursery. He was a consistent honor student, and graduated as valedictorian during primary school. By the Lord's Grace, my son was able to win competitions within and even outside the school, both local as well as international.

But no, it wasn't our genes or superior parenting skills that led to his accomplishments; we recognize that it all comes from the Lord.

I do believe some of your child(ren) have achieved much; if this is so, let us share how our Great God works in our lives and in the lives of our loved ones.

Serving in Mandaue Gospel Church is also another answered prayer. God impressed in my heart to serve Him in a small church outside Metro Manila ever since I was in the seminary.

I am glad to see how God has used MGC to transform the lives of its members, and to reach out to their unsaved friends and families.

It is also a blessing to see fellow Christians who are now serving the Lord more actively. They progressed from only attending Sunday worship service then, to doing visitations and thinking of ways to participate in the ministry today, for they see the need to do their parts in expanding God's Kingdom.

I hope and pray that more disciples of Christ will be trained, and that there will be small groups to meet each member's needs.

This will all be done on His perfect time and by His Grace, and will be another answered prayer, for nothing is impossible with God.

Allow me to end with a statement from the missionary William Carrey: "Expect great things from God; attempt great things for God."

# GOD'S UNMERITED GRACE

reetings everyone! It has been a while since I last wrote an article for Gospel Light. During the past two years, my wife and I have been doing God's work within the city through off-campus discipleship with students, and later also with adults. I was requested by the Literature Committee to write an article; thank God it was about grace.



Truly it was only by God's grace that we have continued our labor for the Lord's vineyard here in the city of Cebu. Glory be to God and Him alone!

Last June 13, a dear friend and brethren in the Lord reminded me that the deadline for submission of the article was on the 30<sup>th</sup> of June. On that very day, as soon as I found time, I started to gather my thoughts and researched a few stories online, which led me to the news about a pastor who committed suicide.

The pastor was said to have recently remarked, "Sometimes I don't feel like God is hearing me." Pastor Teddy Parker died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound in the driveway of his home while his 800-member church and his family waited for him to show up to preach that Sunday morning.

Parker's longtime friend, Dr. E. Dewey Smith Jr., senior pastor at The House of Hope Atlanta later explained: "He was suffering with ... some emotional issues that he had been dealing with ... He needed to take a break from ministry and the way our culture is, the culture forbids that. How much do you share? How much grace do people allow?"<sup>1</sup>

"Biblically, grace actually means the favor or kindness shown without regard to the worth or merit of the one who receives it and in spite of what that person deserves."<sup>2</sup>

I guess it won't be too much to say that Christians should understand and extend grace more than anyone else, simply because we are recipients of God's unmerited grace. But more often than not, this is not the case.

Which reminds me of the parable of the moneylender and the two debtors found in Luke 7:41-43, spoken by the Lord Jesus Christ against the Pharisees. The church is not a place for perfect people, but heaven is; so as people of grace, the body of Christ should learn to extend grace to others as well.

Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; <sup>26</sup> on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; <sup>27</sup> in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.<sup>28</sup> And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches. <sup>29</sup> Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to fall, and I am not indignant? <sup>30</sup> If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness. <sup>31</sup> The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, He who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. <sup>32</sup> At Damascus, the governor under King Aretas was guarding the city of Damascus in order to seize me, <sup>33</sup> but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall and escaped his hands.

Reading through Paul's two letters to Corinth, it was clear that some have maligned him and discredited both his ministry and his authority as apostle of Jesus Christ. Without a doubt, Paul suffered so much, yet he remained faithful and served the Lord Jesus until he was martyred for his faith.

I guess, given the same predicament, anyone could have simply walked away and stopped doing God's work. Indeed, how little grace do people allow! But Paul took everything in and continued on.

Shouldn't we Christians, who claim faith in Jesus' name, persevere and do the same? Yes, we should, and the Lord expects us to do so. The Apostle Paul wrote, "For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in Him but also suffer for His sake, engaged in the same conflict that you saw I had and now hear that I still have."<sup>3</sup>

Many Christians, and worse, even fellow pastors today, have a wrong notion of God's grace. We behave as though God owes us good things. We can't even appreciate suffering for Christ as a good thing for our Christian growth. We do a little good deed, and in return expect or think that God owes us a favor. We forget that we were unworthy of His grace in the first place! For the Bible said, "But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."<sup>4</sup>

We can never comprehend God's grace, not until we see our own unworthiness; that we are nothing before Him. Our labor, success, or good deeds are simply results of God's grace. The Scriptures said, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."<sup>5</sup>

Paul understood grace; he recognized and knew that God can do His will without him, so he was simply a recipient of God's grace. Hence, in his letter to Timothy, Paul wrote: "I thank Him (God) who has given me strength, Christ Jesus our Lord, because He judged me faithful, appointing me to His service, though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy ... and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus."<sup>6</sup>

Many times, Christians fall to the temptation of Satan. Petty feuds and quarrels consume the church. We forget that we are all recipients of God's grace. We are "God's fellow workers ... God's field, God's building."<sup>7</sup> So Jesus said, "We must work the works of Him (God) who sent Me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work." <sup>8</sup>

Cebu Gospel Church, let us learn grace; and that we are people of grace. Unmerited grace; let us keep that in mind. So we should be thankful for everything that comes our way. God is good! It is not true that God fails to listen to us. Rather, it's actually the other way around; we often fail to see that God is gracious. He has actually given us more than we deserve. And whenever God allows trouble or pain to come before us, the Lord was simply being Himself – in that He is good. For God did say "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness."<sup>9</sup>

The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be with you all in Christ Jesus. Hmen.10

# GOD'S GRACE: TO CGC AND THROUGH CGC

am a living testimony of God's grace through Cebu Gospel Church (CGC).

1998: God used CGC to give me opportunities to serve and learn

Thank God the President of the Biblical Seminary of the Philippines did not listen to me 18 years ago, or I might never have met the CGC family.
When Dr. Joseph Shao informed me that CGC needed a youth pastor and he would like me to go to CGC for my BSOP summer internship, I pointed out that since I was going to become a missionary, other seminarians should be sent instead. But he was the President and I was the Student, so in the end, Jennifer "Kim" Chua and I were sent to CGC.

After arriving at Cebu, as soon as I had the opportunity, I explained to Atsiok hia and Nixon hia—who were the deacons in charge of the Youth Ministry at that time—that my burden was missions. So I was very sorry, but I could not serve as pastor at CGC after my graduation from BSOP.

But God is sovereign. Weaving my life into the lives of CGC people was part of His eternal plan to bring glory to His name.

That summer, Kim and I each taught and spoke an average of four times a week. Aside from all the usual ministries like prayer meetings (Wednesdays and Saturdays), fellowships (Sisters' Fellowship, YPF, CYF, etc.) and Sunday School (for both Adults and Children), there were specially-scheduled three-day seminars, like "How to do Devotion."

We stayed at the church and were given food allowance, but we were often treated to lunch, dinner, and even after-dinner halo-halo or coffee by the pastors, elders, deacons, and young professionals. Yu boksu, Tan boksu, Kun Guan hia, Peter hia, Kun Tiak hia, Atsiok hia, Nixon hia, and Danny hia, just to name a few. I gained ten pounds! But it was worth it because I got to know and appreciate the leaders of CGC.

I was at CGC for only one month during the summer of 1998, but God knit the CGC family into my heart so tightly that—even though it was very clear that God was calling me to reach the unreached—after I received CGC's formal letter of invitation to serve and Yu boksu's printed email sharing that he would be moving to DYFR and he was really hoping that I will serve at CGC, I actually considered going to CGC first (for two to three years) before pursuing my missions calling.

But in the end, I decided it was still best to go straight to missions. Why? Because if I were to stay at CGC for only 2-3 years, whatever ministries and changes I would have initiated would not be sustained and might even fail. Then, when another pastor come and want to do the same changes and ministries, some members might say, "We tried that before, but it didn't work!"

In the years that followed, I grieved with CGC when it went through trials, which resulted in the departures of a number of members. I also wondered with some regret—if I could have helped prevent these if I served at CGC? I will never know.

By God's grace, CGC reached 100 years this year, and I rejoice with CGC members throughout the years for God's constant, overflowing grace to His church!

I was also blessed to see CGC members who were already attending other churches take the time to support the Centennial Choir, attend the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary worship service, and join the evening Thanksgiving dinner. CGC will always be in our hearts.

#### 2003-2007: God used CGC to support and encourage me in my calling

After I have started working among the unreached, God renewed my relationship with CGC in 2003. Un Hock *boksu* called me up and informed me that CGC would like to support me as a missionary.

I was grateful, but I declined. I was fully supported by my home church, Gerizim Evangelical Church (GEC), and preferred to have "just enough" support. Around a month later, he called me up again and said CGC really wants to have a part in my ministry. He advised me to accept, since it will be for just a year.

The following year, Un Hock boksu informed me that CGC will continue supporting me, so I requested GEC to deduct ₱5,000 (the amount CGC was giving me) from their support, so that I will still be receiving "just enough" support. As a result, two churches that were many hundreds of kilometers apart became united in supporting one missionary. That was teamwork within God's universal Church!

For me, the best thing about being supported by CGC was getting to see dear friends during the annual Mission Emphasis Week—former and present pastors, church staff, elders, deacons, sisters, youth, and the faithful prayer warriors at the prayer meetings.

Each year, I was given the opportunity to share my testimony during worship service, prayer meeting, or Adults and Children Sunday School. It was never difficult to prepare what to say, because God was always so faithful and answered so many prayers for the work among the unreached.

Because of CGC's concern for me and the ministry God entrusted to me, CGC graciously supported my team mate Loisa Tabajac too, and continued to do so for several years even when I was not in Mindanao anymore.

### 2008-2016: God used CGC to sustain my life and strength

In 2008, I returned to Manila for my first furlough (Afterwards, I planned to serve in Indonesia). I wrote to CGC and GEC to stop their financial support, since I was just in Manila. Danny *hia* called me up to ask me if I was sure, and his gracious parting words were, "Anytime you want us to support you again, just let us know." Six months into my furlough, I was diagnosed with cancer.

Tiong Khing *hia* and Ale *chi* opened their home for me to enjoy their herbal plants, and let me bring leaves to eat and saplings to plant in Manila. I was able to go several times, and stopped only when I started chemotherapy, because I was not allowed to eat raw food anymore. Barney *hia* and Belle *chi* also offered their home for me to stay and relax.

When I underwent surgery on July 2010 and January 2014, Nixon *hia* took the initiative to give and even to collect "love gifts" from Danny *hia*, Jingjing *hia*, Hyman *hia*, etc.

When Hing Liong *hia* saw me at a CGC prayer meeting, he pulled out all the bills in his wallet (big and small alike) and pressed them to my hands, insisting that I accept the money for my treatment. I was very embarrassed, but also very touched. Atsiok *hia* and Ann-Ann *chi* sent a check through BSOP, and eventually directly to me. Their generosity enabled me to share God's blessings to other sick missionaries and cancer patients.

Throughout the years, many CGC people have given of themselves in different ways, and all did so voluntarily, lovingly, and sacrificially. "I thank my God every time I remember [CGC]." (Phil. 1:3) I can never repay any of them for their faithful prayers, priceless smiles, expressions of genuine concern, herbal plants, love gifts, hospitality, warm hugs, delicious meals, etc. God be the One to repay and reward them all.

Yes, God blessed CGC with so much grace. But then, CGC also knew how to pass God's grace to others. I am a living testimony of God's grace through CGC. (I cry as I type these words.)

As my family and loved ones will attest, I love being a birthday celebrant. Why? Perhaps because of the fond childhood memories I have on my past birthdays. Mama Rose, who was a Catholic, would bring me to Sto. Rosario Church to attend mass. As highlight of the day, she would always buy me a bunch of roses just outside the church.

Today, this tradition lives on. I still eagerly look forward to receiving roses on my birthday. However, the last time I counted, there were five dozen in the vase! I was overwhelmed, and gently hinted to Boss and my gremlins that a dozen is more than enough to delight me. I love roses not only because it is the flower of my birth month, but more importantly, it was my mother's name as well.

Mama Rose passed away at the young age of 54, but I've learned so much from her. Her patience, tireless spirit and ability to look at the good qualities of everyone were the three things I want to emulate from her. I am not there yet, but I hope to get better at it in the years to come. As a way of honoring my mother, my daughters and niece all have 'Rose' as their second name. Another reason why I love being a birthday celebrant is because it was that one single day each year in my young life that I would be the 'little boss' in the house. It meant doing whatever I wanted to do without being scolded. Always a hungry child, I could eat anything I wanted to my heart's delight. Nowadays, I am called 'Boss' as a pet name, and I have become gentler to myself by doing what I want to do at times rather than doing what I need to do at all times. I still look forward to savoring all my favorite food on my birthday but with moderation now. Having reached this milestone, I would like to thank my family, relatives and friends for their love and support. Above all, I would like to thank God for His constant providence, His unwavering faithfulness and His abundant grace.

Another milestone I eagerly looked forward to is the 30<sup>th</sup> founding anniversary of Emergency Rescue Unit Foundation Phils, Inc. (ERUF) on September 13, 2016. It is a non-governmental organization founded in 1986, after the EDSA Revolution, with my husband Richard as one of the five founders. When we first started, we had very limited material and financial resources. The first three vehicles were a secondhand Sakbayan (Volkswagen Buggy) serving as an ambulance, an old cigarette delivery van as our trauma vehicle, and a heap of scrapped metal that was slowly rehabilitated to become our fire truck.

As ERUF's treasurer for the past 29 years, the task of handling meager funds has been challenging for me, but we were undaunted. Why? Because of our abundant human resources. The spirit of volunteerism among members was immeasurable, and it sustained us through the years. Slowly but surely, we've earned a stellar track record as an emergency service provider, first in Cebu City, then in Lapu-Lapu City, and finally back to where we first came from, Mandaue City.

Today, ERUF fields an average of 40 ambulance calls per day. But with a growing populace and increasingly monstrous traffic conditions, sometimes we simply cannot provide medical help as quickly as we need to. How do we solve problems where time is of the utmost essence? Speaking to a group of trainees yesterday, I told them that 'instead of giving fish to men, we hope to teach them to become fishermen.'

By God's grace, and generosity from our benefactors and supporters, our dream of putting up a paramedic training center is now a reality. It sits on a 5,000-square meter lot in Mandaue City.







"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28) In this facility, we will provide TESDA-certified training to emergency medical technicians for our local government units so they can properly run the mushrooming ambulances in the tri-cities of Cebu.

Unknown to many, ERUF is more than just a medical service provider. We are also capable of responding to all kinds of disaster-related emergencies. Moreover, we hope to train people on first-aid, basic life support, and disaster preparedness so as to minimize loss of life and property when disasters and calamities strike. We envision a safer society by providing a vast network of medical, rescue and rehabilitation, pre-hospital, disaster preparedness, and training services to the communities.

I was once asked how one can become a member of ERUF. The answer is pure and simple – one has to have the heart to serve with a spirit of volunteerism. Our youngest child, Katherine Rose, was an 'ERUF Baby' as she was born in the same year the organization was founded. Growing up, Kitty would always tag along with us until she became a volunteer herself. While she resides in Canada now, she would always visit her ERUF family whenever she is in Cebu.

Looking back at our past, we may have grown by leaps and bounds, but we cannot sit on the laurels of our achievements, for there is still much work to be done as we continue to serve so that others may live. I may sound like a broken record, but the truth of the matter is, we have come this far because of God's providence and amazing grace through our paramedics, volunteers and members. Hallelujah!!!

Lastly but definitely not the least, we will be expecting another bundle of joy come Christmas day from my son Bonuy and Kimberly. Lord willing, we will soon have a 'Rose' for a grandchild. I dearly love all three of our grandsons, but I have been told that it is delightfully different to have a granddaughter. I am definitely thrilled and excited. ©

As I ponder on this year's milestones, I feel indeed so blessed. Luke 12:48 states: "From everyone who has been given much, much will be required." In my past 60 years, I've been given so much more than I ever deserve, and for that, I am forever grateful to our gracious God. n England, when I received the invitation card from Cebu Gospel Church to join the celebration of its 100<sup>th</sup> founding anniversary, I immediately felt that I was holding something unique and enchanting. The card had travelled some 10,000 kilometers by air, bearing an exquisite 3D paper cut-out model of the church building that I had attended in my youth. I realized that certain individuals had taken meticulous care in planning the celebration of the Church's founding anniversary. I thought it would be wonderful to participate in it.

It was pure synchronicity that I had already been planning a visit to the Philippines. Timing my arrival in Cebu with the Anniversary date, I was taken by the running tableau of a hugely-engaging historical exhibition, heavenly music, glorious worship, inspirational sermon, delicious food, and warm fellowship among the local congregation and

invited guests.

The thoughtfulness that had gone into the planning of events reflected the great variety of abilities and gifts that people contributed. These ranged from the careful selection of archival exhibition materials, through the Centennial Thanksgiv-



materials, through the Centennial ThanksgivingDinnerandmementoes, the transportation logistics, to the endless practices leading to the coruscating musical performances (including an original composition) by the CGC Centennial Choir in the newly-refurbished church building.

There are too many details to repeat here, but the memory of the anniversary celebration continues to hearten my heart and spirit. The sheer collaborative work reminds me of St. Paul's description of Christ's body as comprising all parts, from the little toes to the overseeing eyes. What holds all these parts together in harmony? I believe it is the Holy Spirit sent by Jesus Christ through his grace.

While the 'grace' of Jesus Christ locates its source in the forgiveness and mercy that He wrought for the world, grace is made real and perfected in our lives when our hearts perceive and respond with gratitude to all of life's events, and to those around us. In other words, for me grace has two sides like a coin. One side is the 'unmerited forgiveness' experienced through the loving self-giving of Jesus. The other side is the 'gratitude for unmerited blessings' experienced through the constancy and generosity of God.

Throughout its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, Cebu Gospel Church made me feel as if I was a receptacle for the numerous blessings that it had received from God, and was now sharing with its friends and guests. Its hospitality reminded me of the famous scene under the Oak of Mamre, where Abraham and Sarah unknowingly entertained God.

> Hurrying here and there, and through the exhorting of his wife and his servants, Abraham managed to put together a most delicious fare of milk, curd, bread and calfmeat before his three mysterious guests. As a guest of CGC, I had an infinitesimal taste of that ineffable hospitality stemming from

the inner heart of our gracious Triune God.

After all the celebrations, the next timely (and urgent) question to ask is: What is the church going to do now? What is its future? What indeed is its real calling?

Instead of considering the 'church' as the primary subject, and its purpose or 'calling' as a secondary subject, I would like to turn the matter on its head. The late influential missiologist David Bosch suggested that the 'Church' exists only and purely for the sake of Mission. Without its Mission, the Church is gradually reduced into an inwardlooking and meaningless entity or club.

By Mission, we don't mean the narrow definition of going into homes and hearts of unbelievers and converting them. God's Mission or 'Missio Dei' has a much deeper and larger agenda; it is indeed the basis and reason of all earthly existence. God created this universe as an outpouring of his infinite generosity, hospitality and grace. His purpose is to share his ineffable Being with this universe; to share His Goodness with his Creation.

Missio Dei is, therefore, proclaiming – with all our hearts, minds and strengths – God's creative love, boundless generosity and indiscriminate forgiveness. To embody Missio Dei is to embrace every aspect of our personal, social, economic, and political worlds, and to discern God's grace in all their potentialities and actualities, chaos and messiness.

Discovering grace enables us to discover the value and worth of each person who comes into our orbit of consciousness and acquaintance. The gift of 'grace' is complete only if we help others discover grace in their own lives. This means that we should do our best to engage not only with our family and friends, but also with employees and strangers with equal understanding, kindness and magnanimity.

This further entails that we seriously challenge those economic, social and political structures that create and foster conditions leading to social inequality, unrest, anger, and ultimately, violence and death. Ultimately, it is to shed our all-toohuman tendency to protect our portion of personal security and happiness; to preserve our own small peace.

For how can we have real, inner peace when somewhere in the world, thousands of children still die from thirst or water-borne diseases, many young women are still deprived of education, millions of civilians are displaced by war, refugees continue to drown in their frightful bid for freedom, and a whole nation in Palestine continues to be prevented from accessing economic and medical help?

As David Bosch states, "We increasingly find ourselves in a truly apocalyptic situation where the rich get richer and the poor poorer, and where oppression and violence are escalating... We cannot close our eyes to these realities." It is false faith to divorce the spiritual sphere from the personal, social, and material spheres of the world.

Above all, I feel that we need to consider how we can simplify our lives, including our church activities, so we can lessen our environmental footprint and help save the Earth. After all, how can we speak of faith, of the Church, and of God's Mission (of which evangelization is a dimension) if we cannot "Grace is made real and perfected in our lives when our hearts perceive and respond with gratitude to all of life's events, and to those around us."

guarantee human existence and survival in the next few centuries? Indeed, this particular issue is so huge that it requires an entirely separate article.

In the meantime, I would like to say that we cannot rest on the laurels of our past achievements. The paradox is that true success leads to a greater thirst for 'divine meaning' and to higher levels of commitment and work. True success means we have to query more, venture further, and risk more. It means responding more and more sacrificially to God's call.

As a maturing people of God, we are called to give generously ever more of ourselves, our resources, our gifts, and our love. We should learn to give not what we can spare from our abundance, but to give until it hurts.

I wonder what our response would be if God were to ask 90% of what we have, rather than a mere 10%! Indeed, we should emulate the poor widow with two mites who gave her all. As St. Luke says, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back." (Luke 6:38)

I would like to end by extending my heartiest "Thanks" to you all at Cebu Gospel Church for giving me a most unforgettable celebratory experience. When autumn comes, and the nights here in England grow long and dark, I shall take out my paper cut-out model of Cebu Gospel Church, and feel my heart blaze anew with warm memories of, and deep gratitude for, your God-inspired hospitality, generosity and grace.

Soon, the pain became so unbearable. I took the hands of my husband, and softly whispered that my tooth ached... and I can't bear it anymore.

My husband gave me that look, as if saying, "we are in the middle of a worship service! Can't it wait?"

GRRRRR!!! If only I could dictate to this tooth that it's a Sunday!!! Teeth are supposed to behave on Sundays!!!

Then I started psyching myself up by quietly saying, "You can do it, you can do it girl... It's just in your mind." But no matter how much I tried to convince myself this time, the mind was not stronger than my pain.

I turned to my husband and pulled his hand. He responded with his undisturbed look, seemingly telling me to "decide for yourself."

I was trying to reach out to him for a little bit of comfort, but it appeared futile.

"No, no, your mind is more powerful than the pain," I often hear from skeptics. Yeah right!!! Whoever said that should try getting a toothache. Easily said, so why don't you try it? Hehehe!!!

It was a Sunday and as the little girl use to sing

Sunday, Sunday, It's a happy day!!! Sunday, Sunday! What a fun day!!!

Well, it was not a fun day. Not for me.

Dentists tell us that a tooth is as precious as gold. Nah, keep the gold; I want this tooth out. So, I pulled out my cellphone and called my dentist. I told her I want to see her now.

She said it's a Sunday.

I replied, I know, and in fact, I am in the middle of worship service.

She told me that she will not be around until Tuesday.

I said it is okay, I don't care if she will hold office next month or year because I want it pulled now as in NOW because I cannot wait till Tuesday or even the next hour. The excruciating pain was just so unbearable.

They said tooth pain is second to labor pain. Sorry, I beg to disagree this time. The toothache was truly unbearable because it just would not stop. At least during childbirth, the child pops out whether we like it or not, and then the pain stops. If the baby does not come out, you die and the pain stops.

But the tooth will not come out by itself, you will not die from it. Well, unless it's an abscess, but that's really rare.

So you just have to suffer the pain until that tooth is pulled out. Well, the nerve may eventually die after you bang your tooth a hundred times against your door knob. Remember? In olden days, we tied our teeth to the door knob and slammed the door to pull them out.

But this time, a dentist was needed to extract it through whatever means necessary: pull it, drill it, saw it in half, whatever – tooth, root and all. I don't care how it's done, just get me out of this misery!!! Long story short, the offending tooth was successfully extracted. Since it was cracked, painful and could no longer be saved, the dentist had to cut it into two pieces.

Yes, she picked at it, rocked it from side to side, and pulled the whole thing out. Ahhh, free of that tooth at last. I was so happy, but my happiness was short. It lasted as long as the anesthetic.

I was suffering the next few weeks. I regretted having my tooth pulled, but I reasoned that it was the best course of action. Every time I felt the wide hole on its place, I missed my tooth. It was my favorite molar: strong, and a great cruncher and biter.

The dentist told me not to eat popcorn, which I did. Not to eat hot food which... You guessed right, I did. No hard food? Nah!! What she said I cannot eat, I ate with gusto because the forbidden fruit all suddenly became too tempting to resist. No wonder ADAM fell.

As I was nursing my wound, a deep realization came to me. My favorite tooth was doing all the chewing, grinding and cracking. It never failed me until it met its match in those Parisian breads.I loved eating those breads and could not resist cracking and crunching them.

That tooth was one of my best. But when it cracked, its usefulness ended. It became a burden, a pain, a thing you wish that did not exist. You even loathed its existance. It was a problem, a real problem.



There are many people who are like great teeth in the Church. Each of us helping the others like sets of teeth, nurturing our church for a hundred years:

Some are like the big **molars**, working hard backstage.

Some are like the **front teeth**, working in the frontlines.

Some are **canine** teeth, small but sharp.

There are those who are uselessly **impacted**; hidden but still there. They do not contribute much, except to give some intermittent pain.

Some are jacketed: covered and living a double life.

Some have **deep cavities** – very beautiful outside, but hollowed and decayed inside.

Some are **denture implants** – acting as posts for braces and for other teeth to hold on so that those teeth can become strong, beautiful and straight.

Some are like false teeth, "Belonging but never Believing."

Some are **cracked**, **broken**, and **bruised**, but still continue to do their tasks.

Some are coated with **tartar**, great teeth but choked by the decadent pleasures of life. You can hardly see the coating, but soon the gums give them up or they are pulled out before they cause pyorrhea.

Some had **cavities** that were drilled, cleaned and **refilled**. It's painful but they held on, trying to rise up from where they have fallen.

Some are **cracked**; selfishly hiding all food inside to decay, like rotten wealth tightly kept with clenched fists.

Some just **needed to be pulled out**. It's easy to say, but once they are pulled, remember the pain that the whole body will feel. Remember the hole that they will leave behind. It is not easy to fill the gap that those others have left, but there are just times that letting go is but the best thing to do.

謝神在宿務基督教會一百 年來的奇妙作為。我和師 母熊國英有幸也被神呼召 從1974-1985年參與在此 教會的事奉、我們獻上由 衷的感恩。 42年前我們剛從香港的海外神學院畢 業、得悉宿務基督教會極需一位傳道人輔 助剛中風的老牧師。我們經過迫切祈禱、 決定回應神的呼召、婚後三個月便憑著單 純的信心、踏上全然陌生的征途。當時我 們既年輕又無經驗、不會說閩南話和菲律 賓土語、但是教會裡的弟兄姊妹對待我們 如同自己人、盡力幫助我們適應新環境。

我負責英文崇拜及青年工作、師母除了協助我、還幫助姊妹及聖樂方面的事工。學 閩南(福建)話對我是一大挑戰。一位有 愛心的老姊妹天天教我用羅馬字拼音讀聖 經、我足足花了一整年才學會以閩南話講 道。而曾師母竟然比我聰慧、四個月就可 以了。懂得閩南話後、我們感到在弟兄姊 妹中的交往更親切了。

我們的三個兒女:加慧、加麗及加榮都在 菲律賓出世。姊妹們對師母的關心無微不 至、特別是她坐月子的時候、她們更是預 備各式各樣的補品(連我的體重也增加 了)。即使在平常的日子、還是常有人把 鮮果、雞蛋、糕點等美食送上牧師樓、我 們亦經常被邀請到會友家中或餐館享受豐 盛的筵席。不久我們就察覺許多福建人的 基督徒、都很敬重牧者、他們的祖先也是 很愛神和敬重神僕人的、他們是蒙神大大 賜福的人!

事奉剛開始、就有人告訴我們:「宿務是 石頭地、傳福音非常困難!」不過我們沒 有因此氣餒、因為我們深信在神沒有難成 的事!我們不停地每週祈禱探訪。撒旦的 權勢雖大、我們的神卻仍然成就奇事。 一位弟兄後來見証說:一次醉酒後回家 自己不必信、只要拉著女兒們的衣裳便可 上天堂!我探訪他十次以上、為他祈禱、 終於神軟化他的心、他就接受耶穌為個人 救主。後來還成了兄弟團團長。感謝神。

在宿務六年後、我想去美國深造。師母卻 顧慮到經濟問題!奇妙地、神竟安排一對 美國宣教士夫婦到我們教會分享。當他們 知道師母的擔憂時、竟問:「摩西帶領多 少以色列人過紅海?」師母答道:「兩百萬人。」「在曠野多久?」「四十年。」 「他們衣物有破嗎?有沒有餓?鞋有否破 掉?那麼你們家裡有幾個人?要去美國幾 年?若果是神的旨意要你們去、你想祂會 供應嗎?」宣教士講完、為我們祈禱後、 便離去了。我們的信心得到堅固、決心倚 靠神的應許過活。感謝神、祂感動宿務教 會、我們的親人、以及個別的弟兄姊妹支 助我們。兩年裡、雖然有時我們會迷惘、 不知道明後天將如何的時候、神總會差派 小烏鴉把肉及時叼來、供應豐足、從不誤 事。哈利路亞!榮耀歸於全能的神!

## 不住地禱告

. 祈禱是咱在靈裡與上帝交通

II. 人人都能夠祈禱,但是不信主的人 之祈禱,不會蒙神垂聽

III. 祈禱的首要:

 a. 信心:最有效的祈禱是要有信心的祈禱。上帝藉著聖經對咱說話,咱卻以信心向神說話。咱從聖經知道上帝是萬權能的神,是創造宇宙萬物的主宰,無所不知, 無所不在,無所不能的上帝。 祂愛敬畏祂的人,也喜歡聽他 們的祈禱。(希伯來書11:6)「 人非有信,就不能得神的喜悅; 因為到神面前來的人必須信有神, 且信祂賞賜那尋求祂的人。」

b. 聖潔:信主的人知道咱的天父是極 聖潔的神,咱做祂的兒女也必須要 聖潔。(利未記11:45)「我是把 你們從埃及地領出來的耶和華, 要作你們的神,所以你們要聖潔, 因為我是聖潔的。」 「但是感謝上帝, 咱屬主的人 有聖靈在 **咱心内,** 當咱祈禱的時 祂就馬上 來幫助咱 祂賜咱屬靈 的智慧能夠 得勝魔鬼一切 的詭計。」

- c. 自省: 咱親近上帝以前必須要先自 我省察。在咱生活的過程中,有否 得罪人呢?有否羞辱了主的聖尊名 呢?咱也可以懇求聖靈幫助省察, 因為祂知道咱一切所做的,有否 一些隱而未現的罪還未向主認罪 呢?應該求主赦免。(詩篇19:12) 「誰能知道自己的錯失呢?願祢赦 免我隱而未現的過錯。」
- d. 認罪:咱自省以後,知道咱的過 錯,若真心認自己的罪,上帝是信 實的,是公義的,必要赦免我們的 罪,洗淨我們一切的不義(約翰一 書1:9)。
- e. 悔改:咱既然知道上帝是怒恨罪惡的,那麼咱就不再去犯罪(約翰一書3:9)。咱要時時刻刻順從聖靈的引導就不放縱肉體的情慾(加拉太書5:16-18)。
- f. 親近上帝:有了真正清潔的心,咱 才能夠坦然無懼的來到施恩的寶座 前來親近上帝。
- IV. 為什麼保羅在帖撒羅尼迦前書5:17 ,在他最後的訓導教示咱要「不住 的禱告」呢?因為「不住的禱告」 在基督徒的生活中是很重要的。
  - a. 在約翰一書5:19告訴咱這世界是在 魔鬼掌權下。∨19「我們知道,我 們是屬神的,全世界都臥在那惡者 手下。」
  - b. 以弗所書6:10-13「我還有末了的話:你們要靠著主,倚賴祂的大能大力作剛強的人。要穿戴神所賜的全副軍裝,就能抵擋魔鬼的詭計。因我們並不是與屬血氣的爭戰,乃是與那些執政的、掌權的、管轄這幽暗世界的,以及天空屬靈氣的惡魔爭戰。所以,要拿起神所賜的全副軍裝,好在磨難的日子抵擋 九敵,並且成就了一切,還能站立得住。」

- c. 彼得前書5:8「務要謹守儆醒。 因為你們的仇敵魔鬼,如同吼叫 的獅子,遍地遊行,尋找可吞吃 的人。」
- d. 約翰福音10:10a「盜賊來,無非要 偷竊,殺害,毀壞…」盜賊就是 指魔鬼,牠來要偷竊咱的平安, 殺害毀壞咱兄弟間的好感情,牠愛 兄弟姊妹因不好感情起爭論,最後 分裂。所以咱要特別要小心,不可 給魔鬼留地步。咱絕對不是魔鬼的 對手。但是感謝上帝,咱屬主的人 有聖靈在咱心內,當咱祈禱的時, 祂就馬上來幫助咱,祂賜咱屬靈的 智慧能夠得勝魔鬼一切的詭計。
- 現在要來做一個譬如給咱看到不住 V. 禱告的重要。譬如你與你的妻子或 你的丈夫說話。在談話中間有一些 意見不同,因此引起鬥嘴,不久就 生氣,後來爭吵說對方的短處,互 相傷感情,使你失去平安。這就 中了魔鬼的詭計。(提摩太後書 2:23-26)。但是咱感謝主,在這 種情形以下,咱信主的人,聖靈會 感動咱要馬上停止爭論,祂提醒咱 這是魔鬼的工作,指示咱要隨時祈 禱。咱可以進入咱的房間,安靜下 來,在主面前傾心吐意向主祈禱。 咱祈禱的時要遵照主耶穌在馬太福 音6:9-13的方式祈禱。

### P R A Y E R P A R T N E R

John Maxwell's 1996 book, "Partners in Prayer", is read by church leaders and lay people worldwide. It is no secret that prayer partners should know how they could unleash the potential of prayer on behalf of their church. According to Maxwell, praying for others, including church leaders, is one of the fundamental for churchbuilding. These are the following steps for church prayer.

- 1. Be spontaneous
- 2. Be specific, according to your needs
- 3. Ask the right way: Ask (James 1:5-6), Seek (Luke 11:7), and Knock (Revelation 3:20)
- 4. Pray with all your heart; pray aloud, tune out the distractions, and keep a prayer journal
- 5. Pray continually (1 Thessalonians 5:17); growth is found if you continually talk to God. This enables us to try and develop practical prayer skills.

We shall be guided by the word of Isaiah 40:31 (KJV): "But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint." God honors those who wait on Him, so we need to talk less and listen more, perhaps 30/70 or 20/80, not the other way around. Wait, and be patient. Allow God to love you. Let God search you, then let God show you how.

Confession should Time. We confess our sins immediately, and never allow our position to keep us from doing so. It is a very humbling experience to confess. God is never surprised by what we do, so be honest. He will always tell us when we did something wrong. When sin is tolerated, it increases. Thus we consult the infallible Word of God in the Bible. The psalmist wrote in Psalm 119:89 (NIV): "Your word, Lord, is eternal; it stands firm in the heavens." So, we need to use God's Word, as suggested in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV): "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

Philippians 4:4-7 (NIV) states: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Meditation Time. Do what is advised in James 1:22 (NIV): "Do not merely listen to the word, and SO deceive yourselves. Do what it says." Mediating help us understand the will Scriptures and apply them to our lives, as related in Psalm 1:1-3 (NIV): "Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers."

Intercession Time. 1 Timothy 2:1-4 (NIV) states: "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people – for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth."

Petition Time. Pray with the attitude of "Thy will be done,"

as is prayed by Jesus in Luke 22:42b (NIV): "... not my will, but yours be done." Be honest with your feelings, problems and needs. Talk to God about the little things that concern you.

Application Time. Jeremiah 32:16-44 showed that Jeremiah's prayer came with God's promise of hope. If we are God's people who love Him, there will come a time when faith will be rewarded. In John 14:23-24 (NIV), Jesus reassured the apostle Jude: "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me."

Hebrews 11:1 (NIV) says: "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Faith is a tangible expression of prayer that confirms our expectation that God can and will bring about his own purpose. Isaiah 55:11 (GNB) recounts God's offer of mercy to Israel: "[The word that I speak] will not fail to do what I plan for it; It will do everything I send it to do."

With a heart filled with praise, we should treasure our relationship with God, for He is perfect. Prayer has become part of my life, and will be the reason for the success of Mandaue Gospel Church (MGC). Amen.

John Maxwell wrote about the prayer of Dr. Wilbur Chapman, which multiplied in scope and power as three believers become ten, ten became twenty and twenty became fifty and so on, and on. John Maxwell has truly reached the world; how else would I know about his book, "Partners in Prayer"? As a member of MGC, I pray that the more-than-10year-old church will one day look for God's Glory.

These are the five requests I always pray for:

- 1. Her members people would sense the Glory of God
- 2. We would follow the Word of God
- 3. We would be united in the love of God
- 4. We would go forth to fulfil the mission of God; and
- 5. Lastly, we would experience the joy of God.

We will pray for the church by partnering with our Pastor Un Hock Wee and his wife Jennifer Wee, to pray continually, strategically, and powerfully for the 24/7 protection for MGC.

We found a picture showing the existence of Sunday school way back in 1921.

A diary from a certain Alice Fullerton recounted that the ministry grew to 20-25 children in 1923-1924. Moreover, Ptr. Pilar Siao recalled that "the Sunday School used the older ones to teach the younger children, like Ampi-chi and her sisters who were older."

After all these years, CGC's Sunday School Department is now 95 years old! Curious to learn about their Sunday School history, we called up St. Stephen's Parish Church, which is the oldest Chinese church in the Philippines.

- Our department would like to acknowledge some Sunday school teachers who have taught for at least 40 years. In fact, we gave them a plaque of appreciation during Sunday School Sunday on September 25, 2016:

最後,我希望在教會的一百週年,主恩能 夠長存直到永永遠遠。而我呢?我必定 要事奉天父一直到祂接我歸天才停止。 主恩豐盛無限,傳給到萬世代,榮耀歸於 上帝!●

s Cebu Gospel Church celebrates her Centennial this year, we also celebrate the 65th year of God's grace for the Sisters' Fellowship. With the sole purpose of glorifying God, I would like to take this special occasion to share some life testimonies of joy with our readers.

### 1. ONE LIFE

As recalled by Mrs. Cheng Eng Huang, the Sisters' Fellowship started with twelve people at 3:00 PM on February 7, 1951, the first Tuesday of the month. On this day, Rev. Se Ko Liang convened with some ladies at the old residence of Mrs. Chuy Siok Cang Uy in downtown Manalili Street.

The meeting venue remained fluid and changed several times over the years. Finally, it was decided that for the sake of convenience, the fellowship should be held inside the Philippine Christian Gospel School campus (in Junquera Street), until the new sanctuary was built in Jones Avenue, Capitol.

Since then, the Sisters' Fellowship continued to meet at 3:00 PM every Tuesday. Activities include Bible Study, topical themes, testimony meetings, health talks, "Joy Dancing", "Line Dancing", and Visitation Ministry on Thursday afternoons.

Each year, the fellowship members hold a yearly retreat. Every six months, officers conduct a training session. Our motto, as taken from Luke 1:46-47, is how Mary sang: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

Vision We are the soldiers of the Lord Jesus Christ. With strength coming from knowing and walking the TRUTH. Marching by victory lane till Christ returns. Mission We read the Bible daily and pray for alertness; we strive to be equipped to share the Lord's Gospel with joy, as we model life, going far and near, expanding God's Kingdom.

The Sisters' Fellowship has grown numerically and spiritually through the faithful nurturing of Cebu Gospel Church. During the Centennial Celebration, we presented the "Soldiers' Dance," expressing our desire to live victoriously as soldiers of Christ amidst challenges in a changing world. May the Lord of Harvest continue to bless her.

### 2. LIFE RADIANCE

When Jesus enters into our lives, no one notices at first. But when this new life shines out from us, no one misses it. This is why the Lord Jesus said, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). "Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

What actually happens is that our lives are transformed in Christ Jesus through the Holy Spirit, and this combines with our obedience to Him to exude radiance. In the following section, we present to our readers some transformed lives of our sisters in Christ throughout these decades:

 When Kheng-chu first took up residence in Cebu, the move was abrupt. Her Christian Mother-In-law encouraged her to "go...", and some friends also reached out to her. Thus, she accepted the invitation and was welcomed into the Sisters' Fellowship. She noticed that the interpersonal relationships were friendly. Aside from regular fellowship meetings, they had other opportunities to get to know one another. In other words, the sisters love and care for each other.

- So-ngo often shares her testimonies of God's love and mercies, appreciating life. Sometimes we find them printed in the Gospel Light. Her yummy suman ma-chang (sticky rice dumplings) which the fellowship enjoyed still lingers in some memories.
- Mamerta brings love every time she attends the Sisters' Fellowship. Many are encouraged.
- Clotilde believes in the Lord Jesus Christ. With her transformed life, she likes to do visitations zealously and caringly. Although some don't respond, she remains undaunted. In the fellowship, she is humble and of few words. In her old age, she cherishes and cares for her husband who has been bedridden.
- Siok-hian suffered a stroke, which completely changed her life. She cried in hopelessness every day. And then she heard the Gospel and believed in Jesus Christ, which made her turn her life around to hope in the Lord Jesus. When she received water baptism she said, "I used to shed tears every day, but now I trust in the Lord Jesus and have joy. Thanks to the Lord."
- Eugenia does not have much money, but desires to cheer up some friends in the fellowship who she feels are poorer and/or lonelier than she is. Every Christmas, she would put a small amount of money in tiny envelopes, which would be given as gifts. In doing this, she finds joy and peace.
- As chairperson, Muy-tie and the officers spearheaded the formation of the code of conduct for the Sisters' Fellowship. This provided guidelines for Fellowship activities that bring glory to God. She continues to serve the Lord under different roles. With all smiles she said, "I like the Sisters' Fellowship. All my illnesses disappear every time I come here."
- Carmen has been healed of her heartaches and hurting after separating from her husband. By trusting the Lord day by day, she finds comfort and strength. Her joy and serenity brings in her relatives and friends to the Lord.
- Lidian was orphaned at a young age. Experiencing harsh realities in life made her bitter and hard. She tells us, "stones are hard, but my heart is even harder. But when I was diagnosed with breast cancer, many from the church came to care for me. Members from the Sisters' Fellowship visited me. At this point in time, the love of God thawed my stony heart,

and I decided to receive the Lord Jesus as my Lord and Savior."

- "My second elder sister already believed in the Lord Jesus, and it is only my eldest Sister who needs to be saved. I went to China with the goal of bringing my eldest sister to the Lord. But while in China, I realized she is no longer there. 'A-chi, I believe in the Lord Jesus already. I have come to China to bring you to trust in the Lord Jesus. A-chi, where are you now?'"
- Last but not least, I close this section with a story of Madame Chuy Siok Cang Uy. She orchestrated a beautiful event in the life of my family. You see, my father came from China to Cebu, where he had no relatives, but did have friends in Christ. With love in Christ, Madame Uy organized my parents' wedding. She even sent two daughters to honor the occasion: Se-Eng, the bridesmaid; and Maria, the flower girl. As post-wedding grace, Madame Chuy Siok Cang Uy opened her home to Sen Hong and Eugenia Huang.

### 3. INVITATION TO LIFE

I am touched by the lives displayed above. Most of them are ordinary people. But when their lives are connected with the Lord of life, the transformation is simply amazing! The old is gone, and all have become new in Christ. How can we have this life?

Apostle John wrote: "He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life." So, come, everyone who received Him, everyone who believes in His name. To you, he gives the right to become children of God. We invite you.

# CHRISTIAN YOUTH FELLOWSHIP

The CYF has been existing for the past 68 years since November 1948. It was born when some godly leaders had the vision to equip and train young people for spiritual growth and ministry.

Originally, it was named the Student and Youth Fellowship – open to all the students and the young. Brother Francisco Yap was the first president of CYF. As a matter of fact, many of those from the pioneering group have become church leaders or have been passionately serving the Lord as lay members. Two of them, Li Tiong Chi and Adon Ong, eventually became Church leaders.

Week after week, these faithful students met on Sunday afternoons and enjoyed a variety of activities – singing & praising God, themed sermons, Bible studies, film-showing, group dynamics and case studies, prayer and sharing, and of course, outdoor fun too.

All the things they did together were geared towards helping them grow in their spiritual walk with God, as well as their relationship with one another.

Besides these weekly meetings, this group of adventurous youth also had yearly events which they prepared with much care and diligence. These included summer camps, youth rallies, leadership trainings and retreats, and even evangelistic meetings.

Sponsored by the Youth Committee, the Christian Youth Summer Conference, first held in 1951, was held every April when most of the youth were on summer vacation. These events brought together youth from different cities like Tacloban, Dumaguete, Bacolod, Iloilo, Surigao, Butuan and Zamboanga.

Many CGC youth were always excited to go to new places and join these camps – learning about God and meeting new friends.

Years later, when the Filipino Chinese Christian Foundation held its national camps in the Luzon area, the pastors from the five Visayan churches decided to hold their own camp. Thus, the first all-Visayas Christian Youth Summer Conference was held in 1988. It was called the CBDTI – Cebu, Bacolod, Dumaguete, Tacloban, and Iloilo. The Chinese churches in these five cities took turns in hosting the yearly camp. Cebu Gospel Church's CYF first hosted the camp in 1990 at Bethany Church. An annual youth rally was also organized yearly. The first was held in 1974 with Rev. Wesley Shao expounding on the message – God Loves the Youth.

Aside from the Summer camps, we also had College Retreats during semestral breaks to help keep the fire burning in the college students, knowing especially how different college life is from high school. The first was held in 1976, at the Baptist Bible Camp, located in Mount Xion, Guba, Cebu. In 1992, the event was moved to December, and was later called Winter Camp.

While the youth were enjoying weekly fellowship with one another, the Elementary CYF was later organized by Rev. and Mrs. Tsang in 1977, who believed that the younger ones could also be taught and trained for the Lord's ministry.

They were gathered and guided, as they interacted with each other and shared what they know and think about God. Soon, the baton passed on to Sister Joyce Uy, who faithfully led the kids to a closer relationship with Jesus.

One day, she visited our home and from then on, my mother always made us attend CYF. At first, it was rather difficult for me. I was a shy person, and did not want to mingle much with other people. I even made excuses why I could not go – the fellowship used to be held at 2 PM on Sunday afternoon.

I am glad the teachers never gave up on me – sometimes the fellowship was held in our house so we could all join. My family accounted for quite a large portion of attendance, since we numbered nine siblings in all! Eventually, I learned to enjoy the afternoon bus rides, picking up other young people to join the CYF.

In 1978, members at the high school and college levels held their elections for their own set of officers. From then on, there were officially three separate CYFs – Elementary, High School and College – with their own leadership structure, and with the Tsang and Chua Chi couples as advisers.

The split was necessary in order to cater to the specific needs of the different age levels of the attendees. Moreso, the number of members was really growing. Praise the Lord!

Since the three CYF groups met separately every Sunday afternoon, it was easy to invite entire families. Siblings will just go to their ageappropriate fellowships, and then meet up again after the fellowship ends. We could also have joint activities among the three CYFs.

It was also during this time when the youth began to join the Saturday Prayer meeting, after which the Tsang home was opened to them for breakfast. This encouraged fellowship outside the CYF.

Anniversaries were especially fun because there would be many participants. Every now and then, we would have a big outreach with the CEF kids instead of having a party. We let each member sponsor a street kid – assisting the latter during the whole event as he/she plays and eats, until it's time to say goodbye.

The CYFers always went home feeling good, because they have blessed someone less fortunate than them and shared the love of Jesus to them.

During the fellowships, each CYFer was frequently encouraged to preside or lead songs, which I really did not like at first, but learned to love as the weeks went by. CYF IN THE 1970s

Once you become a regular attendee, you get to be nominated for officership. In my case, I first helped out as a public relations officer. I moved on to arts, and then became the business manager – a position I really enjoyed since I love to serve people.

Doing this led me to discover my spiritual gifts, which are "service" and "helps." Later, I had the chance to serve as treasurer, and then, secretary. At this point, I realized that God had also given me some administrative skills

We also did visitations after every fellowship, by visiting irregular members and those who were not physically well. I remember this was one of the exciting and fun activities, because we would go on a joyride with our counsellors, who treated us to yummy snacks after the visitation before bringing us home.

By the way, I was attending College CYF when I was asked to lead the Elementary CYF, which I gladly accepted since I was a lover of kids. I was lucky to have several younger CYFers help me with the young ones.

During this time, the high school CYF changed its schedule to Friday 6 PM so they could invite the students from Philippine Christian Gospel School (PCGS) to join. Then, the College CYF followed suit, scheduling it from 8 PM to 9:30 PM.

With the new schedule, I was able to attend and serve in all three fellowships.

When I graduated from College and moved on to Young Pro, I began serving as a counselor in CYF – a position I hold until the present.

While the older youth had their share of camps and retreats, the elementary group had its own set of activities. Each year, we would hold Junior Camps for kids at the Elementary level.

Just like our Ahias and Achies, we would also enjoy 4 days/3 nights away from our homes and live in the church compound with other children. Many times, we held the camp at Mandaue Gospel Church.

We enjoyed learning about God and other important things in life. We ate and slept with other children – eventually making more friends.

Indeed, fellowship has helped me a lot in my spiritual walk with God. Not only did we read and study the Bible together, we also memorized scripture verses. I really enjoyed serving and ministering to the young people.

I remember that we also had a Christian music library where we could borrow Christian tapes – to encourage the young people to listen to Christian music instead of the worldly songs.

By just being a regular member, we get to encourage one another and at the same time be encouraged by others – as we share our testimonies with each other about the goodness and faithfulness of God.

As I look back on those good old days, I realize that it has come full circle. I am presently helping out the same way in CYF, but this time, as a teacher with many students. CYF IN THE 2000s

I hope we could help the youth in their spiritual walk with God – helping and equipping them to be mature believers and the future leaders of our church. Indeed, I am grateful to our good Lord for allowing me to grow up with CYF as part of my life.

Presently, CYF has 12 counsellors, with about 70 attending every Friday from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. We always start with a simple dinner, and then the Praise Band leads the group in praising and worshiping God. This is followed by whatever activity that has been lined up.

We have annual activities like "Counsellors Appreciation Night" and "Church Workers Appreciation Night." These are organized to show appreciation to the people who have helped us in the fellowship.

Bible studies are set every third week of the month. We also have panel discussions on some important life issues. We are up-to-date with the latest Christian films. We see to it that we watch them with the youth and help them evaluate the films, pointing out important lessons to learn.

It is our goal that each of the youth who have come across CYF will have a good relationship with God and eventually with one another.

Please continue to pray for our youth that they may really mature in their saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ, and would be able to impact the people in their lives. Hopefully... someday they will rise up to become good leaders of our Church. To God be all the Glory and Honor!

tender word of kindness to the cruel master; extending a handshake of forgiveness to the serial killer; touching someone who has a communicable skin disease; giving up your outer cloak as well as your inner garments; receiving into your home a stranger who is an outcast by society... These are some expressions of grace.



All that Philippine Christian Gospel School (PCGS) is today – her people, buildings, facilities, and accomplishments – all these are also manifestations of God's amazing grace.

Founded in 1948 by members of Cebu Gospel Church, the school became one of the pioneering schools in the region for quality Christian education offering the Chinese curriculum.

She also became a fertile ground for evangelism and discipleship. Today, PCGS continues to be an arm of Cebu Gospel Church in the ministry of children, youth and adults.

### GROWTH

Since the founding of the school in 1948, God never fails to meet every need. During times when the school's finances were in crisis, God used people to meet those needs.

Endowed with God's wisdom, the men and women of the Board of Trustees rose up to meet each of these financial challenges. They initiated projects and staged shows that will generate funds to help the school's finances. In 1984, under the leadership of the late Mr. Nemesio Garcia as Chairman of the Board, he initiated the construction of the 18-classroom Uy Cang Chui Siok Building for the elementary pupils.

In the late 90s, the high school buildings became unfit for use. God, in His appointed time, raised up a group of young professionals and entrepreneurs to compose the new set of Board of Trustees. Brilliantly diverse but one in heart and purpose, they were determined to rebuild the campus. Hence, the campus master plan came into being.

This was a three-phase building project that started with the 3,039.75 sq. m. Ong Lian Siong Gymnasium completed in 2002 and fully airconditioned in 2008. In 2003, the one-story preschool building was remodeled and a second story was added to include a 134-seating capacity Ong Lian Piak Audio-Visual Room, a computer laboratory, a library, and a faculty office. This building was named "Haggai 1:4"; the verse reference was written on paper by an anonymous donor, who dropped it with his generous donation into the offering bag.

In 2004, the last phase of the three-phase building project was completed. This is a 5-storey High

School and Administration building named after the patriarchs of its major donors – Ung Han Liong and Yap Yok Sr. In 2010, an annex to the elementary Uy Cang Chui Siok Building was built.

It is God's grace that moved God's people and alumni to give generously in response to the call for change and improvement. It is God's grace that sustained the Board of Trustees in their passion to see the school campus rebuilt. It is by God's grace that the school remained steadfast and strong despite the dark clouds and stormy days. God's grace was certainly seen in the growth and expansion of the school buildings and facilities.

But His grace is not limited to the physical aspects of the school. The student population also steadily increased over the last ten years. As the 2016-2017 school year opens, we have 777 enrollees. A perfect number! By God's grace, PCGS will continue to grow.

### RECOGNITION

Today, operating schools have become more like a business enterprise; it has in fact, become very competitive. Just like businesses, schools have to be marketed through print and non-print advertisements. All schools face the challenge of finding some means of quality assurance for parents who spend tens of thousands on tuition and other school fees.

The acknowledged measure of quality in educational institutions is accreditation. Schools are challenged to continually improve their programs and services. Hence, schools are encouraged to submit to what is called voluntary accreditation. This procedure aims to assist schools at self-improvement.

Dr. Derek J. Keenan in his book "**Called to Lead**" (2002, p. 173) wrote, "Schools that achieve accreditation become part of the greater learning community of high quality schools. They move forward in a strategic way because they have disciplined themselves to achieve the affirmation and respect of an independent evaluative agency. Accreditation helps educational institutions establish evidence and data-supported baselines of quality from which they can proceed to improve, mature, and develop to their fullest potential." Consistent with this desire to self-improvement, we decided to accept the challenge of submitting our three programs to voluntary accreditation. During the tedious process of preparing for this academic exercise, we drew inspiration and encouragement from our God who also desires that we pursue nothing less than EXCELLENCE; by God's grace and empowerment, we were determined to finish the task and to do it well to the glory of His Name.

In 2005, all three programs - Kindergarten, Elementary and High School – were recognized as quality programs; thus, each one was granted Level 2 accredited status, effective December 2005 until December 2010. All glory to God alone for his amazing grace!

This academic exercise is to be continuously pursued. Hence in 2010, the second cycle of evaluation was conducted; again God surprised us when the agency qualified our Elementary and High School programs for Level 3. Today, we continue to be recognized as an accredited school; God's outpouring of his grace humbles us to no end.

### Alumni

Chinese philosopher Guan Zhong once wrote: 一年之計,莫如樹殼;十年之計,莫如樹木; 終身之計,莫如樹人. In English, it can be translated as "If your plan is for one year, plant rice; if your plan is for ten years, plant trees; if your plan is for a lifetime, educate children."

Thus, "Education is life" defines our educational philosophy. We teach to prepare students for living in the world for the world in the Name of Christ.

Starting from its founding year in 1948, Kian Kee has already graduated 3,890 students. Based on the school registrar's file, 143 alumni completed their tertiary education with honors.

Here are the numbers including honors received for graduate and post graduate studies:

- Ten summa cum laude; 42 magna cum laude; 97 cum laude; and six receiving honors or scholastic recognition or distinction.
- The school is also proud of alumni who topped the board examinations. To date, 35 alumni made it to the top 20 in a board examination; among these, ten alumni landed first place in a board examination.
- Aside from all these academic accolades, about 38 alumni received citations for other special achievements.
- But more importantly, based on reports received, at least 40 alumni are into full-time ministries serving either as a church pastor, a missionary, or in Christian school education.

God has used the school to further His kingdom on earth; it is His grace that saved us in Jesus, but it is also His grace that chose a few to work in His vineyard. All His grace!

Behind the cemented walls of PCGS are crowded wooden houses with floor areas of around nine square meters, serving as living and dining rooms during the day, and bedrooms in the night for 2-3 families.

Behind the unseen walls are people convinced of their hopelessness and so have settled for poverty and "under-education," if there is such word.

But the grace of God has not left these people where they are. God himself allowed the school administration to see through these walls and the urgency in their hearts to walk and work among the people in this community.

This vision and burden has enjoined the whole PCGS family (students, faculty, staff and parents) to commit for 5 years (school year 2011-2016) to work together with the barangay captain of Barangay Sta. Cruz for the transformation of the people in the community. Thus, based on the school's vision and mission the objectives for the community outreach program was formed, which is as follows:

For the less privileged people of the community to RISE in Christ!

- R Rise above their present circumstances
- I Impart to and Impact the society
- S See beyond their present condition
- E Exert effort to reach for the extraordinary
- in Christ The only source of hope and new life.

Without delay, every department of PCGS embarked to adopt and reach out to different age groups, from toddlers to adults.

- The preschool teachers visited the Day Care Center every Thursday to teach songs, Bible stories and Christian values to the kids, while their parents also stayed to listen.
- The Elementary students and faculty (with the help of some Bible students from Bible Baptist Church) welcomed children from ages 6-12 and teens every Saturday, and conducted Math and English tutorials with songs, Bible lessons, and Christian Values. This was packaged with other events and interests like sports, Christmas parties, outing and Daily Vacation Bible School in summer.

 The High school students, teachers and nonteaching staff took the extra mile to reach out to the teens for sports, tutorials and values education and the adults for livelihood program and Bible Study.

When the Grace of God dawns on you, it is irresistible. It is grace that sustains the sacrificial love of the PCGS family to reach out to the people who needed hope. It is grace that broke the walls of hopelessness and captured the hearts of the lost. At the end of five years, there is an overwhelming joy to see the fruits of grace:

- The children are said to be more behaved at home and studying well in school.
- A few teens are now attending young people's fellowship at the Katipunan Bible Baptist Church.
- Some homes are open for home Bible Studies and visitation.
- A family is regularly attending worship service.
- A mother, a son and a nephew are baptized.
- A former dropout has finished high school through ALS (Alternative Learning System with Operation Mobilisation) and is now studying in the University of Cebu, taking up a Bachelor of Science Major in Business Administration.
- Some mothers have been employed in beauty parlors, and a few are engaged in home service massage.
- Nine adult ladies are actively engaged in small business endeavors.

Behind the walls of despair is hope in Jesus Christ! The grace of God has brought the people in the community to RISE above their circumstances and to find freedom through salvation in Jesus Christ.

### Educators

Many mentors have come and gone in the passing of time. But the men and women who have made a difference in lives of the school's students remain in the pages of the school's history and in the hearts of her alumni. Such influence has gone a long way into making them what they are today.

They are teachers who taught with HEART (Humble, Enthusiastic, Available, Relevant, and Truthful). The teachers cited in the following paragraphs are some of my personal choices:

- Mrs. Teresa Lim Ng Siok Kim (黃淑琴老師) is foremost in my list of teachers who exhibited genuine humility. She was very learned in Chinese studies - grammar, literature, history, culture, etc., whether spoken or written Chinese, she was the ultimate scholar par excellence. Yet, she never looked down on anyone who had less education or limited knowledge in Chinese. Moreover, she did not consider herself as having already achieved "perfection" in Chinese studies; she was always pressing on, and constantly attended teaching seminars. She never stopped learning. At the age of 70, she learned how to use the computer, one of the very few teachers in the Chinese department who embraced the new technology for instruction. Her humble spirit shames the wise and the smart.
- There was always enthusiasm when she steps into our classroom for a class in Chinese Geometry. Geometry was a difficult subject for many of us, but Ms. Judy Ong (李美麗老師), with her enthusiasm in teaching the subject, was inspiring. Her enthusiasm was very encouraging and made learning geometry challenging yet enjoyable. I had caught her passion for numbers; hence I pursued a degree in Mathematics because of her influence.
- If many of today's students struggle with Filipino, they are not alone. I, too, struggled with it; but my Grade 5 teacher, Ms. Editha Key, was kind enough to extend instruction time beyond class hours. She graciously and patiently helped me with it. She made herself available after school hours to coach me. Filipino did not become my favorite subject, but Ms. Key became one of my favorite teachers.
- How can you make ancient Chinese history relevant and interesting? Mrs. Tan Muy Tie (蕭梅治老師), with her strong and high-spirited voice, can tell fascinating stories and make centuries-old Chinese history come to life. There were always life lessons attached to the successes and failures of Chinese historical heroes and villains.



 The name Ms. Victoria Batoctoy will be on the lips of countless Kian Keenians when asked the question – "Who led you to salvation in Jesus?" To many first and second graders, the name Ms. Batoctoy is such a sweet name; just as sweet as the name of Jesus that she shared with her students. She never missed to be truthful to the biblical mandate to bring every soul to the saving grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ; she remained truthful to the Bible, faithful to the task of evangelism, and to the task of teaching the Truth to all her students.

Henry Adams was right when he wrote, "a teacher affects eternity!" There are still many more teachers and mentors of PCGS who have made their marks in my life as well as in the lives of some other students. Their beautiful examples have led many to live meaningfully – loving God and loving others. These mentors taught not only with their words but also with their works; they taught with eternity in view.

Counting the blessings that God has bestowed upon Philippine Christian Gospel School, no one can claim any merit. It's all God's grace – amazing, irresistible, abounding and overflowing in outward acts of generous giving and humble service by God's people.

# THE ROAD TO A HUNDRED YEARS: An Insider's View from the Centennial Commitee

The Church Council tasked five council members to form a central committee to initiate planning for the Church's 100-year celebration in 2016.

These core members then requested a few members of our Church to serve as "executive committee members" to help organize the big event. Praise God, they were willing and ready! Even though most of them are busily involved in their own secular work, they were always ready to heed the call and serve our God. Isn't that amazing?

The committee first met on April 5, 2014, brainstorming the specifics on what and how are we to celebrate our church's big day. How could we exalt the God's greatness and grace that he showered upon CGC?

The questions came non-stop: when will we start celebrating? What will be our theme? There were so many that we did not even know how to start!

Finally, our group decided to request the congregation to "Fast and Pray." Some members did it in groups, while others did it individually. After much contemplation, some concrete ideas gradually began to form.

First of all, a "theme" was necessary, so we started working on that theme. There were many suggestions: 頌讚主恩, 數算主恩, 主恩無盡, 極大讚美..."

We finally collectively decided to use John 1:16 (ESV): "For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace." Indeed, God's Grace – 100 Years and Beyond: 主恩長存. After that, the Lord continued to guide the committee members, inspiring one member after another to suggest ideas which the committee will then study. The process was organic and came very naturally.

Take for example, our invitation card. It was the brainchild of someone who traveled abroad, saw a very special card, bought a copy, and presented it to the group. It was just an idea, nothing more. The possibility of actually achieving it seemed impossible at that time. We must have forgotten that **nothing is impossible** for God!

But in the background, someone worked silently to bring the idea to fruition. So many trials were encountered that necessitated physical and mental exertion before a solution was reached a supplier outside the Philippines was found and contracted.

How the idea became a reality, I have no idea. Truly, it was by the grace of God!

Next, we dreamed of having a **Hundred-Voice Choir** to praise our Lord. A good suggestion, but will it materialize?

Seems impossible. Yes, our Church Choir is well-known for its magnificent vocals, but we literally needed a hundred singers!

Okay then, maybe let's not call it "100 Voices", but the "Centennial Choir" (oh ye of little faith!). When we watched them practice, it as figuratively with blood and tears. It was very challenging to coordinate everyone to come and practice together, thus discouraging the Choir director.

How was that particular hurdle overcome? They sent out the practice songs in CDs to everyone who was willing and able to join, including those who were outside Cebu or even outside the Philippines.

What was the result? I believe everyone witnessed the presence of God himself. When I watched the rehearsals, my heart melted. Imagine a motley crew consisting toddlers (the youngest was three years old) and even а nonagenarian (the oldest participant was 92!) practicing from 7:00 to 10:00 PM.



Once, the Choir even practiced until almost midnight when our Conductress – who came all the way from Vancouver, Canada and was leaving the next day – requested for them to practice more.

A hundred years of existence is not easily achieved. The Church encountered ups and downs, trials and testing by our Lord to make us strong for Him. To be firm for Him. And most of all, to remind us about the humble origins of **CEBU GOSPEL CHURCH**.

Therefore, we must also acknowledge the Heritage Committee, which started to work since 2011. Its members are God-sent, some of them may not be physically strong, but were spiritually charged with GOD's mighty power and wisdom.

They performed superbly. They got every fellowship, even the Philippine Christian Gospel School, and our daughter churches Mandaue Gospel Church (MGC) and Surigao Gospel Church to prepare bulletin boards to show everyone the mission and vision that underlies their existence. Everyone participated with eagerness, praise be to our mighty God!

Then we requested a very special family, so gifted by our Lord God with musical talent, to compose a hymn befitting the occasion: creating not only the music, but also English and Chinese lyrics as well! Would that be possible? Yes... and no.

Yes, they can do it, but the question was: will they do it? This gifted family is rather shy; when you ask them to do something, they would immediately respond that they do not know how to do it. But when God needed them, they couldn't say "no."

We all know it's not an easy job, especially since this family is a bunch of perfectionists. You know what I mean. Every note and every word has to be wisely placed. Our God is a perfect God, and so this family was just the right fit to do it! Again, trials and tribulation abounded, but were overcome by their hearts in writing the song for the Lord!

I thank those who walked the extra mile to make this celebration a success. God works through people around us. People from CGC and MGC. Former members who no longer worship in our church. These people have extended their hearts to help us.

What's more, there were also people who were not even members of our church, but extended their helping hands so sincerely. Most significantly, even friends and family who have not yet accepted Christ willingly aided us in our requests.

It is true, miracles after miracles were happening after we exalted God's name.



Yes, I realize that sometimes we feel so fulfilled, and everything seems so perfect. When pride starts to fill us, God would immediately show us our mistakes and our weaknesses. But never to discourage us, but to make us see that we need HIM to perfect our work carefully.

How did we uncover our mistakes? Through the prayers of our church members. They really prayed with sacrifices and tears. Wonderful things happened, because God listens to and answers collective prayer. So powerfully.

Did everything run smoothly? No! There were trials all throughout. Voices complaining about this and that; people getting sick; family problems popping up. Sometimes, even committee members became overly-sensitive towards others' opinions.

All I could say was, "Lord, do not leave us. We are almost there in glorifying your name! We know that Satan is working hard too, but You are more powerful. Through Your Strength we can overcome this!"

As is written in James 1:2-4, "My brethren, count it all **JOY** when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its **PERFECT WORK**, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing. 我的弟兄們,你們落在百般試煉中,都要以為大喜樂;因 為知道你們的信心經過試驗,就生忍耐。但忍耐也當成 功,使你們成全、完備,毫無缺欠。"

Wow, thank GOD for His reminder and encouragement. He always guided us and gave us His wisdom to decide for His work. How then could we not do our part, no matter how little, to help glorify the KING of KINGS? Our Centennial Choir made it to a hundred voices, with people coming from afar: from Manila, to Singapore and Canada. I could not imagine the effort, the time, and finances involved in the undertaking.


Participants practiced, practiced, and practiced. The Psalm recitation from the four or five-year old preschoolers from the Philippine Christian Gospel School; the "Being Christian Soldiers Joy Dance" presentation of the Sisters Fellowship, whose majority were already senior citizens; our Sunday School's "Revolting Children;" the puppet presentation by the Young Professionals. Even our church employees joined in, scheduling their practices after cleaning up the mess we left behind after church services.

I acknowledge our CYFers, and a group of young people calling themselves the V Crew – they must be the victorious ones? The Joybells and Soul Searchers. Everyone practiced not because they are good at performing, but because of God's Grace. Without it, nobody would stand up and perform. This time, the Lord used so many shy brethren to open themselves up and come out from their shells to help the church.

Our Lord also give us talented people to handle the choreography. Although she is so slim, I praise God's power in making her so energetic, it's as if she has an extra eye to help point out our mistakes during the rehearsals for all of the programs. Can you imagine how much God blessed her with such energy and wisdom?! These things happened during in the preparation of the CGC Centennial Year celebration – an outburst of Thanksgiving to our mighty God.

I end with a somewhat controversial issue: finances. Many people asked why we have to spend so much when we can do something big to help the world— the poor and the needy. Does that sound familiar?

Remember, my dear friend, we did this not for men, but as a form of gratitude. To magnify our Lord who has been with us for a hundred years and beyond. How can we *not* celebrate?!!

When our earthly parents reach 80, 90 or 100 years old, would we not be so happy and ask other people to celebrate with us? What more for our GOD who took care of us, loved us, and provided for us for a hundred years? He does not grow old, He does not change, and He will never leave us nor forsake us. All we need to do is to get connected with Him every day, every time, for every breath of our lives! I urge everyone to love Him with all our hearts, all our soul, all our minds and all our strength! Praise be to God Almighty!



## EXPERIENCING GOD'S GRACE

#### AT CGC MISSION COMMITTEE

he Cebu Gospel Church Mission Committee (CGCMC) was founded more than fifty years ago, with the goal of fulfilling the Great Commission of our Lord Jesus Christ to spread the Good News to our city, our province, our country, and beyond.

CGCMC is composed of our Pastors, Elders, four elected Deacons from our Church Council, and a representative from each of our church fellowship groups. There are five main areas that we give financial support in pursuit of our Mission goals:

- First, we support Missionaries who plant a church under a five-year program within a specific area or locality. There is a periodic review of their work, and we have, at different times, either sent an independent pastor, or our own Mission Committee members to visit and evaluate their church planting ministry.
- Second, we support Seminaries for their operational expenses as well as provide Theological Education Support for Seminary Students. This ensures the constant supply of new workers for the vineyard of the Lord as well as the upgrading of the knowledge and skill of the existing pastors in the mission field.
- Thirdly, we support Philippine Christian Gospel School (PCGS), especially in her Christ Emphasis Week activities. This helps introduce the Gospel to students and make life-long disciples out of our next generation.

- 4. Fourth, we support Operation: Jesus Loves You (JLY) which has conducted children's feeding and teaching ministry, medical missions, evangelistic work, and disaster response such as the sending of relief goods and the rebuilding of damaged churches in Cebu and beyond.
- 5. Last but not the least, we support various Christian Organizations like the DYFR-FM radio station, House of Hope, the Philippine Student Alliance Lay Movement (PSALM), Campus Crusade, Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship, Serving in Missions (SIM), Port Christian Center, Evangelism Explosion, CCOWE Philippines, and the Philippine Council of Evangelical Churches.

Each of these organizations offers a unique approach in bringing light and salvation into a world that is often lost in the darkness. In the succeeding pages, we present a couple testimonies from whose of people lives were saved: one through the ministry of PSALM, drug another through the Christian and rehabilitation center, House of Hope. We also include an acrostic from House of Hope which spells out their ministry. Through this, we hope to give you a glimpse of how your support of our Mission Committee creates a ripple that keeps the blessing going even outside of our circle of influence.

The history of the CGCMC is lined with many great stories, both told and untold, about how faithful men and women of our church gave their time, talents, and possessions in the fulfilment of the Great Commission. Through it, numerous churches were built both in the Philippines and abroad (particularly in China), and the Gospel indeed was made available to many a man, woman, and child.

For this article however, we shall view how God's Grace has been experienced at the Mission Committee through a more recent lens, since the writer's personal existence does not cover the length and breadth of CGCMC's existence.

It is not an understatement to say that the history of the CGCMC was fraught with challenges. A few years back, it was experiencing apathy, as evidenced by meetings that had difficulty in achieving quorum, differences in opinion, lack of direction, and eventually, the inability to meet our annual Mission Fund goals.

When this writer was chosen to lead the committee, his first reaction was to decline because of lack of ability and experience. However, through the kindness of the Mission Committee members, they assured him that this will be a collective work wherein all hands will be on deck to move our Mission Work forward as we approach the Centennial Anniversary of our church.

The twin disasters in 2013 that were the Bohol earthquake and Typhoon Yolanda presented a new mission for us – how to effectively coordinate a disaster response that will bring relief and hope to our suffering countrymen. The Mission Committee and Operation: JLY accomplished this by bringing together the entire church in a marathon packaging of emergency relief goods.

These operations eventually saw our assistance brought to different parts of Bohol and Tacloban, and even the northern tip of Cebu through trucks, boats, and motorized pump boats through the rivers and seas. With the cooperation with the Chinese Christian Relief Association (CCRA), we were also able to rebuild fourteen churches that were either damaged or destroyed by typhoon Yolanda.

These experiences created a bond within the Mission Committee, and rallied the support of our members. Our meetings became more substantive, and attendance and participation in meetings grew. The annual mission fund goal was also attained with the vigorous promotion by our Mission Committee officers, and Deacons David Tan and Gilbert Yap. Praise the Lord!

Even as things were getting better at CGCMC, our church was still searching for a Pastor to lead us into the Centennial Anniversary. The Church invited a few prospects, but it did not pan out for one reason or another.

There were some who fretted, "What if we reach a hundred years without a Pastor? When will the Lord send us a shepherd who will lead us?" Little did we know that God was preparing for us to experience His amazing grace through the CGCMC.

In June 2014, the CGCMC received a request for assistance from representatives of evangelist Dr. Stephen Tong, to help coordinate his citywide crusade to be held on July 24. Our committee approved this request, and provided logistics and meals in coordination with the other Chinese churches in our area. It was during our welcome lunch with Dr. Tong that this writer and Brother Nixon Po became reacquainted with Rev. Vicente Sia, whom God arranged to be in the same luncheon with us.

We knew him from way back when we were attending youth summer conferences to be a good and faithful man of God. As we conversed with him, we discovered that he was strong in missions with a passion for the lost. In fact, when he retired after many years as senior pastor of Jubilee Evangelical Church, he continued on as a pastor for missions. Dare we hope that he might be the one God will provide our church?

We continued to exchange pleasantries with him, and found out that he was in Cebu to supervise some of their church-supported missionaries. We offered our church parsonage as a guest room should he happen to pass by Cebu again. We also told him about our lack of a Church Pastor, and ask him if he would consider leaving his comfort zone in Manila, his family and friends, to come to Cebu (as they say, there is no such thing as a free lunch, so we didn't waste any time in grabbing the opportunity to invite Rev. Sia). To our amazement, Rev. Sia was very positive towards our invitation. He promised to pray about it, and seek the guidance of God. He became our Missions Emphasis Week speaker in the following year, and the rest, as they say, is history. Praise the Lord! We truly experienced God's Grace in providing us a Church Pastor just in time for our Centennial celebrations. **Postscript**: It has recently come to our knowledge that Erwin Sedenyo, the grandson of our late church driver Dodong Libron, has now come under the tutelage of Pastor Kirk Importante and is studying to be a pastor / church-planter. This was made possible through our church-planting initiative at Sambag 2, the place of residence of Dodong. We can see the Grace of God coming full circle when the grandson of our longest serving driver commits his life full-time to serve the Lord and spread the Gospel. Praise the Lord!

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### **BOOK SHELF** A TESTIMONY OF A LIFE THAT IS SAVED THROUGH THE MINISTRY OF PSALM

hen I was a kid, I was smart and good in the eyes of my family and peers. My life was normal, ordinary, and idealistic. I thought my life was perfect. I was naïve. Everything in my life

seemed fine.

But then, fast forward to 2007, I found myself in the hospital. My eldest sister had just given birth to twins by C-section. It was supposedly a joyous occasion. We were supposed to happy. We had new baby girls.

But when you scratch beneath the surface, the truth is we were all scared. My sister wasn't married; she was only eighteen The image of a seemingly perfect family suddenly disappeared.

I was fourteen then, and I was depressed. I kept on crying and crying until I felt empty and questioned why this happened. I hated my sister. I looked up to her and I felt betrayed. I couldn't imagine facing the people around me. I was her sister, and I felt that our life was tainted. And being her younger sister, ending up like her was the inescapable afterthought of most people. I didn't even care how hard it was for her or what she was going through.

One night, I found the Bible gathering dust on the book shelf. I secretly brought it to my room because I was embarrassed. No one had ever read, or let alone touched the Bible at home. I was curious and lost, and so I read it from page 1. But I couldn't understand it. I decided to abandon it. I left it to gather dust once more. My attempt at finding answers failed. Little did I know that it was God's way of calling out to me.

And so for years I simply tried to survive each day not knowing what to live for. Finally, I graduated from high school, after all the drama, and I convinced my parents to let me study in Cebu. I told them that I wanted to be a dentist and Cebu had a great dental school. I was the youngest and the first to move out, so naturally my parents were hesitant at first. But after a while, they finally approved.

I was happy because deep inside, I knew that coming to Cebu wasn't just for my studies. It was a form of escape from our unconventional and dysfunctional life. What with all the hype with my sister's babies, plus the fact that my mother's halfsisters who were almost my age showed up out of nowhere. Well, that made me feel stranded and lost, and so I left for Cebu. It was selfish, but I convinced myself otherwise.

I then began my first year in college. After a couple of months of adjusting, I found myself in a ministry in San Vicente Ferrer Parish. It was okay. I didn't quite fit in but I tried my best. Every week was the same, and I travelled far for the monthly fellowships.

I'll be honest. I was desperate for God. But I was forcing myself. I felt that something was missing and after about a year, I stopped. In spite of everything, I thanked God for always guiding me and protecting me. Without that ministry and being new in Cebu, I would have drowned in the superficiality and the fake happiness that society provided.

But the point is, it was over. I was only clinging to the hope that God would lead me someplace safe, to a place where I belonged, somewhere I needed to be. Yet in that gap of time, I realized that God never abandoned me, for He surrounded me with Christ-believers. They were my classmates and friends. God indeed is so wonderful because all that time, He was leading me to a certain point, preparing me for the climax of this story.

On February 25, 2011, someone shared the Gospel to me and I accepted Jesus Christ as my personal Lord and Savior. About a year later, on that fateful Friday in August, I met my discipler. We were just passing by the chapel in school and someone called out to us, inviting us to a fellowship. We were in the same course. She offered me and my friends a weekly Bible study. We happily accepted.

And so we had our Caring Circle Lessons every Thursday. In some meetings, there would be over ten of us. In other meetings, we would only be five. Sometimes, our meetings would be postponed or cancelled. Instead of a couple of months, our tenlesson Bible study extended to eight months. But I persisted because I was hungry for more, and I desired to know God outside the context of religion. I was a lost sheep and I felt that all those lessons kept me on track.

On our 10<sup>th</sup> and final lesson, I was both anxious and excited. I was anxious because I wondered, "What's next?" What happens after this?" But like a thrilling novel, something amazing was waiting over the next mountain. After a while, I was properly introduced to PSALM, and I was presented the opportunity to join the leadership training in Davao.

Being the coward that I was, I hesitated because I knew that I would never be the same again. But Io and behold, God gave me the strength and the courage to pursue the opportunity.

I remember that on our last CCL meeting, I was asked what kind of light I was. I looked inside and I said that I was a lampshade hiding in the closet, illuminating but hiding in darkness. God made me realize that it's time to open the closet, shine brightly, let His glory be seen in my life. As it is stated in Matthew 5:14-15: "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house."

So onwards to Davao I went. I arrived as an ordinary student, coming as another face in the crowd. But I went home a proud child of God, a humbled servant, a disciple of Christ, a once-lostbut-now-found sheep, and a Christian by heart. Indeed, God changes you in ways you cannot imagine.

The most important lesson I have learned in my 22 years of existence is that once you accept Jesus Christ in your heart and acknowledge that He is your Lord and Savior, you will be like a bud of flower coming into full bloom. And that is the truth. I am a living testimony of God's great power and I thank God for using PSALM as an instrument to reach out to more souls. Now, I am in my 6<sup>th</sup> year in Dentistry, and I can honestly say that life is beautiful despite all the hardships. All the suffering in this world will pale into comparison with the abundant life that God has planned for us.

I leave you with the verse from 1 Corinthians 15:58: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."

was awakened from my midsummer night's slumber as the cold wind sent me shivering. As my eyes searched, it caught the visage of a boy, in his teen years, who was sleeping next to me. I had spent the night in this PUJ, the owner of which I have not even laid eyes on. And this boy was a car washer. Yes, I slept with car washers! I had to rub the sleep off my eyes to see if this was for real or not. I could hardly believe that this was really me. Am I one of them now? Do I deserve to belong here?

Sunrise was yet hours away. I was uncertain if there will ever be one in this wretched life of mine. I couldn't go back to sleep, so I spent the wee hours of the morning pondering and recalling how I came to be in this mess. My whole being was engulfed in sin and confusion. I was trapped. My life was in a whirlwind... I was hooked on drugs.

All my hanky-panky started as merely a game of curiosity. I was 15 years old then when a cousin offered me a try. Such a tender age. I was young, innocent, and supremely overconfident that I'll never get hooked. But that move started it all. My problems began there. At first, it came slowly. But further on, it paved the way to my addiction. It was like the earth's gravity pulling me hard unto it. I tried marijuana, cough syrup and shabu. It was with shabu that I really got hooked into.

I often handed the blame down to my family, probably because my parents never really got along very well. My younger brother and I often witnessed our parents arguing and disagreeing on so many things. My father had attitude problems, and it was my Mom who took the responsibility to support us with our needs. She even endured being far from us when she decided to leave to work in the States. I was seven years old then, and my brother was five. It was tragic but we had no choice.

To make up for her absence, she sent us to a very good school, in fact a very reputable one: Cebu International School. But I guess material things and money will never suffice. It never did fill up that empty space within me. My only consolation then was my love for basketball. It was with the hoop and the ball that I spent my troublesome days with. I loved playing basketball since I was little. I often thought of it as a gift from God because this was where I was good at. I even dreamt that I'd make it big someday. But this, too, was not spared by the destruction drug addiction did to me.

I married at an early age. I now have two wonderful and smart daughters – two God-given treasures to keep. One thing I regret the most is that I never really got to spend time with them and enjoy the wonders of being a father, because I was too indulged in shabu.

I lost respect for my family that even their things became target for my looting. I sold off my children's clothes, my wife's personal belongings, and everything I laid eyes on – appliances, jewelry, and even food.

I would not go home for days, but would just show up when I was out of drug money and had to look for things in the house to sell again. I failed to realize what pain and shame I had brought to my family.

And so, they decided to let me undergo rehabilitation, I was forced to stay in DRACC, Lahug. But after four months, I prematurely left the program because I had convinced my family that I was my normal self again. But after two weeks, there I was again. I went back to drugs, but it was worse this time.

It reached a point when my family grew really tired and weary of all my foolishness. My mom didn't want to talk to me anymore. My wife, who was always the last one to hate me, was now giving up. I couldn't enter the house anymore because everybody was afraid they might lose something.

I deteriorated into mere flesh and bone. It seemed like every time I went home, my family looked like every one of them want to give my very mangy face a good punch.

That's how I came to be here sleeping with car washers in parked jeepneys. Everyone had turned their backs on me because it seemed like there wasn't even a ghost of a chance for me to change. I was left all alone and confused.

But I couldn't blame them, for I abused, neglected and disrespected them all because of drugs. I almost made drugs my god, my raison d'être. So, I had no one to blame but myself. All my excuses were just nothing but scapegoats.

It was then that I considered the idea of entering the House of Hope. I knew I needed help and I would only be reunited with my family if I open my heart for change and humble myself for rehabilitation.

It became the biggest step that I took, the greatest accomplishment I'll ever have, one that I would have regretted the most had I not done it. Because it was here that I found God and made him my Lord and personal Savior.

God indeed embraced me with his open arms. Despite my grave sinfulness, God accepted me back because Jesus had once given us a promise:

I desire mercy, not sacrifice. For I have not come to call the righteous but sinners.

#### Matthew 9:13

God has given me another chance, another life, a brand new one. Those gloomy days I spent under the influence of drugs would just remain as a closed chapter of my life – something to look back on but not something to cling unto. Those were all unhappy memories, but I know that God gave them to me for a purpose.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Jeremiah 29:11

His saving grace and love has made me an instrument of faith and renewal for my family and friends. It was a great challenge and an accomplishment for me – how he has used my life for the conviction of others.

For the rest of my life, I will never be too proud to say that I once was a sinner, a drug addict. But now I am born again as a Christian. In fact, I had professed my faith at my baptism last February 13, 2002. I have learned to trust in the Lord and acknowledge him in all my ways, and he indeed made my paths straight (Proverbs 3:5-6). Everything that seemed impossible and unreachable for me before, God has all set before me now. Since then, my life has never been the same. The Lord has blessed me and my family richly. I had sought him and how I found him.

"You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back from captivity."

# HOUSE OF HOPE

eeding God's calling for him, one valiant man from Singapore set his foot ashore to our island of Cebu back in 1998. Bro. Robert Yeo had a vision of using what was once his broken life to inspire others to find hope in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.



pening the doors of that bungalow he rented in Cebu that same year, he welcomed brothers who were burdened of the bondage of substance abuse and addiction in their lives. Bro. Robert underwent the very same ordeal in the past. He knew exactly how it felt to be an outcast in society, to be tangled in the perils of addiction.

nsurprisingly, his ministry grew and was greatly blessed by God into what it is now. From a group of a few brothers, to a population of over 60 brothers at present; from the few square meters inside that bungalow, to a very spacious and conducive area of 6,000 square meters of land in Gun-ob, Lapu-Lapu City to this very day.



tructured on the basic principles of Christianity, our one-year rehabilitation program consists of four major components. These guidelines are aimed to help extricate each resident brother from the menace of their substance abuse and addiction.



ncompassed in our program are Spiritual Therapy, Work Therapy, Physical Therapy and the Social Therapy. The core component is Spiritual Therapy because we greatly believe in the mighty power of our Lord Jesus Christ in renewing and restoring broken lives.

n any typical day, the residents participate in daily Bible devotions and personal Bible study time. They are also assigned to worship in designated partner churches of the ministry. Every Saturday night is prayer meeting schedule where families or friends of our brothers can join in fellowship with the whole House of Hope family.

Work or Therapy, residents are engaged in different work assignments, our Rubberfloat-making be it in project or water dealership project. They may also be tasked according to their skills and abilities. Some brothers with culinary expertise or experience may help out in the kitchen. Others may also help out in the office or at the maintenance department.

elping our brothers gain back their healthy stature is the aim of our Physical Therapy. Our residents are encouraged to participate in any sport or activity each day when the clock strikes 4:00 PM. They can either play basketball, futsal, badminton, billiards, darts, table tennis, and many other sports. Some may opt to sculpt out their body contours again by hitting the gym we have in the premises. Still, others may opt to go for a regular jog.

ur Social Therapy aims to help our brothers integrate back into society after the harrowing experiences they may have incurred from their shenanigan days. Our House of Hope family engages in some social activities every now and then, such as marathons, civic-oriented parades and programs, drug symposiums in different schools and companies, and even sports tournaments we get invited to. Additional downtime activities include island hopping or swimming trips within the province. We also hold our annual retreat every May.

roudly, the House of Hope ministry has become a channel of renewal who for people have gone wayward and have been engulfed in sin and confusion, to restore their lives and fulfil their God-given destiny by getting to know Christ and making Him as their Lord and personal Savior. Some of our brothers have gone to pastor their own churches, or have mended their broken relationships with their families and friends. Others have pursued successful careers of their own.

ach renewed and redeemed life that the House of Hope ministry has laid witness to, is a great reason to celebrate and praise God! And we will continue to rejoice for the greatness and awesome grace and mercy of our Lord God Almighty as we continue to welcome brothers into our family, as we continue to celebrate anniversaries, and as we continue to proclaim that our God is truly a merciful, loving and awesome God!!!

LEAVING YOUR

EGAGY

The word "legacy" means "something transmitted by or received from an ancestor or predecessor or from the past." People usually think of material inheritance when they use this word, but the word acquired this meaning after 1460. A century before, the word referred to a "body of persons sent on a mission," or an "ambassador or envoy."

Cebu Gospel Church's legacy is spiritual and everlasting, and as the body of Christ, we are on a mission. All of us share this very special and precious legacy that cannot be bought or accomplished by man.

#### THE FAITH THAT IS OUR LEGACY

Our faith is this: we believe in God the Father who sent His beloved Son Jesus Christ to die on the cross for our sins, and we also believe in the Holy Spirit who is dwelling in us and is perpetuating this faith down through the ages. We need to focus more on who Jesus Christ is, through reading the Gospel according to Matthew.

Matthew presents Jesus' identity in three ways. First, since his audience was mainly the Jewish people, he identified Jesus as the **Christ** (*Christos*) in chapter 1, verses 1 and 16. To the Jews, the Messiah is the One anointed by God to become the Savior of mankind. Presenting Jesus as the Messiah not only reveals who He is, but also reveals who God is. This goes all the way back to the Old Testament book of Genesis. God created man, but man sinned and fell from His grace. He remained gracious and faithful to man, promising a Deliverer, a Savior, the Anointed One. Jesus Christ truly is our Lord and Savior.

Matthew then identifies Jesus in another way: He is the **fulfilment** of what was written in the Scriptures. God promised us a Savior during the Old Testament times and fulfilled this promise in the New Testament period.

This is what Matthew 1:22 means. God chose the Israelites, even though time and again they failed Him. From the line of Abraham and David, God made possible the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is what the Bible is all about.

The third way that Matthew identifies Jesus is that He is the **God-man**. In Matthew 1:18 and 20, he mentioned twice that what Mary conceived was from the Holy Spirit; and in verse 23, Jesus is called *Emmanuel*, meaning "God with us."

These three verses reveal that Jesus is fully-God and fully-man. This revelation was given to Joseph as recorded by Matthew, but it was also given to Mary as found in Luke. This is the same revelation given to all Christian believers from that time until today. We believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the One True Savior promised by God, and we believe that He is truly God and truly Man.

#### PASSING ON THE LEGACY

The church established by Christ has been commissioned to pass on this legacy of faith from one generation to the next. But how did Cebu Gospel Church receive this legacy? Let me tell you the story.

In 1898, the door for the Gospel to enter the Philippines was opened. Protestant missionaries were free to do their work in Manila, Iloilo, Cebu, and many other places. In Cebu, the first missionaries who planted the Gospel seed were Rev. Paul Frederick Jansen and his wife Elizabeth White Jansen (蘭新夫婦), who came in 1902 and served until 1917.

Another couple who helped our Church were the Dunlaps—Rev. Dr. George Williamson Dunlap (喬治蘭納) and Devee Taylor (蒂比蘭納), who came in 1907 and served until 1935. Unfortunately, we have almost forgotten Rev. George Dunlap, and confused him with Rev. John Dunlop!

The confusion is caused by the Chinese name both rendered as 蘭納牧師. In actuality, George Dunlap came to Cebu before John Dunlop, and was the one involved with the emergence of CGC. John Wallace Dunlop came in 1918 and served until 1937; he returned in 1964 and died in Cebu in 1977 (which may explain why CGC members remember him more vividly).

Regardless of who came first, George Dunlap constantly ministered to northern Cebu and other parts of the Visayas. He assisted CGC as well when he was in Cebu City. Between 1901 and 1916, mission records from the U.S. Presbyterian Church's Board of Foreign Missions show that these missionaries focused on the people of Cebu City, Compostela, Dumanjug, Balamban, and Bohol.

One of the fruits of their labors was Rev. Jorge B. Patalinghug, who became the pastor of Matilda Bradford Memorial Church, which later changed its name to Bradford United Church of Christ in the Philippines. He met and invited Tan Khim (陳琴) who in turn invited Kang Tsui Leng (江水龍), the nephew of Cang Bon Pit (江文筆), to the Filipino worship service.

But even before this happened, two Chinese Christians—Chiu Tsong Kiau (周宗橋) and Sih Eng Su (薛永泰)—had already discussed plans

with the missionaries to hold Chinese services in the afternoon at Bradford Church. This was how CGC emerged. God used the American Presbyterian missionaries (the Jansens, Dunlaps, Raths, and Dunlops), the Filipino Christians (especially Rev. Patalinghug), and some Chinese Christians (Chiu and Sih) who were already in Cebu to organize Cebu Gospel Church.

Turning to mission reports,<sup>1</sup> we found the following records that show the progress of events during the first decade:

- 1916 (reported in May 1917) A [Bible] class of young Chinese of the best caliber was recently formed.
- 1918 (excerpted from a report by Rev. George Dunlap) — For nearly two years now regular services have been held every Sunday afternoon. Thus far we have had very good interpreters who were men of good standing and character, thus adding greatly to the power of the message. This service would no doubt seem rather strange to the visitor; the missionary leading the singing not

knowing a word he is using, and no doubt the Chinese brethren would have little idea of the words were it not for the singing book he has in his hands. A prayer in English, then a song in Chinese, scripture and prayer by a member of the congregation who, as a rule, is the one who has to do the interpreting.

- 1920 (reported in May 1921) Work for the Chinese has been started in the Visayan Sunday School, and Mrs. Rath [Theresa Margaret Kalb (term of service 1903-1934), wife of Rev. Charles Rath] has made calls on the Chinese women in company with the wife of a Chinese merchant of Cebu, who had been educated in a mission school in China and acted as interpreter [this refers to Mrs. Sih Eng Su who studied at lok Tek Girls' School (毓德女學校)]. One Chinese woman [it is safe to surmise that she is Mrs. Cang Ng Chhai Toan, wife of Cang Bon Pit] has been received into the church.
- 1921 (reported in May 1922) Chinese Church — The first Sunday in May 1921, the Chinese congregation was organized into a church. Two elders and a deacon were chosen from the seven young men who composed the organization. A number

of months ago, at their own initiative, they decided to hold a prayer meeting each Sun[day] evening in addition to the regular Sunday afternoon service. From this prayer meeting came the desire to have some special evangelistic meetings for the unconverted Chinese of the city. Three meetings were held. They were wellattended, and a splendid spirit was shown. The last night, 38 young men signed cards expressing their desire to accept Christ as their Savior.

1924 (reported in October 1924 by Rev. Judson Leolin Underwood) — Five of the Chinese teachers [of Cebu Chinese School] are stalwart Christians, and when the services of an American teacher were sought from our mission force, it was considered too good an opportunity for Christian service to be refused, and Mrs. Dunlap is giving part time to this work. Mrs. Rath is conducting a Bible class for women and the Chinese women themselves hold a Sunday School in one of their homes. The mission ladies have all done visitation that has been helpful. Up to the time of her transfer to Iloilo, Miss Fullerton helped in this work. For six months subsequent to the

Biederwolf meetings, a catechumen [pre-Baptismal] Bible class was conducted by the pastor for prospective members. Most of the twenty-three new members received this year came through this class. We now have a church membership of forty. Four of the men take turns with the pastor in preaching. The latter conducts a Bible class each Sunday following the regular hour of worship. An every-member canvass was made at the beginning of the year, over fifty subscriptions being made on the envelope plan. The Chinese vow and pay. Surely the Lord must love them. They are such cheerful givers, and we find it easy to love them, too.

In the fiftieth anniversary publication of Cebu Gospel Church, Go Pang Kong wrote that Chiu and Sih gathered eleven people during the first meetings of the Chinese congregation at Bradford Church. They are: Mrs. Cang Bon Pit/Jiang Wen Bi (江文筆夫人) nee Ng Chhai Toan/Huang Cai Duan (黃彩段), her son Kang Sun Heng/Jiang Shun Xing (江順興) and daughter-in-law Sih Ma Bin/ (薛媽敏), Xue Ma Min her daughter Mrs. Uy Cang Chui Siok/Huang Jiang Shui Shu (黃江水淑), Mr. and Mrs. Ng Siong Chu/ (黃祥慈夫婦) Xiang Ci and Huang their three daughters, and Mrs. lap An Tun/Ye An Dun (葉安頓夫人) with the legal name of Anton Yap, and her daughter.<sup>2</sup>

For about three decades (1916-1948), the Chinese congregation, at first numbering only eleven, worshipped at Bradford Church. Mrs. Cang Bon Pit, or Ng Chhai Toan (黃彩段) was one of the first to believe and be baptized. Her children and relatives, and a few other Chinese, became the core members of CGC.

#### LIVING/LEAVING THE LEGACY

I wanted to highlight this early history of CGC to show how the legacy was bequeathed by the first generation Chinese Christians. That generation went on to build a church structure on Junquera Street and to establish the Kian Kee School (now Philippine Christian Gospel School) around 1948. They have passed on the legacy to the second generation.

This legacy has come down to us, and we have the privilege and duty to pass it on to the next generations. If you think carefully, each one of us who is a believer received this legacy of faith from someone else: a pastor, a preacher, a teacher, a relative, a friend or even a stranger.

Since we have such a precious legacy, should we not keep passing it on to the generations that come after us? But how can we keep and pass on this legacy of faith? Philosopher Soren Kierkegaard said: "Life can only be understood backwards, but it must be lived forward."

There is a beautiful hymn entitled "Legacy of Faith" written by Dan R. Edwards and David Shelton. The lyrics are:

I

Looking back, I thank the Father For the saints who've shown the way, For the lessons they have taught me Are alive in me today. As I look into the future, I pray I can do the same.

So that all who come behind me Find power in Jesus' name.

#### II

As the legacy continues I pray I can do my part, For someone may be watching, Trying to find a way to start. So I'll live a life that's faithful To Jesus and His way, For the legacy of others Starts now with me today. "If you think carefully, each one of us who is a believer received this legacy of faith from someone else: a pastor, a preacher, a teacher, a relative, a friend, or even a stranger.

Since we have such a precious legacy, should we not keep passing it on to the generations that come after us?"

There are still so many unreached Chinese and Filipinos on Cebu, and after 100 years, there are only seven Chinese churches in Cebu City.

There are almost a hundred Chinese churches in the Philippines. Is this enough? How about Asia and the rest of the world? How are you going to leave your legacy?

# 傳承信仰的使命

著:蕭信心博士 譯:邵莊秀美博士 「傳承」(legacy)這單詞的意思是「傳 遞下來的產業」,從祖先或先賢接過來。 在1460年之後,當人們使用這個詞彙, 他們通常認為是指所繼承的產業;但這個 詞彙在1460年的一個世紀之前乃指「一 個受託使命的人」這個意思,或指一個「 大使或公使」。宿務基督教會有這屬靈和 常遠的傳承,而我們作為基督的身體,我 們有這使命,要與人分享這個非常特殊和 珍貴的信仰傳承,它不是商品可以購買或 由人來完成的。

#### 我們所傳承的信仰

我們的信仰是:我們相信上帝,祂差遣祂 的愛子耶穌基督為我們的罪而死在十字架 上;我們也相信聖靈,祂是永遠居住我們 裡面,也延續這個信仰垂千古。

通過閱讀馬太福音第1章,我們需要更多 地關注耶穌基督是誰。馬太以三種方式 呈現「耶穌」的身份。首先,由於馬太的 聽眾主要是猶太人,他在第1章呈現耶穌 是基督(Christos),第1節和第16節。 對猶太人來說,彌賽亞是上帝的受膏者, 成為人類的救主的那一位。呈現耶穌是彌 賽亞不僅揭示了祂是誰,更顯示了上帝是 誰。這要追溯到舊約的創世記。上帝創 造了人類,但人類犯了罪,從祂的恩典 墮落。上帝仍然以憐憫為懷,對人忠實, 應許了拯救者,救世主,受膏者。耶穌基 督確實是我們的救主。

馬太又以另一種方式指出耶穌:祂是**應驗** 聖經所說的話。上帝在舊約時代答應給 我們一個救主並在新約時代成就了一切 承諾。這是馬太1章22節所記載。上帝揀 選以色列人,儘管他們一次又一次的失 敗,從亞伯拉罕和大衛的根源,上帝讓 耶穌基督道成肉身。耶穌基督是應驗聖經 的應許。

馬太還用第三種方式指出耶穌,祂是神 人。在馬太1章18,20節,他兩次提到馬 利亞是由聖靈懷了孕;在第23節,耶穌 被稱為以馬內利,意思是「上帝與我們 同在」。這三節表明,耶穌是完完全全 的神,也是完完全全的人。這個啟示是 給約瑟的,記錄在馬太福音,也給馬利 亞,記載路加福音。這啟示也是給所有的 基督徒,即從那個時候一直到今天的 信徒。我們相信耶穌是彌賽亞,是我們的 救主,是上帝所應許的,我們相信祂是完 全的神,又是完全的人。

S-對來幫助教會是蘭納牧師夫婦 (the Dunlaps),就是喬治•威廉 姆森•蘭納博士(Rev. Dr. George Williamson Dunlap)和蒂比•泰勒• 蘭納師母(Devee Taylor Dunlap)。 他們自1907年來到,直到1935 年。可是,我們幾乎忘記了喬治蘭 納牧師,把他和約翰•華萊士• 蘭納牧師(Rev. John Wallace Dunlop) 混淆了!

這種混亂是由於中國人起的名字-把姓 名一起作為「蘭納牧師」。實際上, 喬治·蘭納牧師到宿務是在約翰·蘭納 牧師之前,並參與我們教會的成立。 約翰·蘭納牧師於1918年到達並擔任 分直到1937年;然後在1964年又回來 宿務,於1977年去世(這也許可以解釋 為什麼我們會友比較記得他)。即使我 們不考慮那一位先來,喬治·蘭納牧師確 實經常在宿務北部和米沙鄢群島的其他 分服侍。他也協助我們教會。從美國長明 自1901年至1916年期間,這些來自美北長 老會外國使團的宣教士都集中在宿務市, 孔波斯特拉,隆達,巴蘭班和波荷島。

宣教士們勞苦的果子是喬治・巴達凌忽 牧師(Rev. Jorge B. Patalinghug),他 成為明德布拉德福德紀念教堂的牧師, 後來教堂改名為布拉德福德基督教會。 他邀請陳琴(Tan Khim);而陳琴又邀請 了江水龍(Kang Tsui Leng),即江文筆

(Cang Bon Pit)的侄子,參加菲律賓人 的崇拜。在此之前,兩位華人基督徒, 周宗橋(Chiu Tsong Kiau)和薛永黍 (Sih Eng Su)已經與宣教士討論,並計 劃每主日下午在布拉德福德教堂開辦華 人聚會。這是宿務基督教會如何成立起 步的。上帝用美國長老會宣教士 (Jansens, Dunlaps, Raths, and Dunlops 等等),菲律賓基督徒(特別是喬治· 巴達凌忽牧師),以及一些華人基督徒 (周宗橋和薛永黍)在宿務組織了宿務基 督教會。

我們翻閱以下宣教事工的記錄,顯示第一個十年期間事務的進展:

• 1916年(1917年5月報導)一「有一 群很優秀的華人青年查經小組已經形 成了。」

- 1918年(由喬治·蘭納牧師的一份報告)「現在已將近兩年一經常舉行每星期日下午的聚會。到目前為止,我們已經有良好名譽和性格優秀的男士作翻譯員,這大大增加信息的供應。這項服務無疑對過路遊客會顯得十分奇怪的, 宣教士帶領唱歌,他其實不知道一個漢字;而華人弟兄如果不是靠他的手中的詩歌本,根本對宣教士的想法及話語一點 也沒有概念。有英語的祈禱,漢語的詩歌,有聖經經文;以翻譯員帶領會眾祈禱,作為有規則的崇拜。」
- 1920(於1921年5月報導)—「為華人的工作已經在米沙鄢開始主日學,拉特夫人〔Theresa Margaret Kalb 即特蕾莎・瑪格麗特・卡爾布(服務期間1903年至1934年),是查爾斯・拉特牧師(Rev. Charles Rath)的妻子〕探訪華人之時有一位華僑商人的妻子伴隨著,

她曾在中國教會學校接受教育並能擔任翻譯〔這就是指讀毓德女學校的薛永泰夫人(Mrs. Shi Eng Su)〕。另外一個華人婦女〔應該是黃彩段(Mrs. Cang Ng Chhai Toan),即江文筆的妻子〕已被接收到教會了。」

- 1924年(由賈德森·安德伍德牧師 Rev. Judson Leolin Underwood 報導, 1924年10月)-「有五位華人教師已是 堅定的基督徒,當時我們正尋求一個美 國老師的服務,而蘭納師母正好兼職這項 工作。拉特太太也正在進行婦女查經班; 有一個姐妹在自己家中舉行主日學校;還 有其他女宣教士所做探訪的事工也大有貢 獻。富勒頓姊妹(Miss Fullerton)在她 轉移到伊郎之前,幫助了姐妹會這項工 作。在 Biederwolf 牧師舉行佈道會隨後

半年,已經開了一慕道查經班,來了23 位新成員。我們現在有40個教會成員。 又有4個人輪流幫牧師講道。還進行每週 日一小時崇拜後的定期查經班。每年開始 時,每個會員都徵求投票,有50多個立 定參加奉獻信封的計劃。他們如果承諾就 必定奉獻。神的确地是愛他們。他們是這 樣開朗,又甘心而作的,我們發現很容易 喜歡他們。」

吳彭康(Go Pang Kong)在宿務基督教 會成立五十週年的出版刊寫上,當時在 布拉德福德教堂,華人會眾第一次聚 集有以下11個人,由周宗橋和薛永黍 召集的:江文筆夫人原名黃彩段(Mrs. Cang Bon Pit/Jiang Wen Bi nee Ng Chhai Toan/Huang Cai Duan)、她兒子 江順興 (Kang Sun Heng/Jiang Shun Xing)和她媳婦薛媽敏(Sih Ma Bin/Xue Ma Min )、她女兒黃江水淑(Mrs. Uy Cang Chui Siok/Huang Jiang Shui Shu ) 🚿 黃祥慈夫婦 (Mr. and Mrs. Ng Siong Chu/ Huang Xiang Ci)和他們的三個女兒、 以及葉安頓夫人(Mrs. lap An Tun/ Ye An Dun ) ,與她四個女兒。

#### 活出/留下信仰傳承

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ith the amount of grace upon grace God piled upon our Church, how can one truly narrate His goodness, kindness and mercy? Even with a century-long timeline, God's amazing grace continues to resonate in the lives of each believer.

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### FOREWORD

I will humbly try, through God's mercy, to capture in words and in photographs the amazing grace of God for the past 100 years in the life of **Cebu Gospel Church**: as a Church, a family, and an institution. Why use photographs? Simple. A picture can speak a thousand words when words become inadequate.

## HISTORY

#### PROFILE

Cebu Gospel Church, formerly called the Chinese Christian Church of Cebu (宿務中華基督教會) is located in the heart of Fuente Osmeña, Cebu City, adjacent to Cebu Doctor's Hospital and a block away from the Capitol Building.

She is the oldest of the seven Chinese churches in Cebu. She is also the second-oldest Chinese church in the whole country, after St. Stephen's Parish Church of Manila.

#### EARLY HISTORY (1916-1925)

Cebu Gospel Church was founded in March 1916, with the influence of American missionaries. **Rev. Dr. George Williamson Dunlap** and his wife **Devee Taylor Dunlap** had planted the seeds of Protestant Christianity for the Chinese in Cebu City beginning in 1907. They would serve until 1937.<sup>1</sup>

At its inception, the church did not have a building to call its own. Regular Sunday worship services were held in the afternoon at the **Matilda L**. **Bradford Memorial Church** (now the Bradford United Church of Christ in the Philippines). For 33 years, the congregation worshipped in borrowed premises, ranging from other churches, a makeshift housechurch in Manalili, the Yutivo Building,<sup>2</sup> and a center called the Cebu Gospel Chapel.

Because it did not own its own sanctuary, Cebu Gospel Church essentially roamed like a nomad within Cebu City, uprooting and transferring venues every so often. Still, reports written by the early church leaders<sup>3</sup> painted a very vibrant and thriving church, which I quote:

**1916** (reported in May 1917) – a class of young Chinese of the best caliber was recently formed.

1918 (excerpted from a report by Rev. George Dunlap) – for nearly two years now, regular services have been held every Sunday afternoon. Thus far we have had very good interpreters who were men of good standing and character, thus adding greatly to the power of the message. This service would no doubt seem rather strange to the visitor; the missionary leading the singing not knowing a word he is using, and no doubt the Chinese brethren would have little idea of the words were it not for the singing book he has in his hands. A prayer in English, then a song in Chinese, scripture and prayer by a member of the congregation, who, as a rule, is the one who has to do the interpreting.

#### The early Church, five years after its founding

**1920** (reported in May 1921) – Work for the Chinese has been started in the Visayan Sunday School and Mrs. Rath has made calls on the Chinese women in company with the wife of a Chinese merchant in Cebu, who had been educated in a mission school in China and acted as interpreter. One Chinese woman has been received into the church."

To this day, the children and grandchildren of Mrs. Cang, the "one Chinese woman" mentioned above, still worship in Cebu Gospel Church (Elder Valentin Uy is her grandson). In fact, a building located at the Philippine Christian Gospel School is named after her daughter, Uy Cang Chui Siok.

On the first Sunday of May 1921, the Chinese congregation was organized into a church. Two elders and a deacon were chosen from the seven young men who composed the organization.

A prayer meeting was added to the regular Sunday afternoon service. It was in this prayer meeting that the desire to evangelize the Chinese was impressed in their hearts. After three meetings, 38 young men signed pledge cards expressing their desire to accept Christ as their Savior.

From 1921 to 1925, **Pastor Jorge Patalinghug** held regular services at the Bradford Memorial Church. Significantly it was also during this period when Rev. and Mrs. Dunlap started to conduct Sunday School sessions for the children.<sup>4</sup>

The **Sunday School ministry** was formally organized in 1924,<sup>5</sup> with the Chinese women holding a Sunday School in one of their homes.<sup>6</sup>

Ten years later, **Juaning Siao** took over the leadership of the ministry. She made tremendous progress by attracting more children to attend Sunday School. In an Evangelistic Meeting in 1934, 30 persons were baptized.

At present, our church's Sunday School has the best teaching program. Classes are held in a Sunday School building (constructed in 1983), with an annex building added later. The annex was renovated on September 27, 2009.<sup>7</sup>

By 1924, church membership had grown to forty, with Bible class conducted after the worship service. The members were very cheerful givers, as evidenced on the monetary pledges made at the beginning of the year. This trait has been carried up to this writing. Indeed, although our members may be few in number, God has bestowed upon Cebu Gospel Church the gift of generous giving.

#### GROWING PAINS (1926-1950)

The fledgling church experienced a lot of birth pangs. For one, it was HARD to find converts. Sometimes, there were only three people present at a service – the speaker, an interpreter, and a listener! However, this did not dampen the spirits of the founding fathers. The number of members steadily increased, due to the revival and evangelical meetings the church conducted in addition to its Sunday Worship Service.

I must note that the early Church placed much emphasis on the prayer meeting to supplement the Sunday worship service. Thus, it can be inferred that the church grew from much prayer and evangelization. But after a hundred years, it appears that the number of people attending the prayer meeting has dwindled to a handful.

Prayer now seems to be a much-neglected ministry of the Church. I hope to see the day when all church members truly pray and desperately desire to commune with God our Father, moment by moment, so frequently that it becomes just as natural as breathing. The **Church Choir** first sang during the Chinese New Year celebration on February 4, 1935, with **Jose Cang** and **Hilaria Tian** as the two founding members.

In their maiden performance at the Cebu Christian Center, the church raised a princely sum of \$300 during the Spring offering (worth approximately \$135,000 in today's money.<sup>8</sup>)

In 1937, **Rev. Liang Sei Kuo**, a noted, outstanding theologian from Guangxi, China, joined Cebu Gospel Church as church pastor. His arrival signified a new era for the growth of our church.

On December 8, 1941, Japan attacked the Philippines, drawing our country into the second World War. The Japanese invasion and occupation from 1942 to 1944 struck a debilitating blow to our church membership. Everything was razed to the ground, and most properties were destroyed. However, the members survived because of their HOPE, FAITH and PRAYERS.

After war ended in 1945, our members regrouped and reorganized, holding regular Sunday meetings and worship services. However, our church was still HOMELESS, so the venues were alternately in either Cebu Grace Church or Bradford Memorial Church.

By this time, Rev. Liang saw the need to have our own Sanctuary as well as our own school, where future church leaders and members would be educated, nurtured and developed. With this vision and mission in mind, he prayed and challenged church members to attain this dream.

In 1948, this dream was realized with the construction of a school campus and chapel in Junquera Street. Following the creation of the **Kian Kee School** (later renamed Cebu Christian School and now known as Philippine Christian Gospel School), Cebu Gospel Church moved to its new home. After 33 long years, Cebu Gospel Church had finally found a place it can call its HOME.

The Christian Youth Fellowship (CYF) was established in November 1948. Having branched into Elementary and High School divisions, the CYF is one of the most active ministries in our Church. The Elementary CYF meets every Saturday afternoon, while the High School CYF is held every Friday evening.

In the 1950s, economic nationalism led to financial crisis for our church, which had a Chinese congregation. Fortunately, Rev. Liang volunteered to waive his salary for 1951, to ease the economic burden of both Cebu Gospel Church and Kian Kee.

#### FLOWERING OF FELLOWSHIPS (1951-1962)

On February 7, 1951, the **Sisters' Fellowship** was formally organized, headed by **Ms. Yu Bon Piak** with Rev. Liang Sei Kuo serving as spiritual adviser. The fellowship originally had twelve members, holding meetings every Tuesday at 3:00 PM that consisted of standing and praying together out loud. Originally, they met at Mrs. Cang Chiu Siok's residence at Manalili, transferring later to the school. They moved back to Manalili when the school bell that signaled the end of each class proved too distracting, but returned after the original location was deemed be inaccessible for transportation.

Today, the Sisters' Fellowship is 50-member strong. It still holds fellowship at the same time schedule, but this time in our Church auditorium. They conduct visitations once a week for friends and family, including non-Christian friends whom they shared the gospel and pray over with.

On June 1956, the **Youth Fellowship** was formed. Today, its present form, the Christian Youth Fellowship (CYF), is one of the most active ministries, having branched into Elementary and High School divisions. The Elementary CYF is held every Saturday afternoon, while the High School CYF is held every Friday evening.



The Brothers' Fellowship, founded in July 1956, celebrates its First Anniversary

On July 8, 1956, the **Brothers' Fellowship** was formalized upon the guidance of Rev. Liang Sei Kuo, with twelve original attendees.<sup>9</sup> At the end of 1956, Rev. Liang's son, **Pastor Liang Shen Wei**, was recruited to join our church as a missionary.

Sensing the inadequacy of the sanctuary in Junquera Street, and noting the inconvenience of holding fellowship meetings in a school where noise could not be avoided, the Council formed a committee in May 1957 to look into the feasibility of building a bigger and modern sanctuary.

On December 1, the first issue of **Gospel Quarterly**, the predecessor of *Gospel Light*, was released.

In October 1960, the Church concluded the purchase of a 2,080-square meter lot along Osmeña Boulevard, for future church expansion. One year later, Cebu Gospel Church conducted its inaugural English-language worship service on October 8, 1961. The next year, on August 12, 1962, the Church proudly hosted **Ambassador Tuam Mo Lan** of the Republic of China (the official name of Taiwan) as guest speaker.

#### A NEW HOME (1963-1966)

The fund-raising campaign for constructing a new church building officially kicked off on March 1, 1963. A noteworthy fact was that not a single centavo came from outside solicitation, and the entire amount was raised solely through faith and prayer of the members.

In June 1964, **Rev. Joseph Young** was invited to shepherd our church, which he accepted. We should note that although the land had been purchased, it was not easy to raise the funds needed to build the sanctuary—an amount that required hundreds of thousands of pesos. The church members were hesitant to start the project, but Rev. Joseph Young encouraged them to push through with the herculean task.

Elder Frank Liuson played a major role in the construction of our Church. The project was initially pegged at ₱250,000 to ₱300,000, but since only ₱40,000 was pledged, he took it upon himself to supply whatever shortages or financial needs were encountered during the construction. Eventually, he ended up as the prime contributor to the sanctuary's construction, whose costs ultimately totalled ₱420,000.<sup>10</sup>

From what I gathered, Elder Liuson was not only good-looking, young, rich, and generous, but he was also a very humble and Godfearing man. He spent time studying the word of God.

It is said that before he died, two of God's angels appeared to him inform him of his impending death a few days after their visit. Because of this advance notice, he was able to write his own eulogy, and could bless his son, family, and grandchildren before he died, as narrated by Elder Adon Ong and Deaconess Jane Jane Ong.

True enough, he passed away peacefully on the appointed time the angels told him. Truly God honors those who love Him.

In any case, fulfilment of the dream began on the afternoon of December 27, 1964, with a solemn groundbreaking ceremony officiated by Rev. Young. It was a memorable and moving affair, with the Choir present to render songs of praise to our Lord.

Construction commenced on February 10, 1965, with Architects **Cristobal Bo Espina** and **Filomena Espina** providing the architectural design and plans for the new sanctuary. The sanctuary is shaped like a cross. It is 30 meters long, 15 meters wide and 16 meters high with both sides stretching to about 10 meters each. A wooden cross, with neon lights behind it, is prominently seen occupying the center stage of the sanctuary.

At the time, development was sparse—the Church was bounded on the left by the DYRC radio station, by Philam Life Insurance Building on the right,

and Kamuning Street at the back. Everything else was grassland. Construction finished later the same year, and first Sunday worship service held at the new sanctuary was officiated by Rev. Joseph Young on December 26, 1965.

The whole month of March 1966 ranked among the greatest and memorable moments of our church. On all four Sundays (March 6, 13, 20, and 27), Cebu Gospel Church celebrated her "Golden Jubilee." The high marks of the festival incuded:

- 1. Dedication of the new Sunday School Building
- 2. Diamond Jubilee Fellowship Meeting and Dinner
- Music Festival, joined by the Church Choir, the Children's Choir, the Ladies' Ensemble, and noted soloists
- 4. Youth Fellowship Night
- 5. Revival and Evangelistic Meetings
- 6. Special Prayer Meetings

Three great events transpired on the two days spanning March 26 and 27. These were:

- The 50<sup>th</sup> Golden Jubilee celebrating the founding of Cebu Gospel Church.
- Dedication of the newly-built Sanctuary at Fuente Osmeña Blvd., where our church presently stands. After the dedication services were held at 9:30 AM, worship services were officially moved to the new location.
- Ordination of Rev. Liang Shen Wei as shepherd of our church, taking over his father's duties and responsibilities.

Joyful and meaningful programs were held to solemnize this wonderful occasion. To add more color, **Madam Ambassador Han Li-Wu** from the Republic of China led all distinguished guests in the celebration of this memorable affair.

After morning service, a group picture was taken with all members and guests lining up in front of the

new sanctuary. Since there was no traffic at the time, it was quite easy for the photographer to take the shot.

When he shouted "O lele" (all ready), he ducked under that big black cloth and we froze with smiles on our faces, waiting for that big flash signaling that the picture had been taken.

Later in 1966, our Church recognized its first batch of missionaries and sent them out to preach the Gospel. The first three missionaries,<sup>11</sup> chosen during Missions Month in August 18, were **Pastor Guzman Ravelo** of Tribal Missions, **Pastor Quirino** of the UCCP Cotabato City, and **Bro. Robert Yu** of Zamboanga City. Bro. Yu later enrolled at Ebenezer Bible College in Zamboanga, and later became our Senior Pastor, famously known as Rev. Robert Yu of CGC and DYFR.

#### EXPANSION (1967-1978)

Assisted and backed by our church, the **Surigao Gospel Chapel**, now known as the Surigao Gospel Church, was formally inaugurated on July 9, 1967. Our beloved **Rev. Lim Hui Khim** (later ordained as their pastor on May 7, 1978) and his family served in Surigao for a long time, as did **Pastor Juanita Go** and **Pastor Alice Huang**. The church is shepherded by **Pastor Rosalinda Ng** today.

The following two years would see a changing of the guard. On February 18, 1968, Rev. Joseph Young resigned from our church. More than a year later, on November 1969, our beloved Rev. Liang Sei Kuo passed away while in Hong Kong.

Due to a shortage of classrooms thanks to the burgeoning population of our Sunday School ministry, the Church Council decided to construct a new building (where our nursery room is presently located) to the right of the sanctuary. Construction began on June 11, 1971, with the building mostly made of wood.

The Sunday School department formed a Sunday School choir, which served as another evangelical arm of the Church through music. Founded by **Gui Ben Tan**, this group became the forerunner of the other singing groups that would follow, such as the Joybells, Soul Praise Band, and Joyful Courriers.

The **Carmel Fellowship**, intended for brothers and sisters who had "aged out" of the younger fellowships, was founded in December 1972 by Rev. Liang Shen Wei, Pastor Juanita Go, **Pastor Johnny Limchesing**, **Elder Nelson Sy**, and **Lucio Ong**.<sup>12</sup>

The Church was blessed with the arrival of **Pastor Michael Tsang** and his new bride, who accepted our offer in October 1974. Although they were both from Hong Kong and spoke only Cantonese, they soon learned the Hokkien dialect.

His wife **Christina**, who was gifted with a golden voice, led the Chinese church choir. Their three children – Vivian, Karen, and Calvin – were all born while they served Cebu Gospel Church. The Tsangs would stay for over a decade, leaving for Austin, Texas in 1985.

In March 1976, Cebu Gospel Church celebrated its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. In the Philippines, it can be considered a "Senior Citizen." If it was a person, it would be granted special 20% discounts and be exempted from 12% value-added tax!

During this time, a Bible study group that had been meeting in Cebu Christian School formed an evangelical singing team called the **Soul Searchers**. Their spiritual advisers were the Pradhans: **Himlal Pradhan** was then the guidance counsellor of the school, and was later ordained and is now fondly known as Dr. Himlal Pradhan; his wife, **Maria Lee Pradhan**, was then directress of the school.

The music instructor of the Soul Searchers was the very-talented **Hattie Yu** (also the director of our Church Choir). After Mrs. Yu left for Canada, she was succeeded by **Susana Su**, **Jenny Ong**, and later, **Rosemarie Su-Castro**.

Later in 1976, our Church conducted its first Gospel Educational Seminar, graced by Hong Kong theologians Prof. and Mrs. **Hu Wen Hsian**. Adding to international linkages, the famous evangelist **Rev. Stephen Tong**, who was known as the "Chinese Billy Graham," held the Third Youth Evangelical crusade with a message about God's Great Love.

The **Surigao Gospel Church** celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> Founding Anniversary on May 8, 1977. Six members from our Church traveled to Surigao City to attend this memorable affair. Rev. Chai Chong Yee delivered the keynote message for the occasion. Another musical group, the Joybells Gospel Team, was conceptualized in October 1977 when young people with musical talent desired to use their voices for the Lord.<sup>13</sup> **Elizabeth U. Oh** was instrumental in the creation of this group.

Today, the Joybells Gospel Team continues to be an evangelistic arm of the Church, rendering beautiful anthems during church service, giving concerts, and conducting fund-raising and outreach programs to support other ministries. It has conducted workshops with Heavenly Melody and the Papuri! Ministry, the music ministry of Far East Broadcasting Corporation Philippines. They continue to travel locally and internationally, sharing their angelic voices for the glory of God.

In 1978, the Saturday Prayer meeting was moved to 6:00 AM to attract more participants. This change in schedule resulted in the many young people joining the fellowship. **Raymond Ong** (who later became a deacon and elder of our church) was a very active youth leader who would telephone the young people, and pick them up as early as five in the morning. He would simply call to say that he was on his way, prompting us to jump out of bed.

After the prayer meeting, we would have a simple breakfast in the parsonage, and then proceed to PCGS for the Saturday Bible Study which started at 9:00 AM at the old library.

This was followed by the Soul Searchers practice and the Berians Bible Study. In the afternoon, the young people were once again gathered in Church for C asdf followed by Choir practice at 6:00 PM. That washow the church occupied the time of the young people, at least those who didn't have piano or other music lessons. The Soul Searchers conducted its first evangelical trip on April 8, 1978, traveling to Tacloban, Leyte to teach DVBS and conduct concerts and skits. The Soul Searchers is currently an evangelistic arm of our Church. Its members continue to do what they do best: sing, evangelize, sponsor Bible scholars, and conduct outreach and many other related activities.

In November 1978, the CYF celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> founding anniversary, holding a Thanksgiving Service to commemorate this event.

#### MILESTONES (1979-1986)

A memorial service was held for Rev. Joseph Young on July 9, 1979. He was fondly remembered as a major catalyst in the growth of our church. It was he who was insisted that the church must have its own sanctuary so that we can have a permanent place of worship.

70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 1986

In December 1980, one of our inaugural missionaries, Rev. Robert Yu, was appointed as our part-time Pastor. He was then the manager of DYFR-FM 98.7, a ministry that was close to our hearts.

In February 1981, the Sisters' Fellowship celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Thanksgiving Service was followed by a sumptuous meal.

From March 25 to 29, our church celebrated its 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. A morning prayer meeting and evening worship service was held for this occasion, with **Rev. Kuan Kuo Rui** as the guest speaker.

Rev. Liang Shen Wei, our devoted Pastor for 25 years, was called home by our Lord on May 25. Following the ordination of Rev. Lim Hui Kim as Surigao Gospel Church's shepherd, Pastor Alice Huang was commissioned as our new missionary to Surigao on June 21.

On July 4, the Brothers' Fellowship marked its Silver Anniversary with a Thanksgiving service. On February 17, 1982, Far East Broadcasting DYFR-FM commenced the airing of a Gospel program sponsored by our Church. The show aired every Wednesday noon for one hour.

On January 9, 1983, Pastor Michael Tsang was formally ordained as our Reverend. In June, **Wanda Po** was appointed as a missionary. Her work involved guiding the youth and mentoring the students in PCGS on Religion.

On August 21, 1983, the groundbreaking for the construction of our new Sunday School Building (where the church office currently stands), was held at the back of the sanctuary. Engineer **Sidney Po** was hired to oversee the construction, receiving a monthly salary of ₱1,000 (around ₱12,000 today).

In 1984, three church members who were too old for CYF but too young for the Carmel Fellowship established the **Young Professionals** fellowship for others just like them.<sup>14</sup>

On June 17, 1984, the newly-completed Sunday School building was dedicated to the Lord.

On July 1, the Church Council decided the following schedule would apply for Sunday (incidentally, a schedule similar to the one implemented in 2017!):

- 1. English Sunday Service 07:45 to 08:45 AM
- 2. Sunday School 08:30 to 09:30 AM
- 3. Chinese Sunday Service 09:45 to 10:45 AM

There was a changing of the guard on September 22, 1985. In a simple but impressive ceremony, Rev. Michael Tsang turned over his pastoral duties and functions to Rev. Robert Yu. He and his family left later for the United States, with a farewell party celebrated on November 3.

In March 1986, our church reached its 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. A dramatic play performed by church members on March 9 entitled "Respecting the Lord" opened to rave reviews. As part of the festivities, a grand thanksgiving service was offered on March 16. Two new elders, **Domingo Ong** and **Nelson Ting**, were also ordained during this occasion.

## CENTURY'S END (1987-1999)

Sometime in 1987, the Monday Bible study class started to help Christians grow in faith. It was first held at the residence of **Philip Yap** and **Dr. Helen Yap**. Later, the class was moved to the Church.

In 1988, the Chinese churches in Cebu, Bacolod, Dumaguete, Tacloban and Iloilo formed the Visayas Christian Workers Fellowship, operating under the acronym CBDTI. The new organization would hold retreats for the youth and church workers every alternating year. Our CYF first hosted the camp in 1990, with the venue held at the Bethany Gospel Church.<sup>15</sup>

Citing reduced attendance in the Chinese worship service, the Church Council decided to merge the Sunday English and Chinese services into a unified bilingual service on July 4, 1989. Worship hours were moved from 8:30 AM to 10:15 AM. Starting March 1990, missionary Wanda Po was tasked to train Sunday School teachers.

November 12, 1990 was a disaster for Cebu, with Super-typhoon Ruping slamming Cebu City headon with winds of up to 230 kilometers per hour. The cities of Cordova, Lapu-Lapu, and Mandaue were also hit hard. The first Mactan bridge was badly damaged and rendered impassable after a boat hit its base. People who wanted to catch a flight at the Mactan International Airport had to cross the Mactan channel using a ferry boat.

Cebu City was at the center of the storm. Practically all the electric poles were toppled, and there was no electricity supply for about a month. Water supply was also scarce. The church opened its doors for people to get water (and even to bathe!) since we had a generator that can supply electricity to pump groundwater to the water tank. It was truly a blessing to be able to run to our church in times of disaster. One can easily realize that no matter what, there is a church family that opens its arms to its members and other people.

After the Monday Bible Study class grew to 60 attendees, the group was divided to make classes more manageable. Thus, the Saturday Bible Study was born in 1991. Today many church leaders and workers came from this group. In fact the Heritage Committee is composed mostly of this group.

On March 17, 1991, the church celebrated its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, with **Rev. Paul Huang** of Bacolod Trinity Church invited to speak in the Thanksgiving Service.

On November 26, 1992, long-time missionary and beloved Pastor Juanita Go departed to be with our Lord.

Concerned with the struggles of Surigaonon students who were studying in Cebu, **Rosalinda Ng**, who is presently the Pastor of Surigao Gospel Church, championed a new Bible study fellowship. When it moved its initial Saturday sessions to Sunday, the fellowship was christened as the "Sunday Cell Group," or SunCell in short.

80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 1996

**Pastor Jerry Yaokasin** accepted the position of youth pastor on May 31, 1993. His stay with the church was short, and he later became a devoted politician serving his hometown in Tacloban City, Leyte.

Youth from our church participated in an athletic meet on January 30, 1994 at the USP-F sports grounds. The meet was a get-together to give participants with Tsinoy backgrounds from different churches to fraternize. Other events in 1994 included the celebration of the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary for the Young Professionals fellowship, with a Thanksgiving Service. The Children's Choir was revived in August, and joined our Church Choir in presenting a joint Christmas cantata on December 24.

**Deacon Peter Yap** was elected as Elder on October 15, 1995. He was ordained and began serving a week later, on October 22.

A 6-person delegation from a Christian Church in Fujian, China, visited our church on February 27, 1996.

They testified about their progress while operating under China's present government system, and rendered beautiful Amoy Christian hymns.

The 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Church was celebrated on March 22, 1996, with **Rev. Young Man Chan** invited as guest speaker during the Thanksgiving service. To celebrate the 80-year milestone, our Church implemented plans to branch out to Mandaue. At 3:00 PM on the same day, a groundbreaking ceremony was held in Mandaue City to construct a new building, which would be called the **Mandaue Gospel Center**.

Later that year on July 15, the Brothers' Fellowship held a thanksgiving service to celebrate its 40<sup>th</sup> year of continued existence.

In mid-November, **Rev. Chen Chang Cheng** arrived with his family from Kaohsiung, Taiwan, to serve as our Pastor.

August 16, 1998<sup>16</sup> marked a significant milestone in Philippine religious history. On this day a hundred years ago, American missionaries formally introduced Protestantism to the Philippines, with the major denominations agreeing among themselves to divide places of ministry to avoid overlap.<sup>17</sup> Cebu Gospel Church joined other Protestant churches in Cebu in the affair. A commemoration service was held at the Cebu Coliseum in the morning, followed by an agape lunch fellowship in the afternoon. A Thanksgiving worship service at the Cebu Sports Complex capped the day's activities.

On November 29, 1998, the CYF turned 50 years old. **Rev. Joe Mok** officiated its Thanksgiving worship service.

After two years of construction, the new Mandaue Gospel Center was finally completed in 1999. It was formally inaugurated on March 28 with a Thanksgiving worship service held on site.

A joint conference comprising Cebu's united Protestant churches kicked off on September 11, with a theme of evolving to keep up with the times.

## A NEW MILLENNIUM (2000-2012)

On May 7, 2000, Lim Kok An, also known as **Pastor Andy Pecson**, was appointed as a missionary and was assigned to serve in the youth ministry. He has recently returned to Cebu where he presently serves as the chaplain of Philippine Christian Gospel School, accompanied with his lovely wife **Pastor Gina** and two sons Ben Yael and Dan Yael.

Two fellowships celebrated significant anniversaries in 2001. On February 13, the Sisters' Fellowship held a Thanksgiving worship service to commemorate its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. On February 17, 2001, in celebration of its 20<sup>th</sup> year of existence, the Joybells evangelistic singing group held a special program entitled "The Reason We Sing."

On June 3, **Rev. Wee Un Hock** accepted the position of pastor for our Church, together with his family **Mrs. Jennifer Y. Wee** and their only son Macarios Josh. He has faithfully remained in Cebu, and is presently ministering to the Mandaue Gospel Church.

On July 20-21, 2002, "Heavenly Melody", a singing group from Taiwan, presented a musical concert at PCGS and CGC, respectively. The group's songs have since considerably influenced the modernization of our church's Chinese music.

Sister **Lili Gothong** and Elder Raymond Ong led a group of Church members to visit Bohol on May 24-25, 2003, in order to assist our Bohol missionary in spreading the Gospel.

On May 23, 2004, **Rev. Albert Ong**, with his beautiful wife Jenny Ong and two children Aaron Job and Amy Joy in tow, accepted the invitation to be one of our Pastors. Jenny, who was very gifted in music and possessed a lovely voice, became the conductress for the Chinese Church Choir, and directress of the Soul Searchers.

By this time, our affiliate school Philippine Christian Gospel School had become very dilapidated, with rotting buildings and neglected facilities brought about by the strike initiated by some English teachers sometime in the 1980s. A newlyreconstituted young and energetic board spearheaded plans to completely rehabilitate the once-proud school.

This started a period of repair and reconstruction, as well as the construction of new buildings, culminating with the completion of a new school building and celebrating the school's revitalization with a Thanksgiving service on September 25, 2004. The Lord led long-time missionary Dr. Wanda Po to rejoin the school as its director.

Later, on October 28, 2004, the Young Professionals fellowship celebrated its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

2005 heralded an evolution of our outreach ministry. On October 3-7, our members joined delegates from the **Bangor Baptist Church** from Maine (presently known as Crosspoint Church) in a joint endeavor called the "Jesus Loves You" (JLY) ministry. The Bangor Baptist Church delegation held a concert at the Grand Convention Center and visited PCGS. The group also joined Filipino doctor volunteers and nurses in conducting medical missions in Consolacion, Minglanilla, Dumanjug, and Toledo, Cebu.

2006 marked the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Church, which had the theme "Proclaim God's Enduring Faithfulness." The festivities began on January 5, with Sunday worship services commencing at the Mandaue Gospel Center, which is now rechristened the Mandaue Gospel Church.

On March 18, our very first Heritage Exhibit cum contest, which showcased our Church's 90-year history through pictures, video clips and display of old artifacts, was opened at the Board Room. Rev. Michael Tsang and **Elder Valentin Uy** opened the occasion by cutting the ribbon. PCGS won first prize for its display.

Rev. Michael Tsang and his lovely wife were our special guests for the day of the anniversary celebration on March 19. Rev. Tsang's message utilized the celebratory Psalm 100 as the theme verse. ## Did you know? Cebu Gospel Church has the oldest Sunday School department in the Philippines

Numerous activities were held during the year:

- The JLY Children's Ministry assisted in conducting the DVBS for the Cebu City Alliance Church on April 25.
- To celebrate CCOWE (Chinese Congress on World Evangelization) Sunday on April 30, **Rev.** Jeremiah Cheung from the Christian Bible Church of the Philippines conducted a 6-day Cross-Cultural Mission Exposure Training for ten of our young people.
- 3. The JLY Ministry, supported by the Mission Committee and some volunteers, held its first out-of-Cebu Medical Mission at Hilongos, Leyte on July 8, 2006.
- Our church sent a delegation of our pastors and 16 members to the 7<sup>th</sup> Chinese Congress on World Evangelization, held in Macau from July 17-21.

- 5. On August 5, the Mission Committee, through the JLY ministry, held a medical mission at PCGS.
- 6. Elder Peter Yap, representing the Mission Committee, visited the church mission in China on October 11-15.

On January 28, 2007, our Church held its first joint worship service with the Mandaue Gospel Center on Congregational Sunday. A joint child dedication ceremony was part of the program.

From March 19 to 23, Daily Vacation Bible School was held for the first time at the Philippine Christian Gospel School. The theme was "Star Quest", and targeted PCGS students as camp attendees.

On April 12, the Scripture Union of Singapore conducted a three-day Children's Ministry Conference for Sunday School teachers at the PCGS auditorium. Attendees included all our Sunday School teachers, as well as Sunday School teachers from other churches. The topic discussed

about 52 creative ideas to teach Bible stories to children.

On April 18, Dr. Wanda Po and Pastor Alice Huang traveled to Hangzhou, China, for a short-term tenday mission.

**Dr. Jeanne Caramoan** and **Rosaline Lim** accepted our invitation to join the pastoral team. Pastor Caramoan would later depart on a mission trip on April 9 to Vigan, accompanying four youth from our Church. The trip was conducted in cooperation with the youth of the Christian Bible Church of the Philippines.

On May 27, we welcomed the Rev. & Mrs. **Yu Bon Kim** with their son Nathan, who joined our Church.

On July 1, the GoodTV program, which was sponsored by our Church, started airing in SkyCable Cebu channel 74.

To support our missionary, **Pastor Jeffrey Ferrer**, the Mission Committee conducted a Medical & Evangelical Outreach in Sogod, Alegre on July 14. One week after, it conducted its first Children Medical and Deworming Outreach in Litmon, Talisay, with the cooperation of **Pastor Ric Garingo**. Two weeks after, the Second Children Medical and Deworming Outreach was conducted in Tagunol, Cebu with **Pastor Roel Cagalitan** of the CAMACOP.

On November 24, an outreach program in cooperation with Operation Mobilization (O.M.) for street children was held at Mandaue Gospel Church.

On February 7, 2008, the Membership Committee sponsored a Senior Citizens' Outing at Guba, Talamban.

16 young professionals from Cebu Gospel Church joined 11 counterparts from **Bethany Christian Church** shared their love to the residents of House of Hope by conducting an evangelistic meeting on Valentine's Day. **Lydale Chua** shared his testimony and message on the Prodigal Son, followed by a movie clip from "Awesome God."

On March 1, the Grand Alumni Homecoming capped off a weeklong celebration of the 60<sup>th</sup> Founders Day of PCGS. The festivities began with PCGS Sunday celebrated in Cebu Gospel Church on February 24, which was followed on an outreach program, Search for Mr. & Ms. PCGS 2008, Exhibits, and Fun & Food Booths in the school.

From March 31 to April 4, 24 delegates from our Church attended the 1st CBDTI Christian Youth Leadership Summit held in Leyte Park Resort Hotel, Tacloban City, which had the theme, "Be The Difference."

On May 31, the Church welcomed **Pastor Eric Chan** and his family (wife **Weenie** and daughters), **Pastor Angelo Gutierrez**, and **Pastor Keren Tan** to minister to our church. Soon thereafter, **Pastor Wayne Chua** also accepted our invitation and became one of our youth pastors.

By July, the old Sunday School building was completely infested with termites, and would shake dangerously when students ran across the corridors. This prompted the Church Council to renovate the entire structure, and put up a Sunday School lounge. This happened under the watch of **Jocelyn Po**, who was then the Sunday school principal. The Membership Committee conducted a Senior Citizens' Outing in Danao on September 14. Activities included blood pressure monitoring, games, exercises, Moon Cake Festival celebration, and a dinner courtesy of **Deacon Tiong Khing Ong**.

On October 15, the church welcomed **Pastor Charmaine Gutierrez** (the beautiful wife of Pastor Angelo) to our pastoral team. Did you know that both their children, Avi and Axl, were born in our church, and that Pastor Angelo is an engineer?

The CYF celebrated its 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary on November 29, boasting with an average roster of 20 elementary, 70 high school, and 20 college students who regularly attend the fellowship.

On March 14, 2009, the Church celebrated its 93<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary, by holding an Evangelistic Dinner at the more-spacious PCGS gym. Rev. Danny Reyes delivered a message entitled "The Hope in Life."

The April 12 service later that year was the first Joint 6 AM Sunrise Service to be conducted at Mandaue Gospel Church. A baptismal ceremony was held during the service.

On August 16, the Membership Committee conducted its first free executive panel check-up for members aged 45 years old and above.

On September 5, a baptismal ceremony was held at **Deacon Tony Yap**'s residence.

After over a year of renovation, the newly-renovated Sunday School building, comprising of new classrooms on the third floor and a new teacher's lounge, was inaugurated on Sunday School Sunday, which occured on September 27.

To commemorate their anniversary month, the High School and College CYF held an "Appreciation Night" for the janitors and guards on November 13.

A Special baptismal ceremony was held on December 1 for **Sister Au Chay Hong** at the auditorium during the Sisters' Fellowship. In view of her advanced age and physical condition, water was sprinkled on her head instead of total immersion.

To commemorate the 62<sup>nd</sup> founding anniversary of PCGS, the **Cebu Kian Kee Alumni Association** held its inaugural Golf Tournament Fellowship at the Cebu Country Club on February 16, 2010. The event was joined by 48 golf enthusiasts.

The Church's 94<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, celebrated on March 7, had **Dr. Joseph Shao** from the Biblical Seminary of the Philippines (BSOP) elaborate on the theme "In Christ Alone." The day prior, an evangelistic play entitled "No Greater Love" was performed at the Chancel Repertory Theatre in PCGS.

On April 6, a one-month Summer Mandarin Camp was conducted at Mandaue Gospel Center to teach our church members the language. This was followed by a special session about basic conversational Amoy held on May 16 by **Rev. Philip Ong** conducted a special session about basic conversational Amoy.

On September 24, the Christian Education Committee, in cooperation with the Biblical Seminary of the Philippines, held a two-day lecture and an inductive Bible Study with **Rev. Philip Co** as the instructor.

The Soul Searchers and the Youth Band, together with Rev. Wee Un Hock, conducted evangelistic musicals in Surigao Gospel Church on October 22 and 23.

On February 2, 2011, the Sisters' Fellowship celebrated its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with the theme "Shine for Christ."

Our Church's 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration kicked off with the first PCGS Family Fun Run, which was held on March 11. One day after, Rev. Philip Co spoke on the theme "Faithful God, Grateful Hearts!" during the 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary worship service.

On the evening of March 12, a Thanksgiving Dinner was held at the Grand Convention Center, with **Denzel Po** and **Cheryl Go** serving as the masters of ceremony. A renowned Beijing-based violinist, **Prof. Shang Quan**, serenaded the congregation.

On March 26, the Mission Committee conducted a medical mission with the Cebu City Alliance Church.

Six church leaders and ministers joined the 8<sup>th</sup> Chinese Congress on World Evangelization held in Bali, Indonesia from September 11 to 16.

Starting on November 4, Team Timothy from BSOP, which was spearheaded by **Dr. Rosa Shao** and **Dr. William Kirwan**, conducted a three-day seminar entitled "Couple Counselling: Becoming a Marriage Healer of your Church."

On February 16, 2012, the Young Professionals, in collaboration with Bethany Christian Church

and the Living Christian Church, conducted a Post-Valentine Special Fellowship on "Marriage". Gabriel Yap and Aileen T. Yap were invited as panelists.

A one-month Mandarin Summer Camp was held at Mandaue Gospel Center on April 1, with trainers who came all the way from China.

On April 8, Easter Sunday, an Sunday interactive musical play entitled "Raise the Crown" was presented at the Church. The moving play portrayed the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ with the audience actively participating.

## DISASTER AND AFTERMATH (2013-2015)

On May 1, 2013, around 205 members joined the Congregational Outing at the Tambuli Beach Resort. The activity had fun games, a short message by Dea. Jocelyn Po, and a sumptuous lunch. On Monday, October 15, 2013, at 8:12 in the morning, a Magnitude 7.2 earthquake struck Central Visayas, with the epicenter located in Bohol. Although it was a Monday, President Benigno Aquino had fortunately declared that day as a holiday for our Muslim brothers, who were celebrating their religious holiday Eid al-Adha.

A portion of our church sanctuary's rear ceiling cracked and fell; the huge cement block hit the pews at the left and back, splitting the thick narra pews in half. There was debris scattered all over!

The Sunday after, we could still feel the aftershocks during our Sunday service, but that did not deter our members from attending worship service. As always, love for our Lord and His love for us prevailed over fear. The back portion was cordoned off to avoid accidents.

The damage to buildings was so extensive, and the aftershocks so strong and frequent, that schools were suspended for about a month.

But the worst was yet to come.

On November 8, 2013, at ten in the morning—barely a month after the earthquake—Super Typhoon Yolanda (known internationally as Haiyan) struck the Philippines. It was the deadliest typhoon to hit the country in recorded history, The storm surges it caused in Tacloban City alone killed more than ten thousand people. The northern part of Cebu was badly damaged, and a state of calamity was declared.

The first request for help we received was from Pastor Jerry Yaokasin, who was then the vice mayor of Tacloban City. His message was simple, "We have lost everything." We could hardly believe this, because there was a total news blackout in Tacloban City. The damage was so severe that all communication lines, electricity supply, and water supply were cut off. There was widespread looting and criminality due to lack of food.

The Church responded immediately. We prepared relief goods and had them delivered by boat with the help of Deaconess Lili Gothong. Due to the immensity of the devastation, so many relief goods had to be prepared.

Other churches took up the call, and flocked to our church to help with packing the goods. Our sanctuary became a de-facto relief center, with people from different churches working together. Everyone was moved by their love for God, fellowmen and country. It was a tense moment since relief goods were urgently needed. In this disaster, we saw that Christians were truly one in the Lord.

In happier news, the Christian Youth Fellowship celebrated its 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary on November 29.

In mid-2014, both the Sunday School and Sunday worship service were temporarily transferred to PCGS in a homecoming of sorts. This move was done to allow for renovations, since our sanctuary suffered structural damage in the 2013 earthquake.

On July 24, 2014, Dr. Stephen Tong conducted another Evangelistic Crusade at the Cebu Coliseum. Again, our church actively participated in the event.

Our Congregational Sunday on January 18, 2015, which coincided with Mandaue Gospel Church's 9<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, was held at Grand Convention Center, due to the desire to avoid the noise and traffic wrought by Cebu's annual religious festival and mardi gras known as Sinulog. The invited speaker, **Dr. Gerardo Lisbe Jr.**, spoke about "Clinging to Orthodoxy and Orthopraxy."

We celebrated our Church's 99<sup>th</sup> Anniversary at the PCGS gymnasium on March 15, 2015, with **Rev. Stephen Tan** as the guest speaker. The congregation was challenged to pray for the

repair and reconstruction of our church sanctuary damaged in the 2013 earthquake. The renovation cost was pegged at more than ₱20-40 million. **Deacon Daniel Ong** oversaw the renovation committee, and **Architect Daniel Go** offered to do the design pro bono. Our prayers were answered.

The 50<sup>th</sup> Mission Emphasis Week kicked off from September 17-20, with **Rev. Vicente Sia** as speaker. His message, "A Heart for Mission" was based on Isaiah 52:7. An exhibit showing the different ministries of the mission groups supported by our Church was held at the PCGS gym.

After one year of holding Sunday worship service at the PCGS chapel, we finally returned to our newly-renovated sanctuary on November 8, 2015. **Rev. Daniel Wong** was speaker for this special day.

## THE CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

The **Literature Committee** kicked off the Centennial Celebration by sponsoring contests on Creative Art, Photography and Essay Writing, all of which had to use the Centennial theme "God's Grace". After a contest period of about six months, the winning entries were announced and awarded on Literature Sunday, November 15, 2015.

The newly-renovated sanctuary was rededicated on November 22, with Rev. Danny Reyes serving as the speaker. It was a solemn affair. On December 6, after a moratorium on baptismal ceremonies due to transfer of venue to PCGS, one was finally held at the sanctuary to welcome new members to our fold.

On December 11, an Interactive Evangelical play and mystery dinner called "Sabotage," held at the PCGS gym, officially kicked off the 100-day countdown to the Centennial Celebration.



#### 11<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of Mandaue Gospel Church

Rev. Vicente Sia, who was formerly the senior pastor of Jubilee Evangelical Church until his retirement in 2011, and was speaker in the previous year's Mission Emphasis week, formally accepted our invitation to minister to our Church in January 2016. His wife, Helen, officially joined our Church five months in June.

On January 17, during the Congregational Sunday held at the Grand Convention Center, the Centennial Church Theme was unveiled: GOD'S GRACE – 100 YEARS AND BEYOND. Its theme verse was taken from John 1:16, which states: "From the fullness of His grace we have all received one blessing after another." A survey for improvement and exploring the possibility of adding an English service was conducted, and our new Mission and Vision Statements were presented.

In February, the Sisters' Fellowship celebrated its 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary at the Grand Convention Restaurant, with no less that **Dr. Tan Chiu Eng** as special guest speaker.

The Second Heritage Exhibit, this time commemorating our Church Centennial, opened in the Church auditorium from March 13 to 27. Rev. Michael Tsang graced the ribbon-cutting ceremony, with church elders, members of the Heritage Committee, and **Deaconess Josephine Que Yu** (whose father's journal became the guide for the exhibit) in attendance.

On March 19, the penultimate day before our church turned 100 years old, the **100 Voices Centennial Choir** presented a cantata based on selected songs from the Don Moen album "God in Us", as well as the Hallelujah Chorus. Rev. Stephen Tan gave a short message before the musical extravaganza.

The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Worship Service was celebrated on March 20, with **Rev. James Hudson Taylor IV** giving a message on "Willing and Able" from 1 Chronicles 28:20-21. During the service, the Centennial Hymn "A Hundred Years More," which was composed by **Jovelyn Q. Yu** with English lyrics by **Stevenson Q. Yu** and Chinese lyrics by Josephine Q. Yu, was played by a live ensemble. It was such a touching hymn that when Elder Peter Yap and **Elizabeth Oh** sang it, many were brought to tears. Truly, how wonderful is God's amazing grace!

That night, at 6:00 PM, a Thanksgiving Dinner was celebrated at the Grand Convention Center, with special numbers presented by various groups and fellowships from our church. To serve as festive décor, Cheryl Go Chan prepared a very tall and beautiful centennial cake.

## TAKING STOCK

For a hundred years, Cebu Gospel Church has been a bulwark of Chinese Christianity in Cebu. For all these years, the Church Council, which consisted of elected elders and 24 deacons and deaconesses, also headed the different church committees. They act in accordance with the teachings of the Holy Bible and what is stated in the church Constitution and by-laws.

Our Church has fully grown in the span of a hundred years, and has even spread its roots nationally and internationally. She is not only blessed by the Lord, but had witnessed so many miracles performed in her ministry and congregations. She has produced astounding church workers, professionals, and members. She has different local and international ministries, social work, fellowships and services.

She has linkages to different Christian organizations, both locally and internationally, and had faithfully supported them. She is also blessed with assets to best serve her members. With all these, it is but fitting that her members should be well aware of what the Church is, what their roots are, and what God, through His Church, expects from them.

The lingua franca of the original Cebu Gospel Church is Chinese. While it is true that the Church was founded by American missionaries, necessitating that services are conducted in English, their purpose was to evangelize the Chinese. Since the congregation was predominantly Chinese and could not understand the English language very well, the services were then translated to Chinese.

When the congregation increased and the church could finally hire Chinese-speaking ministers and pastors, services were conducted in straight Chinese. Even the church bulletin was in Chinese, and was beautifully and painstakingly handwritten every week.<sup>18</sup> It was only on October 8, 1961 that the first English language service was conducted in our church. This was later merged with the Chinese service to make a single bilingual worship service.

Today, the language spoken in Church is a mixture of Chinese and English. The older members, who comprise about 75% of the population, speak Chinese while the younger generation that comprise the remainder speak a mixture of English and Chinese. They are popularly known as "EnRaWGen" since they are the English Reading and Writing Generation. They can speak Chinese, but cannot read Chinese characters because they can only read and write in English. This generation has come of age and is now taking over the church. I am one of them.

However, a new group has emerged, part of the generation called the "Millennials." This group is tech-savvy, and can understand Chinese but can no longer speak nor read in the language. Because of this, the Church had to adapt. In 2017, another English-only service will be conducted, which will mostly be attended by the growing young population of the church.

As we have seen from our history, the Church conducted the Learning Conversational Amoy seminar (by Rev. Philip Ong), while Mandaue Gospel Church hosted one whole month of Mandarin classes with teachers from China. However, these efforts seemed futile. English is now the dominant form of communication in the Church, with the youth growing in number.

The founders of Bethany Christian Church (the Holaysans) as well as the Living Christian Church (the Lees) were all former active members and leaders in Cebu Gospel Church. They are considered spiritual children of the Church, and it is always a joy to see their growth and cooperation in evangelizing the Chinese in Cebu.

Despite its very humble beginning, Cebu Gospel Church has grown in its ministries and evolved into a multifaceted church. Today, its ministries include that of its sister church, Surigao Gospel Church, which was formerly known as the Surigao Gospel Assembly Hall of the Cebu Gospel Church.

Other planted organizations include the Mandaue Gospel Church, which was formerly the Cebu Gospel Church Mandaue Gospel Center, and the affiliated school, the Philippine Christian Gospel School, formerly the Cebu Chinese Gospel High School, Kian Kee High School, and Cebu Christian School.

#### Past and Present

CGC's mission works have spread far and wide. The Church has missionaries scattered all over the archipelago. The present Jesus Loves You Ministry, which ordinarily conducts medical missions all over the Philippines, now has added responsibilities. In addition to feeding programs and the conduct of Daily Vacation Bible Schools, it takes charge of galvanizing immediate church response in case of calamity and disaster.

Cebu Gospel Church may seem like a small church compared to the present mega-churches, but her impact in the Chinese Christian Community is not to be trifled with. Her members may seem few, but the vastness of her heart and support to different Christian organizations, churches, and ministries are something only our great God can possibly do. For a hundred years, she stood firm on her Christian doctrines and principles, and her leaders had been vigilant vanguards of these.

Cebu Gospel Church continues to grow physically to meet the need of its growing membership and population. I thank the Lord for the hundred years of provision and guidance, and I pray for the next hundred years to come.

## Mandaue Gospel Church: 1990-2016

his year, our mother church, Cebu Gospel Church, celebrated her Centennial Thanksgiving. Amidst the joyous celebrations, it is fitting to reminisce the good things from the Lord, which came through the labors exerted by Cebu Gospel Church that brought about the birth of Mandaue Gospel Church, lest we forget the amazing grace of God.

With fear of God, and esteem for God's servants: the missionaries and co-workers who came and delivered our sincere appreciations. May God continue to bless them and their ministries.

Church planting has been a laborious wonder by God's grace. If God had not orchestrated it, then who could build? If God had not moved, where would be the laborers who built? Praise the Lord! God touched the hearts of Cebu Gospel Church!

And they came to Mandaue in the service of our Lord Jesus Christ. There are two stages: the ground work and the establishment of the church. In the following report, the phrase "our mother church" signifies Cebu Gospel Church.

#### 1990–2005: THE GROUND WORK – INTO GOD'S WORD, FOLLOWING CHRIST

We gradually got to know some of the businesspeople in Mandaue City. But it took more than just being able to strike up meaningful conversations with our friends in the business community. All too often, the feeling of weakness and spiritual inadequacies surfaced. Our spiritual bankruptcy prompted us to call to the Lord, nay, even to cry out to God. The Lord readily answered our cries, and took mercy in our frailties.

In November 1994, we joined a ministerial team led by Dr. Joseph Shao in a visi to Seoul, South Korea. We observed how the Korean Christians related with God. They worshipped with great reverence: their pastors were treated with respect and deference; all other Christians were as brothers and sisters in Christ.

One could see many lighted crosses at night; each cross stood for a church. They say that there is almost one church on each street. Their missions? Flourishing! They sent hundreds of their missionaries to different countries!

We also got to see how they pray. On weekdays, the Korean Christians would go to the mountains to pray very early in the morning. Chapels were built on top of these mountains, with some structures built like huge church cathedrals. Groups of Christians: three hundred, two hundred, sometimes less than a hundred, trooped to these "Prayer Mountains" to pray at 3:00 AM, 4:00 AM, and 5:00 AM. We can never forget what we saw: their fervent pursuit of God. Because of these, God showed them great things and used them mightily.

When we returned to Mandaue, we agreed to pray and keep morning watch together. Since we didn't have a place of our own, we borrowed a classroom from a nearby church-school. There, we prayed especially for Mandaue. The Lord answered prayers with miracles, and He did great things for us.

On March 24, 1996, the mother church held a ground-breaking ceremony in a vacant lot at Sudlon, Maguikay, Mandaue. In November of the same year, Rev. and Mrs. Chen Chang Cheng, who were missionaries from Taiwan, came to Cebu to serve the mother church and do pioneering work in Mandaue. They set up the office of Mandaue Gospel Center at #400 Sacris Extension, Tipolo, Mandaue, and held Mandarin classes.

The next year, our mother church started construction on the vacant lot. The new three-story building of Mandaue Gospel Center was completed and dedicated to the Lord on March 28, 1999. Glory to God!

We recalled the time when we borrowed a room to pray especially for Mandaue. One could not avoid smelling the earthy flavor during rainy season. But in the new center, we now have air-conditioned multi-function rooms, furnished with kneeling pads. Indeed, the work of the Lord is more than what we might ask or think. Praise the Lord.

The Lord said, "My house shall be called the house of prayer." Amen.

My colleague and Christian friend Joyce Uy reiterated to me, "You know, every time I pass by Mandaue Gospel Center and seeing it empty, I cry." So I invited her to do visitations with me, and that's how the first visitation team came to be.

Shortly after, our mother church seconded Deacon Hyman Yap to Mandaue to help oversee and encourage the church-planting ministry.

In 2003, there were a series of "firsts":

 January 8: first Wednesday night church prayer meeting

- January 12: first Sunday Bible Study Class at 3:00 PM, held fortnightly
- August 8: first day of Amoy Classes
- In mid-April 2005, Rev. and Mrs. Un Hock Wee joined the church-planting ministry.

- We had fifteen years to do ground work. Sometimes when workers were assigned to other functions, the work in Mandaue bogged down a bit. But through our Lord's mercy and protection we were able to continue. Praise the Lord.
- 2. Our teammates were in one accord from the very beginning. This means that we are tasked to bring the good news to certain people or group; many times, we were the first to attempt outreach. Our intent is to bring them to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ our Lord. Someone who has never been evangelized, has not heard the gospel of Jesus, nor had other Christians talk to them about Christ is a zero person. Let us continue to intentionally reach out to the "zeroes" for Christ.
- 3. As our mother church celebrates her centennial thanksgiving, so do we celebrate our tenth. She has supported and nurtured us all throughout, from ground work to establishment. The phrase "thank you" will not suffice. When a young church is growing into maturity, she will prepare herself to become independent, self-supporting, and self-propagating, thus becoming a healthy, complete, and beautiful church. Along with this, maintaining that brotherly love among member-parts of the Body of Christ is imperative. This is done all by God's grace, and only for His glory.

### 1990年一2005年: 植堂一謹守主道,讓主引導

植堂初期,我們想多接觸一些萬那威社區 的僑商,但在實際工作中,我們發現自己 的貧乏無能。我們向主虔誠地禱告、誠心 地認罪。回到萬那威以後,我們立志在禱 告上下工夫,從神支取力量。於是,我們 經常與教會肢體一起晨禱。

當時因為沒有屬於我們自己禱告的地方, 便藉用附近一所教會的課室,專為萬那威 的植堂事工禱告。

不久,奇妙的事發生了。1996年3月24日 母會在Sudlon, Maguikay, Mandaue一塊荒 野的地皮舉行破土典禮。同年11月,臺 灣宣教士陳長成牧師、邱麗美師母舉家 來母會協助帶領會務以及開拓萬那威植 堂事工。首先設立辦公處在 #400 Sacris Extension, Tipolo, Mandaue。

讚美主,祂為我們行了大事!

次年,母會開始在 Sudlon, Maguikay, Mandaue動工建堂。1999年3月28日, 三層樓的萬那威福音中心大廈工程完竣, 母會以謙卑莊重敬虔的心,把這棟巍峨的 萬那威福音中心奉獻給主。回想當時我們 借用的禱告課室,地面是泥土的,每逢雨 季就聞到一股土味。現在有新的福音中 心,有好幾間課室可用來作禱告的地方, 又有冷氣設備,還有好多個禱告用的跪墊 子。主說,「我的殿必稱為禱告的殿。」 阿們。主是多喜歡咱們禱告啊!

福音中心大廈已拔地而起,但裡面的人在 哪裡呢?肯服侍的人在哪裡呢?我的同工 和主內朋友黃翠詩姐曾兩次告訴我:「你 知道嗎,我每次經過萬那威福音中心,看 到裡面空空曠曠的就想哭…」真是道出了 我的心裏話。當時我受聖靈感動,邀請翠 詩姐一起出去探訪。這就是我們第一支的 探訪隊。母會也派遣葉俊傑執事關心植堂 事工。

# I AM A CHRISTIAN SAVED BY GRACE

What is Grace? Here are some of the definitions of grace, according to Merriam Webster's dictionary:

Unmerited divine assistance given to humans for their regeneration or sanctification.

A virtue coming from God.

I don't think it's as easy as it sounds. Growing up in a Christian Church, I hear the word "grace" a lot. I was taught that grace is something we don't deserve – unmerited favor. And I would ask, "What is that?"

Then my Sunday school teacher would explain to me that it's like a person made something that was undeserving, deserving. Having heard this all the time, it didn't really sink in for me at the time.

So, was that me? Someone undeserving? Of no value? Unworthy? How can that be? I have a family who loves me. I have slightly aboveaverage grades. I am active in extracurricular activities in school. I am a teacher's pet. I am even active in church! That does not sound like "of no value" to me!

In my head, I know that I am a sinner, and that Jesus Christ died for my sins. Et cetera. (Oh! Thank you, Lord!) I am a Christian. So could I be of no value? It didn't seem to connect. I didn't bother or care about what grace meant—until God struck me. After becoming a Christian, I continued to live my school life like I always did: wake up in the morning, eat breakfast, go to school, come home, study, and go to sleep.

"I am a Christian," so I thought. Read the Bible? Well, I would. Sometimes. That's when I have assignments in school or have an activity to do. I must read it, or else I'd fail in school or lose in the activity. And I don't like either of those two. I am an achiever. Failing or losing aren't acceptable options in my life.

Pray? Yes, I would pray. "Thank you Lord for this day. Thank you for the blessings that you have showered upon us. Please forgive us for our sins. Please guide us and help us in everything we do. In Jesus name we pray, Amen." The perfect everyday prayer. Or chant, it may as well be called.

Everything's fine. I have nothing to worry about in my life, aside from getting homework done and getting great grades in school. I do the things needed to be done. I read the Bible. I pray. "I definitely am a Christian," so I thought.

I am a perfect Christian! I seemed to be problemfree and happy. But deep down, I wasn't. I may be loved by my family, but I hated the fact that I lost my ever-loving father at a fairly tender age. Because of this, I gave myself the responsibility to become the man in the family (especially those times I lift heavy groceries with my mom) even when I didn't have to.

I hated the fact that I studied so hard without getting anything in return. Yes, I may have aboveaverage grades, but I couldn't even get into the Top Ten because I had other classmates who have grades beyond average!

And since I was teacher's pet, I became everyone's enemy. Nobody wanted to be friends with me. I tried to fit in with some groups, but couldn't. I tried childish ways to impress my classmates, such as showing off a cool-looking pink watch which was actually not functioning. But it didn't work. I was lonely. I was miserable. Are Christians miserable? "I am a Christian," so I thought. They must be.

One day, during my fifth grade in school, I couldn't take the misery and heaviness any longer. I turned to God. *Really* turned to God. Talked to Him as my God. I never treated Him as God before, but down in my heart I knew He was real. I'm not quite sure if it was because of all the head knowledge or the brainwashing from Sunday School, but I was quite confident that He existed. I knew He could hear me.

I told Him all my anger and unhappiness. I told Him I wanted to have friends. I told Him I wanted nice things. And I asked Him why I was treated as an outsider. After telling Him everything, I felt a little disappointed since I didn't hear any reply from Him. I didn't even end my prayer with an "Amen." But without noticing, I felt comfort and lightheartedness. I felt tons and tons way better. This, I believe, was my first real encounter with God. "I am a Christian... Am I?" I began to wonder.

With little maturity at the age of 12, I accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as the Savior in my life because I experienced comfort from God. I found myself no longer as miserable as before. He's saving me from hell, and at the same time, from my ill feelings of misery and loneliness.

I started to actually read the Bible. This time, I read even when I wasn't required to by anyone. I read because I was told that Christians must read the Bible and pray every day. To me, it felt like I was sinning if I don't read it. I didn't want that sin. "I am a Christian, a better one now," I thought.

Time passed. I am a freshman now. Then my teacher got me thinking when she mentioned death. And I feared it! I am a Christian. So why do I fear death? Aren't Christians supposed to be unafraid of death? I thought I was saved! Something is wrong.

That night, I was scared and shaking. "Lord, don't take me away yet. I am a Christian, but I'm not ready," I cried to God. In that moment, all the lessons I learned in Sunday School came back to me through a flash in my head.

I realized I really could die any minute. I realized I was a feeble object. I needed God to comfort me but God didn't need me. And then He reminded me of the very first Sunday School verse I memorized: John 3:16. "For God so loved the world, that He sent his only beloved Son, so whoever believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life." I may not be wanted by many, but He wanted me. He loves me. "I am not a Christian!" I declared.

This got me so perplexed. Something I can never grasp in my own understanding! He loves me! I am a bitter person who wasn't contented with what I have. How can He love me? Why does He choose to love me? How could I call myself a Christian? And then a tiny voice in my head said, "This is MY grace."

What is grace? More importantly, what is God's grace? You've probably heard about it, but let me tell you a short story.

When I was in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, all I ever cared about was myself. All that ever mattered was me, myself and I. I would constantly tell myself that I didn't need anyone or anything. Every day I would face the mirror and tell myself that "I'm awesome!" because I was feared and despised by my classmates. Because I had a cool group of friends. Because I cheated in my exams.

And since I had that rebellious attitude, I could say words that would put sailors to shame and I could do whatever I wanted – I was cool. It seemed like I was the center of the universe. But deep down inside, I was unhappy.

At the end of my 6<sup>th</sup> grade, my school held its annual retreat for students like me. I attended, not knowing that everything will change after that. So when I heard about God and His grace, I felt unworthy instead of feeling awesome as I usually do.

Then the speaker shared to us about how God longs for us to draw near to Him, and that no matter what we did in the past, it will be forgiven if we just accept God and repent.

But who was I? Who was I to even dare draw near to Him? I was just a gust of wind that would pass and fade forever. I was nothing but a vain sinner and a wretched soul. I had made a name for myself, but did it even matter? I lived my life trying my best to be cool, but was I happy? These questions were what made me start to seek answers.

At the retreat's conclusion, the speaker told us that we only had one life to live, and he encouraged us to live it for God. And there, in that moment, I cried out to God. I asked for His forgiveness. I was terribly wrong about who I was and how I lived. I tried to feel good about myself, but it was just an endless cycle of swearing, cursing and failing. I told God that I was done with how I lived, and that I wanted to change.

I wanted God to use me. Just as Paul encouraged "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is his good, pleasing and perfect will." (Romans 12:1-2, NIV) And I did so.

One by one, I let go of my past doings. I stopped saying foul words. I dropped the rebellious attitude. I stopped cheating in the exams, and many more. This is the state of God's grace. I am free from my guilt and shame. In the following year, I became a 7<sup>th</sup> grade student, the first thing I did was apologize to my classmates who I hurt previously. To my surprise, the classmates who once feared and despised me voted for me as class president. And I won! I knew immediately that it was thanks to God's grace.

As that school year went on, more and more of my classmates acknowledged my transformation and even told me how surprised they are. One even said that I changed 180 degrees. In my head, there were only two words: God's grace.

I have received so many endless gifts from God, such as a new day in my life, my friends, my family, my church and even a simple breath. But the best of all is God's love. God loves me. No matter how many times I unknowingly hurt Him by sinning, He loves me.

Above all else, God chose me and He loves me. I didn't feel awesome or unworthy, but instead felt free... and loved. It is so amazing to know that the one who knows everything about me all my thoughts and my flaws—would love me so much He died for me. I always thank God every day for all those.

At the end of my 7<sup>th</sup> grade school year, a teacher called my attention to tell me that I was an honor student. Never in my entire life was I ever an honor student; it was my first time to become one that year. I was astounded. How did that happen? One thing for sure, it wasn't my doing.

Just as Paul said in the verse I shared earlier, "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me." (1 Corinthians 15:10, ESV)

Indeed, it wasn't me, it was God. And so, when I received my very first medal, I had this huge grin on my face. I was silently praying, thanking God for being so good to me. I kept thanking God for His countless gifts, because He poured out grace upon grace.

Sometimes, just like me in my 6<sup>th</sup> grade, we may feel that we don't need God, or possibly that we ourselves are gods. These thoughts will just lead to the road of ruin. Instead, I want to encourage you to look at the cross. The cross was where Jesus spilled his blood and died for us. And the cross is where compassion, love and forgiveness overflow. And all these three remind us of what God's grace truly is.



In the end, just like me, one can expect the unexpected. I never expected myself to be renewed like that. I never expected my classmates to commend me after all the times I insulted them. And I never expected to become an honor student after choosing not to cheat anymore!

God can give you peace, contentment, love, joy and much more than you can ask for, just as long as you accept His gift—His grace. When you do, you can watch God's plan unfold before your eyes, and see God's glory for yourself.

So back to my first question, what is grace?

According to Paul, he said that "God, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:5-8, ESV)

## THE WONDERFUL MATCHLESS GRACE OF GOD

A few months after my marriage, I was diagnosed with endometriosis and myoma in my uterus. The myoma had to be removed and biopsied. Stricken with fear and worry, many questions came into my mind: "Will I survive myomectomy surgery? What will be the result of the biopsy? Can I still conceive?"

Prior to the operation, I instructed my surgeon not to remove my uterus. The operation was successful, and the myoma was benign. However, the surgeon said: "There were lots of tiny cysts in your myometrium which were very difficult to remove, so I just had it punctured. If I were to decide, I would have the uterus removed entirely, because there is a possibility of regrowth and complications may occur in the future."

A year after my operation, I underwent a hysterosalpingogram (an X-ray test to look into the inside of the uterus and fallopian tubes). The findings revealed that one of my fallopian tubes was totally closed, while the other one was half-closed. I asked the doctor to take out the blockage.

He said, "Fallopian tubes are very tiny and delicate. Stitches from tube operation may form keloid scars and completely block the passage. Besides, the endometriosis in your uterus and ovaries causes infertility and has no cure. Only a miracle can make you conceive." Instead, he advised me to consider adoption. Shame, guilt and hopelessness filled me, and I was engulfed with self-pity. Depressed and dismayed, I developed an inferiority complex and withdrew from associating with people so I could avoid questions such as: "When are you going to have a child?" or "How many children do you have?" or "Why so long?" or "Who is defective?"

These questions may be asked out of concern, but they hurt me terribly. Hearing them reopened my wounds of pain, grief, stress, and frustration, and reminded me of my barren state.

After six agonizing years of treatment and waiting, I remained childless. My faith began to dwindle. I made several attempts to adopt, but God closed all the doors.

My father continually prayed for me. My mother supported me with God's words of comfort that "Nothing is impossible for Him." (Luke 1:37) She was confident that she could live to see her children's children. (Psalms 128:6)

Together with her prayer partner, Pastor Juanita Go (吳碧英傳道), they prayed for me unceasingly. Truly, "the prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective," (James 5:16) because "He hears the prayer of the righteous." (Prov. 15:29)

In October 1980, my husband and I took a vacation in Taiwan. Our tour group passed through a street called "Pregnant Road" and proceeded to a famous Buddhist temple.

The walls surrounding the temple were engraved with names and dates as evidence of couples who asked and were given a child. As I reached the door of the temple, I was tempted to enter. Many urged me to take this rare opportunity to petition the god inside.

There I stood, a Sunday School teacher; someone who taught my students to have no other gods, to trust in Him, and to believe in His almighty power. What came into my mind was the story of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who refused to bow down before the golden image of Nebuchadnezzar.

I still remembered the verses I asked my students to memorize in Daniel 3:17-18: "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if He does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

With those two striking verses in mind, I stepped back and walked outside. I cried and prayed: "Lord, you know I need a child. You are more powerful than any other gods. You can give me a child because nothing is impossible for You. But, even if You don't, I will not bow down before that god." After my prayer, there was perfect peace in my heart.

When we returned from Taiwan, I missed my menstrual period for the first time. I told my mom, and she was so elated saying "Hallelujah, God had heard my prayer because He opened your womb!" But I could hardly believe it to be true. So, I made a wager with my mom for ₱100.

A few weeks later, the pregnancy test was positive. Although I lost ₱100, my joy, comfort and relief were beyond description. And I was extremely thankful to God for giving me the wisdom to keep my uterus intact.

During the second month of pregnancy, my gynecologist felt the presence of myomas in my uterus. He warned me that these may grow and cause a miscarriage. That news shocked me with a mixed feeling of disappointment and anxiety. However, I trusted in God and believed in His unfailing promise. So, I prayed fervently with hope. Miraculously, the myomas did not grow.



"God had answered my prayer: 'Call to Me and I will answer you, and I will tell you great and mighty things, which you do not know.'" (Jeremiah 33:3) One day, while on our way to work, a man riding a bicycle carrying a basket of bread suddenly took a U-turn. Unable to stop our vehicle immediately, we hit the bicycle head-on.

The rider was knocked away to the other side of the road, his bicycle cut into half and all the bread scattered on the roadside. I was seven months pregnant at that time.

Praise God, because I was able to hold tight to the vehicle I was riding so the baby was unhurt despite of the g-force experienced during the sudden deceleration.

When we finally stopped, the person stood up, completely unhurt, and started to pick up his bread. The only damage was to his bicycle and bread, which we gladly compensated him for.

God's grace was indeed amazing! He saved that man's life, protected my baby, and freed us from serious injury and damages.

During a pre-natal examination, Dr. Jesus Fran discovered that the baby was in a breech (feet-first) position. He returned it to the proper position, but the breech kept re-occuring. As my pregnancy progressed, it was no longer safe to reverse the position.

At 8:00 AM on July 28, I checked into Cebu Doctor's Hospital. Prior to delivery, I told Dr. Fran that I preferred a normal delivery. He promised only to operate if it became necessary, or if the survival of the baby was at risk.

He had me X-rayed to check the position of the baby and determine if my pelvic bone was capable of opening up. The results showed a slight tilt of the baby's head towards the left, so Dr. Fran arranged to put me in the operating room instead of the delivery room.

Throughout the day, I tried to deliver, but all my strength was exhausted with little improvement. At 6:00 PM, he induced labor and told me if the baby didn't come out within 15 minutes, he would perform a Caesarian section because the baby might be in danger.

Upon hearing that, I remembered Samson's prayer in Judges 16:28, asking for strength:

"Sovereign Lord, remember me. Please, God, strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get revenge on the Philistines for my two eyes." So I prayed: "Oh God, please strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get the baby out."

After the prayer, I grabbed the hand of my gynecologist on my right, and the anesthesiologist's hand at my left, and pushed with all my might.

Both doctors were caught unaware when I suddenly pulled their hands, and they almost fell to the ground. Thank God, Dr. Fran stayed alert and shouted to the nurses at the end of my feet, "CATCH THE BABY!" Luckily, they were able to catch the baby ON TIME.

As I look back, the day of my delivery, July 28, 1981, was exactly nine months from October 1980. Was it a coincidence? Of course not! I believe God answered my prayer on the day when I stood firm and held fast on my faith in Him.

Dear brethren, do you have an unanswered prayer? Do not lose hope. Our God is a great God! Everything is possible for Him. His answer could either be "Yes," "No," or "Wait."

If His answer is "Yes," thank God (Matthew 7:7).

If "No," remember that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love him. (Rom. 8:28)

For me, the answer was "Wait." I waited for seven long years in His time, because "With the Lord, a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day." (2 Peter 3:8)

God had answered my prayer: "Call to Me and I will answer you, and I will tell you great and mighty things, which you do not know." (Jeremiah 33:3) His blessings to me were beyond measure. Not only did He give me a son, He also gave me a daughter.

The recurring myomas were finally removed through hysterectomy in December 1990. I thank Him for His love, mercy, faithfulness, goodness, and kindness. Above all, I will fulfill my vow to proclaim His wondrous miracle and matchless grace in my life.
