我們要靠主站穩的時候,總會 面臨許多事情讓我們的信心動 搖不定。

導致我們信心搖動的常常是別人的成見。 而別人的成見通常是出於他們的背景、 環境以及屬靈的程度而產生的。因此, 一旦我們的行事為人或生活方式與他們不 一樣的時候,他們的成見就表露出來。 再者我們工作的壓力以及惡劣的環境也是 使我們站不穩的因素。當我們的工作出 現力不從心的狀態時,便會產生疲憊、 軟弱、束手無策的情緒。這時,惡魔便 趁虛而入,攪擾我們的信心,在屬靈的 爭戰中,我們往往站立不住。

感謝主!我們必當靠主站穩。M.R. Dehann曾說:「當別人散佈謠言毀謗 你時,記得最重要的不是人怎麼說你, 乃是天父怎麼看你。」

我們要靠主站穩,應該要注意下列幾個 原則:

第一:我們要真正認識我們的神

- 祂的屬性-祂是信實、是剛強的,祂 會拯救幫助我們。詩人說:「神是 我們的避難所,是我們的力量, 是我們在患難中隨時的幫助。」 (詩篇46:1)
- 祂的應許一祂的話語是可靠的, 神所應許的祂必成就。民數記
 23:19說:「神非人,必不至說
 流,非人子,必不至後悔。祂說話
 豈不照著行呢,祂發言豈不要成
 就呢。」大衛王做牧人時經歷過
 「我雖然行過死蔭的幽穀,也不怕
 遭害.因為你與我同在,你的仗,你的竿,都安慰我。」(詩篇
 23:4)五年前,筆者曾在 Cardinal
 Santos 醫院接受 Prostate Robotic
 手術,親身經歷了上帝的同在, 祂的大能、信實、慈愛賜與我出
 人意外的平安。感謝主!

第二:我們要真正成為神的兒女

約翰福音1:12說:「凡接待祂的,就是 信祂名的人,祂就賜他們權柄做神的 兒女。」哥林多後書5:17也說:「若有 人在基督裡他就是新造的人,舊事已過, 都變成新的了。」

我們得了基督復活的生命後,就要把 自己奉獻給主做活祭,他就心意更新而 變化。羅馬書12:1-2說:「所以弟兄們, 我以神的慈悲勸你們,將身體獻上,當 作活祭,是聖潔的,是神所喜悅的。你們 如此奉獻,乃是理所當然的。不要效法 這個世界,只要心意更新而變化,叫你們 察驗何為神的善良,可喜悅的旨意。」

我們有新的身份-神的兒子,又奉獻自 己給主做活祭,他就不會倚靠自己,因 為他離了主,他不能做甚麼了!「因為 離了我,你們就不能做甚麼。」(約翰 福音15:5b)

<u> 第三:主是我們在患難中隨時的幫助</u>

舊約但以理的三位朋友寧可違背尼布 甲尼撒王的傳令也要堅守真道-每次聽見 各樣樂器的聲音,就當俯伏敬拜王所立 的金像,凡不俯伏敬拜的,必立時扔在 烈火的窯中。(但以理書3:6-7)當沙 得拉、米煞、亞伯尼歌被告時,王問他 們:「有何神能救你們脫離我手呢?」 他們對王說:「尼布甲尼撒阿,這件事 我們不必回答你。即便如此,我們所事奉 的神,能將我們從烈火的窯中救出來。 王啊,祂也必救我們脫離你的手。即或 不然,王啊,你當知道我們決不事奉你 的神,也不敬拜你所立的金像。」 (但以理書3:16-18)

但以理的三位朋友靠主站穩,主在患難中 使他們得到隨時的幫助。這也是歷世歷代 許多信徒的經歷!他們有信心倚靠主, 又加上了愛主的心。他們異口同聲說出 保羅在羅馬書8:37-39的得勝頌詞—「然 而靠著愛我們的主,在這一切的事上, 已經得勝有餘了。因為我深信無論是死, 是生,是天使,是掌權的,是有能的, 是現在的事,是將來的事,是高處的, 是低處的,是別的受造之物,都不能叫 我們與神的愛隔絕.這愛是在我們的主 基督耶穌裏的。」

<u> 第四:我們不能讓事工使我們搖動</u>

哥林多前書15:58是我們事奉主應該有的 態度與心志—「所以我親愛的弟兄們, 你們務要堅固,不可搖動,常常竭力 多作主工,因為知道你們的勞苦,在主 裏面不是徒然的。」

親愛的同工們,我們受了培訓,成為主的 門徒,我們在主所託付的教會事奉祂的 時候,應該以保羅勸勉以弗所教會要達到 「滿有基督長成的身量」為目標。 聖經說:「為要成全聖徒,各盡其職, 建立基督的身體。直等到我們眾人在真道 上同歸於一,認識神的兒子,得以長大成 人,滿有基督長成的身量。使我們不再作 小孩子,中了人的詭計,和欺騙的法術, 被一切異教之風搖動,飄來飄去,就隨從 各樣的異端。唯用愛心說誠實話,凡事 長進,連於元首基督。全身都靠祂絡得 合適,百節各按各職,照著各體的功用, 彼此相助,便叫身體漸漸增長,在愛中 建立自己。」(以弗所書4:12-16)

總之,我們靠主站穩不是用自己的力量、 才幹、背景、學問等等,乃是完全靠著 主的大能,就是祂復活的能力站穩。主的 話有三方面的應許以及實踐的果效:

一:祂的權柄一使我們能完成大使 命一「所以你們要去,使萬民作我的 門徒,奉父子聖靈的名,給他們受 洗。凡我所吩咐你們的,都教訓他們 遵守,我就常與你們同在,直到世界 的末了。」(馬太福音28:19-20)

二:祂的聖靈—使我們能為祂做見証 —「但聖靈降臨在你們身上,你們就 必得著能力。並要在耶路撒冷、猶太 全地,和撒瑪利亞,直到地極,作我 的見證。」(使徒行傳1:8)

三:祂的秘訣—使我們能凡事都能 知足—「我並不是因缺乏說這話,我 無論在甚麼景況,都可以知足,這是 我已經學會了。我知道怎樣處卑賤, 怎樣處豐富,或飽足,或饑餓, 或有餘,或缺乏,隨事隨在,我都 得了祕訣。我靠著那加給我力量的, 凡事都能作。」(腓立比書4:11-13)

PALAWAN NASSION TRIP TESTIBATION

MY PALAWAN EXPERIENCE

n every adventure, there is a story to tell and this is the story I want to tell. The Palawan mission trip that was planned way back 2017 during CGC Missions Week sparked the interest of us young professionals to go and experience the work that God has placed in the lives of these missionaries.

Meeting with the missionaries supported by CGC from all around the Philippines allowed me to get a glimpse of what it is like to go through difficulties and joy in serving the Lord, spreading the good news outside the walls of our comfort zones, and showing the love they have for the Lord and for the people who have not heard the good news. During the said week, the missionaries shared their experiences both bitter and sweet, and how God's love, grace, presence, protection and provision kept them going to accomplish and finish what God has set before them. They admitted that it was not easy, but they would obediently continue to follow the command of the Lord no matter how difficult it was.

They experienced physical pains and ailments, emotional struggles of those difficult times, financial uncertainties that came with the work, and the cultural and language barriers that they had to face. Ma'am Levy Lim, wife of Pastor Philip of Ethnos Tribal School, had to position herself on top of their kitchen with her mobile phone on loudspeaker upside-down just to have reception and communicate with us.



The testimonies they shared may sound like a walk in the park now for them, but have become reality and eye openers to us. Who would have known that it would be a testimony we would be living ourselves.

Preparing for the trip was a difficult one. It was easy to say "Let's go," but a different story to be actually ready for it. Through God's grace and intervention, the willingness of so many volunteers in the Young Professionals Fellowship, and the huge support of CGC's Mission Committee, and prayers of many members and other churches in Palawan, God's plan prevailed.

One of the problems we encountered during the preparation was communication. It was difficult since there was limited signal in the tribal areas the missionaries were stationed at. Another problem was how to go about with the preparation and planning of the itinerary since our days were limited and our immersion within the tribes was short.

The physical preparations for the long hike which was expected of us to accomplish during the travel was also something to think about. Financial support was also a huge consideration. The availability of willing people to go to the field was something to consider since they would have to take leaves from busy schedules and work.

The biggest problem that we were reminded of was the spiritual warfare and preparation that we had to face and take into full consideration. Since this is God's plan and will, God's enemy would take interest to foil and destroy it. By God's grace, providence, and provision, His plan was accomplished in His name, in His time, and in His way. The itinerary kept changing even on the day of our trip and during the trip. It was made possible through meet ups and the involvement of many members.

Communication with missionaries was essential and extremely necessary to give us full detail of what needed to be done and needed to be prepared for the trip. We made a Messenger group for the missionaries to relay to give us instructions, encouragement and spiritual preparations for ready hearts as we embarked on this journey.

God has also made vacant many schedules of the Young Professionals, and He prevented any hindrances from causing any of our schedules to be cancelled. Physical preparations for the trip by way of jogging at Abellana readied us for the long hikes. Church members in different fellowships, friends from different churches, and pastors also prayed for this trip.

My experience at the two tribes in Palawan was absolutely worth the travel. It was an immersion that made me realize the beauty of going back to basics and experience the sureness of God's existence and presence in every little thing from the scenery I have seen, to the tribesmen and tribeswomen who praise and worship the God who has saved them from a previous life of false gods and beliefs.

The influence of Christ in the lives of the people in the tribes was clearly shown in how they responded with joy as we sang praise songs, and how they listened to God's love shared by the missionaries. The influence of Christ's love and the truth of His death and resurrection on the cross changed the old habits and beliefs of the people in the two tribes and thus they themselves saw the fruits of their faith in Christ by the slow but obvious progress in their communities.

One particular part of the tribe I loved was the children that brought me so much joy. The smiles on their faces and the feeling of welcome they shared to me was so true and sincere that it showed me how Christ has made an impact in their lives. The praise songs we sang together showed how Christ brings them joy. Seeing them go to Sunday school also made me realize that even if they may have few materials and limited spaces, it did not stop them from worshipping God.

The children in the tribe invited us to play and chat and tour around their community. Swimming with the children in the river was also a way for us to bond with the kids and play with them. It was also a way for us to teach them hygiene and how we have to take care of our bodies, because it is not our own.

Getting to the Batak tribe was not simple, but took a leap of faith. Having to walk through rocky terrain and crossing 16-32 rivers under the heat of the sun was not easy. Blisters, bites, sunburns, and cuts, through both rainy and sunny weather, never-before seen foods and water with a metallic taste, were a few things we personally experienced.

Food ranged from the available products in the market to the freely-available vegetables and resources God provides from nature—from honey and grass ferns to grown crops that were planted and cultivated by the missionaries. Drinking water was available and ranged from filters, rivers, and wells to water bought in stores. Long car rides were also tiring but were a blessing to us since we needed to go to far places.

The experience in riding a carabao also brought us so much excitement that it was a rollercoaster ride in the outskirts of Palawan. It was an experience both uncomfortable and yet comfortable.

We got to stay at the tribes and homes of the missionaries. We slept under the protection of mosquito nets and bug repellents. The comfort of electric fans and air-conditioning units was not available; we had to fan ourselves a lot in the humid and hot weather.

Never getting hungry is something I was thankful for. We had good meals, and food was always personally prepared. There was always someone to talk to, and the hospitality they shared was a blessing; the fellowships we had truly personal and true. We shared a lot of laughter and experiences, and it was God's time well spent.

Meeting other missionaries and missionaries-intraining showed us their love for the Lord, and their determination for the word of God to reach many people as soon as possible. Their willingness to go through so many discomforts and struggles made me realize the extent of their obedience in the Lord for the knowledge of Christ and salvation to reach so many people. The calling that was given to them, they said "yes" to the calling, and sacrificed so much for the cross. It makes what I do at home and at church seem so little.

I am truly blessed and thankful to these missionaries and ultimately to God for showing me a glimpse of a life not shackled in the comforts of these temporal world, but the eternal investment in Christ as He calls us to His real home.

They live a life for Christ, and sought to please and glorify Christ – an example I should follow. They opened my eyes to living a life in the name of Christ and desiring to have others live one as well. We are to make disciples of all nations, so why not start in our own nation?

In Matthew 28:19-20 Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

It indeed is a command and a calling, not just for missionaries, missionaries-to-be or pastors, but for all of us. It is a calling for us to obey the command and this is the realization I had. I make excuses but ultimately it boils down to me obeying and saying "yes."

I always thought full-time means having to sacrifice everything, but it really isn't; it's taking part in the work that Christ has purposely left for us to accomplish and fulfill. Making disciples at home, church and work is what I can do.

I have no reason to say "no." I have come to see the lives of a few who are willing to go out to the field, and some may see the fruits of the labor as slow, but I see the persistence in their love and obedience to the calling of the Lord even though they know it may take them years, it is evident that God will see them through the promise He will keep.

It was indeed a short and long wonderful trip in Palawan. It was a blessing to see joyful smiles in many faces as they worship Christ. There was beauty in the struggles shared. The fulfilling joy in sharing not just financially but also my time and presence as well is priceless. The grace of God in all these made it all the more bearable and sweeter in every single moment that I went through.

A LIVING SACRIFICE

I always feel happy and light-hearted when I sing or listen to worship songs. There's just a special feeling right after expressing myself through music and lyric, and praising the Lord for His love. Right before the trip to Palawan, I have learned the word LIVING SACRIFICE in the Bible.

Romans 12:1 (ESV)

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

In short, there is a different kind of worship other than singing and attending Sunday Service: the true and proper one. Never have I imagined that God will use our mission to Palawan to explain and instill in me the power of the verse.

The journey was as much as physical as it is spiritual. Five hours of trekking during the hot May summer, crossing rivers 32 times with only the sound of our footsteps as company. I could only think of the fatigue, the thirst, the ache on my foot, and heaviness of the bag on my back. Yet I discovered that when your body tries to tell you to stop, something tells you to take another step towards your destination.

It was then that I remembered the 40% Rule: the Navy SEALs' secret to mental toughness. It states that when your body has reached its limit, that known limit is only 40%. You haven't really used up the rest of the 60%.



Thus, I wonder, where does the rest of the 60% come from?

I searched inside myself and asked this question: what keeps me going in this situation? As I continued the trek thinking that I have reached my limit, a slow realization dawned on me. I CAN PUSH THROUGH BECAUSE I KNOW MY PURPOSE.

I realized it was that voice that kept telling me to continue until I complete the journey. Right then, I concluded that reaching your physical limits can make you focus on mental strength. And perhaps, I thought to myself, in this journey the spiritual is being tapped as well when I drew strength from these verses: "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you." Isaiah 43:2 (ESV)

What we experienced was just a hint of a taste of a missionary's life. It was a small portion, but it tasted bittersweet. We were out of our comfort zones, literally having to let go of the familiar set-up of city life and all it entails. We were visitors meant to share and teach, but the journey turned out to be a meaningful lesson for us instead.

I can truly see why mission work is a transformative one that entails drawing on spiritual reserves to overcome any challenges. And of course, the heart of that abundant reserve is God Himself who graciously supplies the 60% and beyond.

Missionaries will often tell us of the lives they've touched. But they can never fully describe the exceptional feeling of being able to do the will of God in the most critical of tribulations. You really have to become a missionary to fully experience it. Their lives are indeed the perfect example of living sacrifices, who worship the Lord through the work of their hands, through the strong faith they build and hold on to each day. The most beautiful thing I discovered during the trip was that each day transforms itself into a blessing. Be it the basic provisions or the realization of plans, everything is dependent on God's grace. We were well fed, well-sheltered, and thoroughly made to feel the simplicity of living in order to ultimately experience what it means to do mission work in a far-away place.

The experience helped me appreciate the simple things in life. Everything just becomes short of a miracle when you look at it. The cool rainy nights, the soothing currents of the river, the stories shared during the abundant healthy dinner, the laughter of small children, the warm eyes and smiles as we started conversations: all of it are intangible yet lasting. Even the struggle of speaking a common language becomes a worthwhile task as we focus on God's Word and His ministry.

Most of all, I truly admire the attitude of missionaries like Pastor Jo and Pastor Philip who graciously hosted us during this trip. They really have a different kind of faith compared to others since theirs is continually put to the test. They have to depend on God in practically everything.

Just imagine trusting God to lead you to a foreign land to make a difference in the lives of people who do not speak the same language and grew up in a different culture. I cannot imagine myself in this situation; yet, these wonderful people and missionaries did it. They took on the challenge because they knew what God whispered in their hearts. It's complete abandon to everything they've ever known because they know their reward at the end of the journey.

The ultimate goal is to realize God's greatest commandments: loving the Lord with all your strength, heart, and soul, and loving your neighbors as you love yourself. Both are beautifully realized in the mission work: loving God is obeying Him and loving your neighbors equates to sharing the good news of Salvation to the unbelievers.

The latter is also strongly connected to the Great Commission entrusted to us. The living sacrifice that the missionaries are exemplifying are definitely proof that God's love sustains whoever, whenever, wherever.

After this fulfilling journey, the dominant feeling I felt was humility. How can I humble myself in order to prioritize God in my life? Am I willing to permanently live out of my comfort zone to obey Him?

Well the rest is up to me, I guess. I encountered Jesus in this trip and He challenged me to be a living sacrifice.

MY TESTIMONY

t all started as a plan back in December 2017 when Pastor Philip Lim shared to us about the trials and joys of being in a mission. The planning began like a spark in the forest.

Slowly but surely it made impact. The mission trip to Palawan tribal communities was just a plan that God made possible. During the planning of the mission trip, I was adopted by nine Young Professionals to go with them as the youngest member of the team.

Last May 18 – 22, 2018, together we embarked on a challenge to visit some tribes of missionaries that our church is supporting in Palawan. The first tribe the team visited was the Batak Tribe in which the team had to hike for more than 4 hours and through over 16 rivers.

The second tribe the team visited was the Tagbanua Tribe, specifically the Maringits. We shared to them our knowledge on how taking care of our bodies through proper hygiene can glorify God because our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit. The team was able to give out hygiene kits and some other goods as well.

During the trip I was able to experience a "tip of the iceberg" of what the missionaries go through when the leave their safe zone, otherwise known as their comfort zone. Imagine, the missionaries have to start from scratch building their own places to stay and purchasing the land they want to stay in.

Hearing their testimonies from the time they arrived Palawan until the present, I was really amazed at how God really provides for them. Due to this, I have learned to trust God's sovereignty more. I was able to witness the creation of God in Palawan and it reminded me of the verse in Psalm 19:

- ¹ The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands.
- ² Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.

Not to mention that while we were hiking, the team had to deal with blisters and wounds in our feet, while not knowing how close or far we are from all destinations. There, God reminded me about perseverance and to endure the temporary pain so that we may reach the goal.

Another thing I learned is that God can and will use anyone he chooses. The team was composed of five nurses, a chemical engineer, a businesswoman, a nutritionist, someone who speaks Tagalog very well, and then there's me.

I consider myself not very adequate for the mission trip because for one, I do not speak Tagalog very well. I know the basics but not enough. I have not graduated college; thus I have no degree and am not officially part of Young Pro.

Yet God included me to be part of a team that was very passionate about this mission trip. Because of that, I was reminded of the following three verses in the Bible.

Isaiah 6:8 (NIV)

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

Isaiah 52:7 (NIV)

How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"

Romans 10:15 (NIV)

And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

ear reader, I know what you might be thinking. Business lessons? From the book of Proverbs?! Come on, what can writings from almost

3,000 years ago possibly teach us about business?

Yes, King Solomon is very wise, but he was writing as the king of Israel. Surely he did not have business in mind when putting down his wisdom in writing? You might be surprised at how applicable Solomon's wisdom can be, even in a different situation and during another time period. Businesses today still apply what Sun Tzu taught 2,500 years ago in his Art of War. So why should the Bible be any different?

Are you still here? If you are, join us as we delve into the book of Proverbs and adapt its timeless wisdom for the business context!

LESSON 1 Avoid Enticement / Be Ethical

PROVERBS 1:10

My son, if sinful men entice you, do not consent.



Many people think that the term "business ethics" is an oxymoron. This word means that two words that contradict each other, such as "cruel kindness" or "original copy" are joined together.

Can you really get ahead by being ethical? Isn't it so much easier to grow your business and become rich if you take shortcuts and cut corners?

Well, yes and no. In the short term, you can enrich yourself and your business by doing unethical things. Like cutting down on ingredients to save on cost. Maybe, diluting that cement with a little extra water. Or mixing chemicals into food to pass nutrition standards. Never mind if that is being mixed into baby formula.

But sooner or later, things done in secret are exposed pretty quickly. Today, everyone has a cellphone in their pocket that can take pictures. They can show these pictures, and even stream live videos, to the entire world.

It's not just the casual informant you should worry about. Hackers are everywhere. If you had a Yahoo e-mail address in 2013, your password is being sold online. If you were registered in Comelec's database in 2016, all your voter information was leaked to the whole world.

If you formed an offshore corporation for tax and estate planning before 2013, all of your details were stolen. In fact, the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists placed all the leaked data into a website where anyone can access!

In sum, forget about being able to do bad things in secret today. It's getting very, very difficult to hide.

Worse, people are also a lot less forgiving today. Once a company is proven to have done unethical things, the punishment can be harsh and swift. I am not just talking about fines or prison sentences from the government. Companies with a bad reputation can find it hard to find people willing to, buy from, or work for them.

Furthermore, ethical companies are given more chances than unethical companies. Did you notice that people had a more violent reaction against United Airlines, when a dog died during a flight, compared to the reaction to Southwest Airlines when an engine exploded in mid-air and killed a person?

Why? Because Southwest had a good reputation and United Airlines did not. In 2017, a video was circulated where a man was beaten up and dragged out of a full United Airlines flight, because he refused to leave the plane that was overbooked. The incident made people see United Airlines as unethical, and they become less forgiving for the company's future sins.

The same is true in the Philippines. People are more critical when a particular department store chain is involved in a fire, compared to fires that happen in, say, national mall chains. Why? Because the mall was viewed as more ethical and therefore given more chances by the public.

Whereas, people are quick to accuse the local department store chain of wrongdoing. Even if the company is not actually guilty, it is in the position of having to prove its innocence. All because of bad behavior in the past.

So, what's the bottom line? In business, you should avoid enticement and stand firm in your principles. Not only because is it the right thing to do, but because it makes good business sense.

In the short term, your business *can* indeed gain from being unethical. But over the long run, the punishment¹ can be very severe when you get caught. And the chances of getting caught these days are very, very high.

LESSON 2 Be Vigilant

PROVERBS 4:23

Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life.



Why? Because everything you do, whether good or evil, depends on the condition of your heart. If you allow corruption to enter your heart, then you will do corrupt things. Here, Solomon used a beautiful metaphor of your heart pumping out life, just like a fountain.

So, how do we apply this to business? See, it takes a particular mindset to engage in business. If you listen to all the negative things everyone has to say, you'll never get started. Let us illustrate this with some negativity, shall we?

- You want to start a new venture? The odds are against you. Around 80% of all new businesses fail in the first year.² The good news is: the longer a company stays in business, the more likely it will survive. But ultimately, nine out of ten new businesses will fail.³
- 2. You think you're a pretty good cook, and made the perfect fried chicken recipe that everyone would like. What makes you think you will succeed? Many companies already sell fried chicken, like Jollibee, Max's or Sunburst. They can easily squash you like a bug.



Of course, there are other punishments for sinning. We are all aware of the wages of sin, and what could someone possibly gain if he gets the entire world but loses his soul in the process. But, since this is an article about business, we will stick mainly with business.

Let's say, your formulation is better. Can you then beat them in other areas? Areas such as good locations, hospitable hosts, access to suppliers of good-quality ingredients, and financial capital to expand your operations?

Even if the big boys don't try to drive you out of business, you can bet that once your food concept becomes popular, many people will try to imitate you. Remember the craze with bubble tea, donuts (think about the long lines with Krispy Kreme and J.Co), and frozen yogurt?⁴ Sure, you may experience instant success, but you'll get instant competition. Once the fad dies down, what do you do?

 So, you have this killer product that will revolutionize the [insert pain point] industry? Is this really the best time to launch? Assuming you can get your business started, the economic indicators are starting to fall.

There's a lot of bad things that can happen. High inflation. Peso devaluation. Trade wars. Maybe even real war, either in the Middle East (more expensive oil!) or against North Korea (nuclear annihilation!)

Needless to say, being in business requires you to have a good understanding of the situation. Then, you make decisive choices based on your analysis of the risks and rewards. But there is a LOT of negativity out there. Once you allow it to enter your heart, you start to fear and second-guess your decisions. That's when trouble starts to brew.

Edgar Sia II opened the first Mang Inasal branch in Iloilo at the age of 26 in 2003. Before this, he dropped out of college at 19 to start a laundry business (Mister Labada) and a photo-developing shop (Injap Color Express).⁵

Most people will look at the crowded barbecued food segment⁶ and conclude that Sia will fail. But, he persevered, and Mang Inasal grew. Eventually, it was acquired by rival fast-food giant Jollibee in 2010, making Sia at 34 the youngest billionaire in the Philippines.⁷

Regarding my third negative point, do you know that launching a business during a recession can be a smart move? A business that learns to survive on lean times can be more successful than one that gets fat first and must then take a crash diet.

Many successful companies launched during a recession. We have GE (1892), IBM (1896), General Motors (1908), Walt Disney (1923), Revlon (1932), Hewlett-Packard (1939), FedEx (1973), Apple (1975), and Microsoft (1975).

Apple itself is in the habit of launching products during recessions. The iPod was launched in 2001, after the Dotcom crash of 2000. The iPhone was launched in 2007, during the subprime crisis. The iPad was launched in 2010, when the world was still recovering from the 2008 recession.

To be clear, I am not saying that you should not listen to anything negative—this is also a mistake. You cannot afford to ignore all the bad news. You must be very selective in choosing what to pay attention to. Not just with great vigilance, but with ALL vigilance.

LESSON 3 Be Teachable

PROVERBS 5:13-14

I did not listen to the voice of my teachers or incline my ear to my instructors. I am at the brink of utter ruin in the assembled congregation.

These two verses form part of an entire section in Proverbs where Solomon warned all young men against adultery. The adulteress will lead you astray, Solomon said, and cause you to lose your honor and even your life. Because you did not listen to your teachers, your life is ruined.

This is the same with business. As you build up your business and achieve a measure of success, there is always the danger that you stop listening to the counsel of your teachers and mentors. Either you start listening to yourself (thus becoming stagnant), or listen only to yes-men (who only tell you what you want to hear) or worse, conmen who would milk you for every centavo you have.

You should never stop learning, period. Admit that you don't know everything, and be willing to learn from all sources: customers, suppliers, peers, and even your employees. By learning new things, you learn to appreciate the world from a different perspective.

For example, learning more about how your industry works can help you see a new way of doing things. Or a new market opportunity you have not considered before. Or a new technology that make you unique from your competitors and provide you with an advantage in business.

Learning a new language lets you communicate with business partners from other countries, without the need of a translator. This helps you build trust.

Thanks to the Internet, you don't need connections to mentors and educators to be teachable. There are many online learning websites⁸ that cover a wide variety of subjects. Not just business school topics, but even things like music, personal development, and foreign languages.

Warren Buffett, the CEO of Berkshire Hathaway and regarded as one of the best investors in the world, reads a lot. He spends 80% of his workday reading and thinking, going through 500 pages a day. He considers it as an investment, saying that all that knowledge builds up "like compound interest."⁹

In fact, Buffett's willingness to read hundreds of pages of financial statements every day gave him an advantage when it comes to choosing the right companies to invest in.

Bill Gates, another famous billionaire, is also a very wide reader. He has a blog <http://www.gatesnotes. com/Books> where he shares his reading list and reviews the latest books that he reads.

In 2010, Mark Zuckerberg, the founder of Facebook, set a personal challenge to learn Mandarin. His wife Priscilla was Chinese, and he wanted to be able to talk to his wife's father and grandmother who spoke only Chinese. Four years later, the world was amazed when Zuckerberg talked *only* in Mandarin with Tsinghua University students during a 30-minute Q&A session.¹⁰

We live today in a world that moves at the speed of thought, with the situation changing every second. You have to be teachable and willing to learn, or risk being overtaken by someone who is.

LESSON 4 Do Not Procrastinate

PROVERBS 6:10-11

A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man.



The first half of Proverbs 6 are Solomon's warnings against folly (mistakes). Verses 1-2 warn against being a guarantor for others' debts while verses 3-5 give advice on what to do if you are already a guarantor. Verses 6-8 admonishes the lazy man to be as industrious as the ant, while verses 9-11 warns him on the consequences of laziness. Finally, verses 12-15 describe of the fate of a wicked man, and what God considers wicked is described in verses 16-19.

It is a very human thing to procrastinate. In fact, this is a habit for Filipinos. Perhaps we learned this mañana habit from the Spanish. After all, mañana is a Spanish word for "tomorrow," clearly describing a habit of putting off things today that can be done tomorrow.

Because of this habit, even the most urgent of projects and tasks is put off for some other time. Of course, that other time never comes. Something always comes up to take up all our time. It is only when the last deadline approaches that we start working like mad. It is a habit I am guilty of. In fact, I procrastinated by not writing this article until after the May 31 deadline set by the Gospel Light editor!

Procrastination is never a good thing when thinking about starting a business. As the Chinese saying goes, 「種一棵樹最好的時間是十年前,其次是現在。」 In English, it means, "The best time to plant a tree is ten years ago; the next best time is today." If you're thinking about starting your business, you should not wait for all the stars to line up. We only have 24 hours in a day, and never enough time unless we really force ourselves to make time for it.

If you are already in business, then procrastination is also a very bad thing. Procrastinating on a project either leads to missed deadlines (and angry customers), or rushed, shoddy work (and angry employees - and even then, the customer may not be happy with the result.)

If an entire company procrastinates, it is called "inertia" - a term borrowed from Physics. This is a situation where a company does nothing to change with the times. By continuing to do what it has always done, it figuratively takes a nap while more agile competitors come in and rob it blind.

Look at Kodak. The company was the undisputed king of cameras. and was even the first to invent a digital camera. But it focused on its more-profitable film cameras, and so Kodak fell behind Nikon and Canon in digital cameras. Once people stopped using film because the cameras in their cellphones were good enough, Kodak was done for.

Speaking of cellphones, do you remember Nokia? Its cellphones were indestructible, with battery life measured in days. Nokia was the king of cellphones in the 1990s. The company was even among the first to introduce a smartphone with a touchscreen.

But Nokia neglected the customer's experience its phones were not very easy to use and didn't have "Wow!" features. And so, Nokia died a slow and painful death to Apple and Samsung.

Don't be Kodak, Nokia, IBM, Friendster, or even the hare in the race with the turtle. Business today is ever-changing. If you stand still during the race, then don't be surprised when you are left with nothing.

THAT ONE THING

hat is that one most important thing in your life? Is it wealth? Power? Fame? Knowledge? Family? Or sports? Let us take a look at that "ONE THING" most important in the lives of six people from the Bible, and learn spiritual lessons from them.

1. RICH YOUNG MAN: THAT ONE THING LACKING



A rich young man once approached Jesus and asked him, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Since he was a pious man who already kept all the commandments, Jesus answered, "**One thing you lack**, go, sell everything you have, and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (Mark 10:21)

Jesus' command contained five verbs – actions that must be undertaken if we want to follow Him:

- 1. Go An urgent command which demands immediate action
- 2. Sell Relinquish of your possession
- 3. Give Share with the poor
- 4. Come An Invitation that requires acceptance
- 5. Follow me Surrender of personal will

It is not easy to follow Jesus – you pay a high price. Following him requires one to (Mat. 16:24):

- 1. Deny Oneself
 - a. Give yourself up
 - b. Give to the poor
 - c. Give in to the Lord
- 2. Take Up the Cross
 - a. Endure trials and tribulations
 - b. Undergo hardships
 - c. Encounter persecution
 - d. Share your time and talents

2. MARTHA: THAT ONE THING NEEDED

When Jesus came to the house of Martha and Mary, Martha was very busy making preparations while Mary did nothing to help. She sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. Martha complained to Jesus and asked him to tell Mary to help her.

But how did Jesus reply? "Martha, Martha, you are worried and upset about many things, **but only one thing is needed**. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:41-42)

From Jesus' response, we know that all the preparation Martha was busy doing was not really important to Him; sitting and listening to His Word superseded any services and activities rendered to Him. In other words, God wants us to have a relationship and constant fellowship with Him.

- 3. Follow Me
 - a. Forfeit your rights and privileges
 - b. Trust and obey

To be a follower, one must obey, submit, comply, conform and abide by the decisions of the leader. He loses the privilege to make his own decisions.

Jesus said to His disciples, "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Mat. 4:19) But that rich young man went away sad, unwilling to pay the price, because he had great wealth.

How about you? Are you willing to follow Jesus?

Too often, we are inundated with church activities that we neglect our devotional time with Him. Yet Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit. Apart from me, you can do nothing." (John 15:5).

Therefore, we must establish a relationship with God through prayer and reading His Word. Through prayer, we tell Him our needs, struggles, and problems, and seek wisdom and strength from Him. By reading His Word, we get God's message to us. "Thy word is a light to my feet and a lamp to my path." (Psalm 119:105). His word is our life manual to guide us in our life's journey.

How is your relationship with God? Are you in fellowship with Him daily?



3. THE BLIND BEGGAR: THAT ONE THING TO KNOW



While in Jerusalem, Jesus healed a beggar who was blind from birth. His healing style was very unique: He spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, put it on the man's eye, and told him to wash in the Pool of Siloam. That man did what Jesus said, and returned with full vision.

Many were surprised, but because the healing was done on a Sabbath day, the Pharisees investigated the matter. They summoned the blind man and said: "We know that man was a sinner." (John 9:24) But the man replied: "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. **One thing I do know**, I was blind but now I see." (John 9:25)

Today, people have different kinds of sickness that need healing. Jesus is a fantastic healer – the greatest physician, in fact. He had cured all kinds of diseases and conditions: blindness, deafness, muteness, lameness, leprosy, paralyzation, high fever, bleeding, demon possession, and even restored the dead to life.

God is all-powerful. Nothing is impossible for Him. He performed miracles before, and He can do it for you today. He is a compassionate Lord. He will never leave you nor forsake you because He cares for you. All you need is real faith and trust in Him.

That blind man knew only one thing: that Jesus made him see. How about you? Do you know who Jesus is in your life?

4. DAVID: THAT ONE THING TO ASK OF THE LORD

David was chosen by God to be the King of Israel. But before he became king, he encountered so many dangers. In Psalms, he recorded what he prayed to God to protect him from his enemies both from within and without.

Saul was jealous of him and tried to kill him. His own son Absalom also rebelled against him. David was always on the run, escaping and hiding from those who wanted his life. However, he got strength and comfort from the Lord.

No wonder he said, "**One thing I ask of the Lord**, that is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty on the Lord and to seek Him in his temple." (Psalm 27:4)

David sought Him by dwelling in the house of the Lord and he received:

- 1. Protection Keep me safe in times of trouble (Psalm 27:5a)
- 2. Security Hide me in the shelter of His tabernacle (Psalm 27:5b)
- 3. Promotion Set me high upon a rock (Psalm 27:5c)

Seeking God can rid us of fear, worries and burden. His grace and strength can sustain us to endure the trials of life. He is our rock, our refuge, and our fortress (Psalm 94:22).

And you? Do you want to seek Him?



5. PETER: THAT ONE THING NOT TO FORGET

The early Christians were in constant danger of persecution and had to be alert to false teachers. They anxiously waited for Jesus' return, waiting for so long that they became discouraged. That was why Peter constantly reminded them that Jesus will certainly keep his promise to come again. But it has to be in His time.

Peter said: "**But do not forget this one thing**, dear friends, with the Lord, a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare." (2 Peter 3:8-10)

In other words, Peter was reminding them: the one thing you should not forget is the Forthcoming of Christ. Since Jesus' coming is near, what must we do?

- Live a godly and peaceful life, spotless and blameless with good testimony to the unbelievers.
- Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Get to know Him better through the scriptures.
- Be alert and ready for his coming.



• Be prepared for judgment.

Both the Old and the New Testament of the Bible discussed judgment:

- Ecclesiastes 12:14: "God will bring every deed into judgment including every hidden thing whether it is good or evil."
- Psalms 96:10-13: "He will judge the people with equity, in righteousness, and in truth."
- Romans 14:12: "Upon his coming, each of us will give an account of himself to God."
- Hebrews 9:27: "Just as man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgment."

Therefore, judgment is a sure thing. Be careful what you say or do on Earth. Are you excited and eagerly looking forward to His coming?



6. PAUL: THAT ONE THING TO DO

Prior to his conversion, Paul was a devout Pharisee who led the persecution of Christians. One day, while on his way to Damascus, he met Jesus. From there on, he was converted and dedicated his life to preach the Gospel.

Throughout his ministry, he suffered hunger, thirst, cold, and was stripped naked. He was stoned, beaten with a rod, severely logged, and exposed to the elements to die. He encountered shipwrecks. He faced dangers in and from the desert, rivers, seas, bandits, own countrymen, Gentiles, city, country, and false brothers. (2 Corinthians 11:25) While he was in prison, he wrote, "**But one thing I do**, forgetting what is behind, and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13-14)

1. Forget what is behind (Past)

Free your mind from past mistakes, regrets, failures, hurts, hatred, grudges, misunderstanding, and discouragement. These are negative feelings that will ruin your body. It destroys your peace of mind and deprives you to enjoy your life fully. As the famous song in Disney's "Frozen" goes: "LET IT GO, LET IT GO!" So, by all means, forget what is behind and "LET IT GO!"

- Straining towards what is ahead (Present)
 Be a SOWER:
 - **S** hare the Gospel Lead people to Christ
 - **O** bey His Commandments Apply His words in your life.
 - W itness for Him Be a light and salt to this world
 - E dify Fellow Christians Encourage and build up one another
 - **R** estore Relationships Patch up broken relationships
- 3. Press on beyond (Future)
 - a. Assurance of eternal life

Anyone who believes in Jesus Christ and accepts Him as his personal Savior has eternal life. (John 3:16)

7. SUMMARY

In Summary, the Bible stated that most important "ONE THING" as follows:

- 1. That One Thing Lacking
- 2. That One Thing Needed
- 3. That One Thing to Know
- 4. That One Thing to Ask of the Lord
- 5. That One Thing Not to Forget
- 6. That One Thing **to Do**

b. Promise of a Heavenly Home

Jesus had promised that he is going to prepare a place in heaven for believers to live eternally with Him (John 14:2-3)

c. Reward in Heaven

Our rewards will be based upon the foundation we laid whether it is of gold, silver, precious stones, wood, clay, or straw (1 Corinthians 3:11-14) And he will render his reward to every man according to what he has done (Revelations 22:12)

What are the Rewards awaiting us?

- 1. Crown of Joy (1 Thes. 2:19-20; Phil. 4:1)
 - Those who lead other to Christ, there will be rejoicing in heaven
- 2. Crown of Life (James 1:12; Rev. 2:10)
 - Those who persevere under trials, sufferings and persecutions;
 - Those who love God;
- 3. Crown of Glory (1 Peter 5:4)
 - Those who are willing to serve God's flock
 - Those who fulfill God's calling
 - Those who finish the work assigned
- 4. Crown of Righteousness (2 Tim. 4:7-8)
 - Those who live a holy life
 - Those who long for His appearing
- 5. Incorruptible Crown (1 Cor. 9:24-25)
 - Those with self-controlled life (Subject to strict training)

Do you have the assurance of eternal life? Are you confident that you will have a place in heaven in the future? When you meet our Lord, how many crowns do you expect to receive from Him?

3. 跟隨我 → 捨棄權利、交託順從

每位跟隨者應該肯順從、 投服、 依照、 遵守、 並符合領袖的決定、 因為跟隨者 沒有權利作自己的主張。

耶穌對門徒說: 你若跟隨我, 就可以得人 如得魚一樣. (太4:19)。

可惜那位有錢的青年憂憂愁愁的離開、 因為他的產業很多。

請問、你有願意跟隨耶穌嗎?
當耶穌來到馬大和馬利亞的家中、馬大 忙着預備許多事、而馬利亞並沒有幫忙、 她只坐在耶穌腳前聽祂的道、馬大就向 耶穌交涉、要馬利亞來幫忙她。

但耶穌怎樣回答她呢?「馬大,馬大, 你為許多的事思慮煩擾、但是**不可少的** 只有一件、馬利亞已經選擇那上好的 福份、是不能奪去的」(路10:41-42)。

從耶穌的回應、使我們知道、神所重視 的並不是馬大為祂忙着所做的事奉、 而是坐在祂腳前聽祂的道、比任何事工 更重要!上帝喜愛我們與祂結連、時常 和祂交通。 許多時候、為了忙着辦理教會各種的 事工、以致忽略了靈修的時間、耶穌 說:「我是葡萄樹、你們是枝子、常在 我裡面的、我也常在他裡面、這人就多結 果子、因為離了我、你們就不能作什麼」 (約15:5)。

三. 生來瞎眼的人:有一件事我知道的

耶穌醫好了一個生來瞎眼的討飯人、 祂的醫法非常的特殊、祂將唾沫和泥土 混合、抹在瞎子的眼睛上、然後叫他 往西羅亞池子裡去洗。這人遵照耶穌 去洗、回頭就看見了。

許多人都希奇、那些法利賽人因耶穌在 安息日治病、就開始查問、叫那生來 瞎眼的人來對他說:「我們知道這人是 個罪人」、但是那生來瞎眼的回答說: 「祂是個罪人不是、我不知道、<u>有一件事</u> 我知道、從前我是眼瞎的、如今能看見 了」(約9:25)。

今天、我們每個人都有不同的疾病需要 治療、耶穌是最偉大的醫生、祂曾經醫好 各種的疾病、倒如:瞎眼、耳聾、啞子、 殘廢、痲瘋、痲痺、高熱、血漏、被鬼附 着、而且又叫死人復活。

上帝是全能的、在祂沒有難成的事、 以前祂行過神蹟、如今祂仍舊能行神蹟、 祂是仁慈的主、祂必不捨棄了你、因為 祂顧念你。只要你完全相信交託祂、祂必 醫治你。

那瞎眼的只知道一件事、就是耶穌使他能 看見。你呢?耶穌在你的生命中是誰?

四. 大衛:有一件事我求告主的

大衛被神揀選為以色列的王、但在他還 沒有作王之前、他遭遇了很多的危險。 詩篇有記載大衛向神禱告、求祂保護他 脫離對外及對內的仇敵。

掃羅王妒嫉大衛、要將他打死、甚至 他親生的兒子押沙龍也背叛他、迫趕他、 以致大衛在外奔跑、投避、隱藏。然而、 他從神得到力量和安慰。 所以他說:「<u>有一件事、我曾求耶和華</u>、 我仍要尋求、就是一生一世住在祂的 殿中、瞻仰祂的榮美、在祂的殿裡求問」 (詩27:4)。

大衞在神的殿尋求神終於得到了:

- 保護 在患難中得保守 (詩篇27:5a)
- 保障 把我藏在祂帳幕的隱密處 (詩篇27:5b)

提拔 將我高舉在磐石上 詩篇27:5c)

尋求神會使我們除去了懼怕、煩惱、和重 担、因祂的恩惠和能力、能持守我們忍受

五. 彼得:一件事不可忘記的

初期信徒遭受迫害和假先知的危險、他們 盼望耶穌會快快再來、但是等候了很久、 就開始灰心失望、因此彼得再三地提醒他 們、耶穌必定成全祂再來的應許、但是應 按照祂的時間。

彼後3:8-10:「親愛的弟兄啊、 <u>一件事你們不可忘記</u>、就是主看一日如千年、千年如一日、主所應許的尚未成就、 有人以為是耽延、其實不是躭延、乃是寬容你們、不願有一人沈淪、乃願人人都悔改、但主的日子要像賊來一樣、那日天必 大有響聲廢去、有形質的都要被烈火銷 化、地和其上的物都要燒盡了。」

换句話說、彼得所提醒他們不可忘記的一 件事、就是基督必定再來。

既然耶穌再來的日子已臨近,我們應該做 什麼準備呢?

* 過着敬虔安然無可指摘、沒有玷污的 生活、在無信人中有好的見證

六. 保羅:我只有一件要做的事

保羅原是一位虔誠的法利賽人、他常帶領 人逼迫基督徒。有一天、當他在大馬色路 中遇見耶穌、從那天開始、他就悔改終身 奉獻為主宣道。

在他的事工上、他遭遇飢餓、口渴、 受寒冷、赤身露體、被石頭打、 受鞭打、被棍打、屢次冒死、他遇到 船沉、也遭遇曠野、江河、海中、海賊、 同族、外邦人、城裡和假兄弟的危險。 (哥後11:25)

當他下監牢寫出腓立比書說:「<u>我只有</u> 一件事、就是忘記背後、努力面前、向著 人生的試煉、神是我們的磐石、是我們的 避難所、也是我們的高台。你有願意尋求 上帝嗎?

- * 在主耶穌基督的恩典和知識上有長 進、並多多的更認識基督
- * 警惕預備好祂的再來
- * 預備將來的審判

新舊約聖經都有記載到審判的事實:

- * 傳12:14一「因人所作的事、連一 切隱藏的事、無論是善是惡、神都 必審問」
- * 詩96:10-13一「祂要按公正、以公義 和信實審判萬民」
- * 羅14:22--「我們各人必要將自己的事 在神面前說明」
- * 來9:27一「按著定命人人都有一死、 死後且有審判」

因為審判是必定有的、所以要留心你在世 上一切所說的話和所做的事。你有否興奮 的等候祂的再來?

 - * 將來有永生之確據 凡相信耶穌接受祂為救主,就必得 永生(約3:16)
 - * 將來有天家之應許 耶穌到天為信徒預備了地方、使他 們將來可以與祂同住(約14:2-3)
 - * 將來有在天堂之賞賜

Simon Peter was at times impulsive, self-seeking, presumptuous, Cowardly, denied knowing Jesus the Christ, not once, but three times, Yet God the Father chose him of humble origins to be the leading disciple, When he received the Spirit of God, Peter was transformed from a reed to a rock, Courageous and immovable in the work that God set before him, In the face of persecution, Peter spoke the Gospel to crowds and religious leaders, Healed the infirmed, raised Tabitha from death--all in the Name of Jesus Christ.

When Saul of Tarsus, a Pharisee of great learning, persecuted followers of Jesus the Christ, Pursuing, arresting, imprisoning and having believers put to death, God the Father did not end Saul's life; He humbled him.
Saul acknowledged and prayed to the God whose followers he persecuted,
God made him the chosen instrument for the salvation of the Gentiles, not only Jews.
Saul, called Paul, with companions, undertook three missionary journeys,
Established churches, authored many books of the New Testament,
Explained doctrines and principles of Christian living.

Each of our stories may not be as dramatic as that of the Bible characters. But each of us has a story to tell,

Of how the love of God the Father refuses to let us go our own way, Toward destruction with our arrogance, foolishness, laziness, immorality, Selfishness, stubbornness, weaknesses, wickedness. Before Him in humility, with a contrite heart and confession, He redeems and restores us;

And when we ask, empowers us with His Spirit to do great things for His Glory.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, That whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.
For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, But to save the world through Him". (John 3:16, 17)

Having this in mind, we believe that these young children who have come to the knowledge of our Lord and Savior can be a catalyst of change, just as how the Lord has been using our VBS team. By the way, do you know that 90% of our VBS team are all products of VBS? They were once kids who also joined VBS here. Isn't it amazing that it's their turn now to help out and share God's love to these kids?

BACK TO THE HOLY LAND – JERUSALEM

halom! It's a pleasure to be a part of another Vacation Bible School – and seeing many kids come to enjoy God's presence in songs, stories and fellowship with other children for a whole week.

When we first met for initial planning, we had a hard time setting the date and coming up with the list of teachers. However, after praying and deliberation, we finally decided to hold it towards the PCGS school opening since most of the children will be back from their vacation or will be done with summer classes. Thus, June 18-23, 2018 (Monday to Saturday) from 8:00-11:00 AM was set as the schedule for this year's VBS.

When we saw the material from the CSM (Church Strengthening Ministry) we immediately decided to use it: **BACK TO THE HOLY LAND – JERUSALEM**. It is quite fitting also since we are celebrating Israel's 70TH anniversary as a nation, and many have been to the Holy Land. Moreover, we also wanted the children to know about this blessed nation – the Land of God's chosen people.

So, the work began. We started registration by mid-March. By mid-May we had 100 early-bird registrants. Then a few more came in by June, until we reached a total of 147 registered children. We were able to invite 10 teachers and 36 assistants. Pastors Helen Sia and Alice Huang counseled some of the children – sharing the gospel to them more clearly.

We were so blessed that the Sisters' Fellowship sponsored the snacks for the whole week. The Lord had provided for the almost 200 people involved in this weeklong event. Jehovah Jireh!

Throughout this VBS, we had seen the hand of the Lord moving. The date was nearing and we still lacked Grade 5 teacher and a sub for Grade 3. During our final meeting, we were able to invite Brother Daniel Yam – the BSOP practicumer to teach Grade 5 which he accepted without hesitation.

Erwina Chan, our song leader nearly did not make it because of work schedule, but she was able to make a bargain until she was free, not just to lead the songs, but also to substitute for Grade 3 while the teacher was out of town till the middle of the week. Then, when the Nursery class became too big, we had to get another teacher to handle the toddlers. The Lord readily gave us Krystle Ong who teamtaught with Pastor Gina Pecson, the VBS Director.

We had some problems with decorating the sanctuary stage, which was a lot bigger than our usual venue. Then came Sia Boksuniu showing us the props of Jubilee Evangelical Church. Oh, how we wished we could have the same here! Before we knew it, plans were made for the whole set of props to be sent here for us to borrow.

WOW!! Isn't our God amazing? We are very grateful for the JEC people who packed the many, many boxes of decors to be shipped freely to Cebu. Thanks also to those who facilitated and assisted in bringing the props and arranging them on stage.

On the day before VBS, Gina and I had the pleasure of doing the tour through each classroom and praying inside each room for the teacher and the students that they would be blessed as they joined the VBS. We did what we could do and committed the rest into God's hands. We knew and believed that He will work according to His will. We entrusted the whole week's activities to Him.

Finally, June 18 came. The staff arrived early for the morning devotion led by Sia Boksuniu. Then Erwina and her team led the singspiration. Siansi Gina then shared the Jewish symbol for the day. She talked about the Star of David, Mezuzah, Unleavened Bread, Menorah and the Shofar and how they could be relevant to us even if we are not Israelites. We learned the memory verse with Siansi Lily Young. After that, the children went to their respective classrooms where the teachers imparted their daily lessons from God's Word.

Day 1, the **Souvenir of Praise**, was based on the Story of Jesus' Coming as King – He gives us a reason to rejoice and praise Him.

Day 2, the **Souvenir of Courage**, was based from the Story when Jesus Cleaned the Temple – He wants us to stand up for what is right, just like He did.

Day 3, the **Souvenir of Strength**, was based on the Story of Jesus Healing the Man by the Pool – He renews our strength.

Day 4, the **Souvenir of Love**, was based on the Story of Jesus Washing His Disciples' Feet – He wants us to do for others as He has done for us.

Day 5, the **Souvenir of Hope**, was based on the Story of Jesus' Appearance to the Disciples and His Ascension to Heaven – He died and rose again to give us a brand-new hope.

WHO IS GOD?

year ago, I started to use a book called "God, What's Your Name?" This is a precept book for kids, which our own Sunday school teachers use. For many years before I was exposed to the inductive way of studying, I had been curious of all the names that the pastors, Sunday school teachers, and ministers used for God, but I never got around to answering those questions till now.

From this book, I've learned that God has many names and I'll be sharing some of them with you. But first, I'd like you to describe what you think about God in a notebook or paper and compare it to WHO God is according to the Bible. The first name of God I learned is from Genesis 1:1: 'In the beginning God created the heavens and the Earth.' *Elohim (el-oh-HEEM)* is a Hebrew word which means "to fear" or "to revere." *El* from the word Elohim means "mighty" or "strong." This is the word that we use to refer to Almighty God. The *-im* ending is very important because it is a plural ending.

To understand this name of God, we must continue reading Genesis 1:2, which tells us that the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of waters. This is the Holy Spirit. We now cross-reference this with the New Testament (John 1:1-3,14), which tells us that 'in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.' The "Word" in this verse refers to God's Son, Jesus Christ. From this, we deduce that *Elohim* – God the Father; God the Son, Jesus Christ; and God the Holy Spirit, each had a part in the Creation.

The second name that I've learned is *El Elyon* (*el el-YON*), which means God Most High. This name was first used in Genesis 14, when a war between four kings resulted in the capture of Abraham's nephew Lot. As stated in Genesis 14:18-20, ¹¹⁸And Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; now he was a priest of God Most High. ¹⁹He blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram of God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth; ²⁰And blessed be God Most High, Who has delivered your enemies into your hand." He gave him a tenth of all.' Here, we can see that "God Most High" is described as Possessor or owner of both heaven and earth and that He will deliver our enemies into our hands.

Another name of God is *El Roi*, which means "God sees." This is revealed in Genesis 16:7-13 when Hagar ran away from Sarai, her mistress. Then the angel of the Lord told her to return to her mistress and submit to her authority, assuring Hagar that the Lord will greatly multiply her descendants and she would bear a son who will be called Ishmael.

From this, we can see that our God knows what we are going through. He sees when we are in distress, when we need help, and when we are in pain. God cares for us and He loves us. All we need is to turn to Him. He sees and knows what happens to us and will use the bad things for good. Proverbs 5:21 says, 'For the ways of a man are before the eyes of the LORD, and He watches all his paths.'

The fourth name I learned is *El Shaddai* (*el sha-DIE*) meaning "God Almighty." We derived this name from Genesis 17:1-6. Abram was 99 years old when God renamed him Abraham and told him that He will make him the father of many nations.

In Genesis 12:4, Abram was 75 years old. Roughly 24 years had passed since God's promise, and Abram had been waiting all that time for God to give him and Sarai a child. Genesis 17:1 says, '1 Now when Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before Me, and be blameless."'

In this passage, we see that Abram is weak, but God is strong. God was able to give Abraham a child and make him a father of a multitude of nations, even though Abram was past the age to father a child. God is El-Shaddai, our all-sufficient One. Proverbs 18:10 says that 'the Lord is our strong tower and the righteous, those who have believed and are cleansed by His blood, run to it and is safe.' 2 Corinthians 12:9,10 tells us, "And He has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is perfected in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong.'

Yet another name for God, Adonai (a-doh-NIGH), was mentioned in Genesis 15:1-6. Abraham addressed God as "O Lord God." This name of God means "Lord." He is our LORD, Master, and Owner. What does it mean for God to truly be our Adonai – the Lord, Master, and Owner of our lives? Can we really say that Jesus is our Lord if we do not obey Him?

Malachi 1:6 says, "A a son honors his father, and a servant his master. Then if I am a father, where is My honor? And if I am a master, where is My respect?" says the LORD of hosts to you, O priests who despise My name. But you say, "How have we despised Your name?" Look at what the Lord of hosts is asking, "If I am a master, WHERE is My HONOR?" 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is perfected in weakness."

Now I ask you as I have asked myself, do you respect and honor Him as your Lord and Master, your Adonai? If God is to be Master and Owner of our lives, then we have to submit to whatever He asks us to do. We have to surrender our desires for God's. It is not about whether we have the skills set to do the task but rather the willingness to tackle whatever problem is thrown our way.

Jehovah is another name of God. This name of God is the most frequently-used name in the Old Testament. This name of God is also known in Hebrew as YHWH. Note that these are four consonants with no vowel. However, some people add the vowels "E", "O", and "A" and change "Y" to "J" and the "W" to "V" to get Jehovah (je-HOE-vah) while others add only the vowels "A" and "E" to get Yahweh (YAH-way).

This name is linked to a Hebrew verb hâyâh, which means "to be, to exist". This name of God, whether Jehovah or Yahweh, implies a being who is absolutely self-existent. This means that God always is, was, and will be. He doesn't need anything outside of Himself. Nobody made God; rather, He is the Creator of all.

Look at Genesis 2:4. Here it says that the LORD God made earth and heaven. The name God in this verse means *Elohim*, which we had already tackled, but look at the word before it. It says LORD or Jehovah (YHWH). Any time we see the name LORD in all capital letters, we must remember that this means *Jehovah*, the Self-existent One. Lord with a capital L, with the rest being lowercase, means that God is our Lord and master or *Adonai*. And just as how a master provides for his servants' needs, God will provide for our needs. This gives rise to another name of God, which is *Jehovah – Jireh*, or *the Lord will provide*, but this is for another time.

Remember that I asked you to list down WHO God is for you. Now compare it to what you've read:

- 1. Elohim: God the Creator
- 2. El Elyon: God Most High
- 3. El Roi: the God who sees
- 4. El Shaddai: God Almighty
- 5. Adonai: Lord, Master, Owner of our lives, and
- 6. Jehovah or Yahweh: the Self-existent One.

Are all the names we've learned listed in your paper? If they aren't, that's okay. I can honestly tell you that before I started reading this book, my knowledge of WHO God is was limited. And so, I impart this to you and hope that from now on, we will remember all of God's names and will be able to understand the Bible more as we read His word each and every day.

I look forward to imparting more of God's names to each of you, and hope that you have learned about WHO GOD IS according to the Bible.
