祂說:「你們是世上的光。城造在山上是不能隱藏的。人點燈,不放在斗底下,是放在燈臺上,就照亮 一家的人。你們的光也當這樣照在人前,叫他們看見你們的好行為,便將榮耀歸給你們在天上的父。」 (馬太福音5:14-16)

我們要做世界的光不可以隱藏,反而要光明正大的 照在人前,叫世人看見我們的好行為,便將榮耀歸給 我們在天上的父。

那麼,我們的生命要怎樣成為世界的光呢?

第一 我們要有基督復活的生命

聖經說:「因為世人都犯了罪,虧缺了神 的榮耀。」(羅馬書3:23)聖經又說: 「然而,神既有豐富的憐憫,因祂愛我 們的大愛,當我們死在過犯中的時候, 便叫我們與基督一同活過來你們得救是 本乎恩。」(以弗所書2:4-5)

假如我們不與基督一同復活,就沒有基督 復活的生命。聖經詳細的描寫:「你們 死在過犯罪惡之中,祂叫你們活過來。 那時,你們在其中行事為人隨從今世的 風俗,順服空中掌權者的首領,就是現今 在悖逆之子心中運行的邪靈。我們從前也 都在他們中間,放縱肉體的私慾,隨著肉 體和心中所喜好的去行,本為可怒之子, 和別人一樣。」(以弗所書2:1-3)

保羅在加拉太書二章廿節也有提到這種 經歷:「我已經與基督同釘十字架,現在 活著的,不再是我,乃是基督在我裏面活 著.並且我如今在肉身活著,是因信上帝的 兒子而活,祂是愛我,為我捨己。」

因此,我們有基督復活的生命,就能為主發光!

第二 我們要與基督同行

聖經說:「生命在祂裡頭,這生命就是人 的光。光照在黑暗裡,黑暗卻不接受光… 那光是真光,照亮一切生在世上的人。 祂在世界,世界也是藉著祂造的,世界卻 不認識祂。祂到自己的地方來,自己的人 倒不接待祂。凡接待祂的,就是信祂名 的人,祂就賜他們權柄,作神的兒女。」 約翰福音1:4,5,9-12)

基督復活的生命就是人的光,照亮一切活 在世上的人但是只有信祂而接待祂的人有 權柄作神的兒女。真正神的兒女才能讓他 的生命為主發光。

聖經又說:「耶穌又對眾人說:我是世界的光。跟從我的,就不在黑暗裡走,必要得著生命的光。」(約翰福音8:12)

我們要與基督同行必須在日常生活有屬靈 的操練。 耶穌也挑戰我們:「…若有人要跟從我, 就當捨己,背起他的十字架來跟從我」 (馬太福音16:24)路加福音十四章廿七節 也說:「凡不背著自己十字架跟從我的, 也不能做我的門徒。」

歌羅西書二章六節與七節也說:「你們 既然接受了主基督耶穌,就當遵祂而行, 在祂裡面生根建造,信心堅固,正如你們 所領的教訓,感謝的心也更增長了。」

因此,我們要與基督同行必須做祂的門徒,天天背起他的十字架來跟從祂,肯每天 有屬靈的操練。保羅解釋『當遵祂而行』 有三方面的追求方式:

甲·生根建造

靈命要長進必須在祂裏面扎根,然後 被建造。耶穌在約翰福音有提到生根 建造的方式。祂說:「你們要常在我 裡面,我也常在你們裡面。枝子若不 常在葡萄樹上,自己就不能結果子; 你們若不常在我裡面,也是這樣不 常在的,我也常在他裡面,這人就多 起一,因為離了我,你們就不能做 甚麼。」(約15:4-5)信徒若沒有常 在主裡面,他就不能多結果子,他就 不能為主發光!

乙・信心堅固

保羅解釋說「正如你們所領的教訓」, 我們要追求信心更剛強不搖動,我們 必須謙卑有受教的心保持自己靈修 (祈禱讀經)所領受的心得亮光,參加 崇拜會、小組查經或主日學所領受的 講道信息,我們就會靈命長進,信心得 堅固。

以弗所書四章十一至十四節也提到真 道上合一「祂所賜的有使徒,有先知 ,有傳福音的,有牧師和教師。為要 成全聖徒,各盡其職,建立基督的身 體。直等到我們眾人在真道上同歸於 一,認識神的兒子,得以長大成人, 滿有基督長成的身量。使我們不再作 小孩子,中了人的詭計和欺騙的法 術,被一切異教之風搖動,飄來飄去 ,就隨從各樣的異端。」

丙・凡事謝恩

『感謝的心也更增長了』是遵祂而行 的第三個追求方式。凡事謝恩的生活 方式必須有幾項應注意的心態:

- (1)一切都是上帝所賜的。雅各書一章 十七節說:「各樣美善的恩賜和各 樣全備的賞賜都是從上頭來的, 從眾光之父那裡降下來的;在祂並 沒有改變,也沒有轉動的影兒。」
- (2) 我們經歷過祂的慈愛。詩篇103:1-6 表達了上帝的慈愛。「我的心哪, 你要稱頌耶和華。凡在我裡面的, 也要稱頌祂的聖名。我的心哪, 你要稱頌耶和華,不可忘記祂的 一切恩惠。祂赦免你的一切罪孽, 醫治你的一切疾病。祂救贖你的 命脫離死亡,以仁愛和慈悲為你 的冠冕。祂用美物使你所願的 得以知足,以致你如鷹返老還童。 耶和華施行公義,為一切受屈的人 伸冤。」
- (3)這是上帝的旨意。帖撒羅尼迦前書 五章十六至十八節「要常常喜樂, 不住的禱告,凡事謝恩。因為這 是神在基督耶穌裡向你們所定的 旨意。」

第三 我們要為基督受苦

保羅在腓立比書一章廿九節挑戰我們: 「因為你們蒙恩,不但得以信服基督, 並要為祂受苦。」保羅列出信徒蒙恩得救 以後不但得以信服基督,還要與祂受苦。 保羅也提到信徒必須:(1)行事為人與基 督的福音相稱。(2)要有一個心志,站立 得穩。(3)為所信的福音齊心努力。(腓立 比書1:27)

但信徒可能遇到敵人的驚嚇,他就勸勉 我們不要怕:「凡事不怕敵人的驚嚇。 這是證明他們沉淪,你們得救,都是出 於神。」(腓立比書1:28) 保羅在羅馬書第八章十七至廿三節也論到 信徒面臨世上苦難的心情與態度:

- 1 若我們和祂一同受苦,也必和祂一同得 榮耀。「既是兒女,便是後嗣,就是神 的後嗣,和基督同作後嗣。如果我們和 祂一同受苦,也必和祂一同得榮耀。」 (8:17)
- ② 現在的苦楚比不上將來的榮耀。「我 想,現在的苦楚若比起將來要顯於我們 的榮耀就不足介意了。」(8:18)
- ③信徒等候主再來時要得著兒子的名分, 乃是我們的身體得贖。「我們知道一切 受造之物一同歎息,勞苦,直到如今。 不但如此,就是我們這有聖靈初結果 子的,也是自己心裡歎息,等候得著 兒子的名分,乃是我們的身體得贖。

因此,當我們確定要讓自己的生命為主 發光,我們就要與祂一同受苦。

彼得的書信也提到我們為祂受苦的一些 原則(這些受苦特別是指心理方面的 憂慮):

- (1) 我們要將憂慮卸給神。「因為祂顧念 你們。」(彼得前書5:7)
- (2) 我們務要謹守, 儆醒。「因為你們的 仇敵魔鬼, 如同吼叫的獅子, 遍地 遊行, 尋找可吞吃的人。」(彼得前書 5:8)
- (3) 我們要用堅固的信心抵擋牠。「因為 知道你們在世上的眾弟兄也是經歷這樣 的苦難。」(彼得前書5:9)

當我們遵照這些原則面臨心理憂慮的 苦楚後,神就會幫助我們。「那賜諸般恩 典的神曾在基督裡召你們,得享祂永遠的 榮耀,等你們暫受苦難之後,必要親自 成全你們,堅固你們,賜力量給你們。 (彼得前書5:10)

我們要努力追求有基督復活的生命; 與基督同行的心態;為基督受苦的心志。 讓我們的生命為主發光吧!▲

日下雨是主所定,兩項都是花木欠用, 憂悶歡喜都有利益,養飼靈魂堅固信 德,賜福降災都從命令,天父願禰旨意 得成。性命我知是祂所賜,不論好歹不嫌境遇, 死的蔭影遮我的時,堅固盼望我心無疑,或活或 死我全無怕,天父願禰旨意得成。』這是一首閩 南詩,曾經安慰幫助了不少的人,也曾經安慰幫 助了我。

菲律賓的氣候變幻無常。有時艷陽高照, 遍地如洗過那麼清潔新鮮,使人有爽涼的 感覺,有時風雲突變,雷聲震耳欲聾,其 聲音令人汗毛豎立。雨水也隨之傾盆而 下,這種情景令我想到人的心情如天氣易 變,有時憂悶,有時快樂。聖經上傳道書 第3章4節:『哭有時,笑有時,哀慟有 時,跳舞有時。』

基督徒的生命,難免要經受苦難的磨煉。 如雨水是花木所需要,基督徒也需要苦 難。苦難對世人是悲劇,對基督徒卻不是 這樣,苦難對我們是有益。詩篇119篇71 節:『我受苦與我有益,為要使我學習禰 的律例。』羅馬書8章28節:『萬事都互 相效力,叫愛上帝的人得益處,就是按祂 旨意被召的人。』萬事包括苦難,也包括 快樂。基督徒的生命是得勝的生命,不可 被壓在苦難之下,而是要升到苦難之上。

我們總覺得苦難很不容易接受,常有逃避 的心。這是很正常的反應,但是在我們心 裡有浩大的能力,可以用神的眼光看苦 難,並經歷祂的得勝,使苦難化成祝福。 雨水可以滋潤萬物,風雨使樹木堅固,同 樣地苦難對我們亦是有益。許多寶貴的功 課在苦難中學習,許多的美德在苦難中培 養出來,許多的真理亮光在苦難中發現領 悟。

人的一生不是事事一帆風順,有挫折苦 難,有掙扎。但這並不是徒然,這些反 令我們更成熟,對人生慢慢有了新的看 法。讓我們感謝那管理風雨的主,因祂不 但知道我們生命中所遇到的風雨,而且伸 手來扶持我們,在祂所定的時間叫風雨停 止。 ▲



苦難中持守純正

為什麼他有這挑戰呢?原來神容許撒但毀他所有的,包括他的家產和七子三女。約伯不在這一切事上犯罪, 也不以神為愚妄。他在地上下拜說:『我赤身出於母胎,也必赤身歸回。賞賜的是耶和華。收取的也是耶 和華。耶和華的名是應當稱頌的。』(伯1:21)撒但 認為約伯所有被毀後必當面棄掉神,撒但認為約伯事 奉神是因神的祝福,撒但同時認為神用恩典恩賜買人 心來敬拜祂。約伯在第一次苦難的反應是可敬佩的, 他敬拜,順服並稱頌神,約伯的見証否認撒但的控 告,彰顯了神的榮耀。 撒但第二次擊打約伯本身,使他從腳掌到 頭頂長瘡,但神要撒但存留約伯的性命。 神有時容許撒但試探我們,但神限制它的 活動。在這情形下,約伯妻子看見他受不 該受的苦就挑戰他說:『你仍然持守你的 純正麼?你棄掉神,死了罷。』(伯2:9) 約伯卻對她說:『你說話像愚頑的婦人 一樣。曖,難道我們從神手裏得福,不也 受禍麼?在這一切的事上,約伯並不以口 犯罪。』(伯2:10)約伯妻子認為神似乎 不看顧不關心約伯,她認為約伯所受的 苦是不應該,因為神稱約伯為完全正直敬 畏神,遠離惡事的人。(伯1:8,2:3)

約伯受苦時得三友以利法,比勒達, 瑣法之拜訪,各人從本處約會同來,為他 悲傷,安慰他。他們陪他七天七夜坐在 地上,一個人也不向他說一句話,因為他 極其痛苦。朋友如何能安慰受苦的人呢? 最好是與他在一起,靜默地表同情。

約伯極其痛苦,於約伯記第三章記載他發 言求死咒詛自己的生日。為什麼約伯要受 苦呢?他自己不明白,三友也不明白。 但約伯與三友有三回合辯論受苦之難題, 記載於四章至四十一章。在三回合中, 三友指出約伯受苦是受神之罰,他們認為 受苦是因他過去犯了罪,他們認為無人在 神前可以稱為義,遭禍者決非善人,約伯 遇禍,証明他不是善人,乃苦難罪孽之 結果。在三回合中許多人生哲理及『先祖 神學。不為易明;也不容易摸到其辯論的 中心思想。在第一回合中,他們以神的 性情為主題;在第二回合中,他們的辯論 環繞在『惡人之報』;在第三回合中, 他們都直斥約伯的不義。約伯在三回中不 承認自己有錯,他以天地皆証明自己實是 無辜,他要求神為他伸冤。約伯三友認為 神在管教,如同準確的審判官,他們辯護 神是公義,而忽略神的主權。約伯在三回 合中,以神為專制無情的審判者,他認為 神是不公正。為要辯護神的主權,約伯忽 略了神的公義。

以利戶在約伯記32至37章提示苦難之目 的,不限於神之罰,且也有教益之目的。 乃出自神之美意,為教訓成全祂的子女。 以利戶對苦難的看法與約伯三友不同, 他認為三友指出約伯在過去犯了罪,所以 被神刑罰,以利戶則認為約伯受苦有別的 目的,是造就信徒。他看見約伯在受苦過 程中的態度不討神喜悅,約伯有自以為 義的自高態度。以利戶認為苦難是指引 人,認識一位憐憫人的神,神以恩典為標 準。以利戶講完,神在約伯記38至41章 回答約伯,神叫約伯注意看神的創造有說 不盡的奇妙,祂固然造偉大動物,也關心 微小的鳥蟲。這段指出神之偉大,權能, 智慧,仁愛,榮耀。約伯因此覺悟自己 的無知,無能,不義,和卑微。他說: 『我是卑賤的。我用甚麽回答禰呢?只 好用手搞口。』(伯40:3-4)約伯承認過 去之愚昧,現經歷真神權能旨意之奇妙 (伯42:1-6)。他又見証說:『我從前 風聞有禰,現在親眼看見禰。因此我 厭惡自己,在塵土和爐灰中懊悔。』 (伯42:5-6)他看清楚神,也看清楚 自己。他經過苦難後,看見萬事皆有神的 美旨,在一切的經歷中安然順受,等祂 旨意顯明,約伯至終得神雙倍之祝福。 約伯在苦難中持守他的純正,雖然曾經 求死,埋怨神,他仍然抓住神,神在他 身上得榮耀。

A RICE BOWL: A SYMBOL OF SURRENDERING TO GOD

hen two people get married, it is natural for them to create a 'home' together. Within the constraints of their budget, they choose household items that reflect their tastes, preferences and personalities. This is what I call 'nesting.' Like birds that fly around in search of materials such as twigs, moss, leaves to create nests for their eggs, human beings care about how they furnish their homes.

When children come along, the acquisition of children's clothes, toys, furniture and the like keeps the curating of one's home moving forward. It is only when children grow up, move away, and create their own little nests that people start thinking of 'downsizing.' I am now in the middle of the curve of downsizing. As I get older, I find a diminishing desire to accumulate material things. In fact, in the past few years, I have asked my sons to give me gifts that are 'consumable' and/or 'recyclable.' Delicious food items are consumed and usually leave little trace except for their recyclable packaging. 'Events' or 'experiences' are most welcomed! This year, for my birthday, my son Christopher took me to an art gallery in Cambridge, dinner at a new Chinese restaurant and finally, a movie about Queen. There is nothing more enduring than the joy of his company etched into my memory.

Next year, I shall reach a significant age when I am classified as 'retired' in the English system. My sons will want to mark the occasion with a 'tangible' gift. I have thought that I would ask them for a Chinese rice bowl!

The rice bowl bears two aspects of my roots. It is Chinese, and it is traditionally associated with the female. Rice is the Asian staple food and having one's fill of it means one is satisfied and has no fear of hunger. Hunger often led to revolutions and the toppling of dynasties; by 200 AD, China already had the same population that England has today which is about 60+ million people!

In many other continents, feeding the family has long been associated with the female. The woman is in charge of hospitality and home. In an early 13th century diary by the Japanese Lady Nijo, consort of the emperor Go-Fukakusa, there was an interesting account of the distinction between the births of a royal son and a royal daughter. When a son was born, a sword was presented to him. When a daughter was born, a rice kettle was rolled down the north side of the roof of the palace.

I choose a rice bowl not only for its traditional Chinese connotations but more for its paradoxical symbolism of satisfaction and surrender. The goal of all human desiring is God. Our deepest satisfaction resides in God and God alone. Our relationship with God does not exist alongside our many other relationships. It is rather the very axis on which all our human relationships rest. In loving God, we learn to love our spouses, families, friends, neighbours and even our enemies truly.

A rice bowl must first be empty before it is filled. Similarly, we must empty and surrender ourselves and our interior spaces to the indwelling of God. Someone recently asked me why it was "easier for a camel to pass through a gate than for a rich man to go to heaven." I replied that it is not because God hates rich people per se. Indeed, in the New Testament, there are three persons described as being 'loved' by Jesus: (1) John who sat next to him in the Last Supper, (2) Lazarus whom he raised from the dead and finally (3) the rich young man who could not give up his riches to follow Jesus. Jesus did not hate the young man. He loved and pitied him because the latter, despite his good and sincere intentions, could not empty his heart, fill it solely with God's Will and follow Jesus.

Jesus warned against the tendency of rich people to depend on their wealth as a solution to everything. He also warned sternly against the Sadducees and Pharisees for their sense of 'self-sufficiency' and 'self-righteousness' in spiritual matters. Beloved by Jesus were the materially poor and poor-in-spirit the impoverished widow who felt that she did not have enough for the temple offering save for her two small copper coins, and the unknown humble man praying behind a closed door, 'Have mercy on me, O God, a sinner!'

God longs for all people to come to him. He longs to have a real relationship with the poor and the rich, young and old, female and male, healthy and infirmed. God, however, is a most courteous God. He does not force himself upon those he loves. He waits for us patiently and longingly. He waits for us to empty our hearts of our pressing human concerns, goals and desires. All we need is to say "Yes," and in our total surrender, we shall have 'Life, a real abundant Life' as Jesus promised.

God's love is a love that knows no beginning or end, just like the eternal rim of a rice bowl. His love is the wellspring that never runs out of goodness, light and joy. It is the source that satisfies us and inspires us to act kindly and compassionately towards our co-sojourners in life. By feeding, helping and supporting the less fortunate amongst us, we have a foretaste of God's hospitality and unutterable generosity.

I look forward to the consummation of Time and to the Heavenly Feast when the Lamb of God puts a bowl of rice in each of our cupped hands and say, "Have your fill, my beloved brothers and sisters! Eat and drink with me, as you have shared the good news of my Life, my Incarnation, my Cross and my Resurrection on Earth!"

OH, FOR THE GRACE OF GOD

race. For the past few months, I have pondered on this word. I discovered that this word gives strength to people when there seems to be no more hope in their lives. It helps them smile even when the pain is unbearable. It helps them to keep living, even when it seems like there is no reason left to live.

And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ, Philippians 1:6 (ESV) Most importantly, grace helps people realize their mortality. They are able to recognize their very humanity and their flaw due to the sinful nature.

Every night before I fall asleep, I would always ponder why would an omnipotent, super-intelligent being display an act of grace to a race which failed Him time and time again for the past 7,000 or so years? Why would He even bother showing Himself to me, a small and insignificant child, that fateful day on July 31, 2010 at 11:21 A.M.?

It just seems so unreal to me. When He could simply destroy this world and start all over in creating a new race and Earth, He chose to keep us all alive and show us His mercy and grace and love in the most unconditional way possible: sending His one and only Son to die for people who never even wanted to be saved in the first place. That is grace. To receive something that you do not even deserve to have, that is grace.

Every time I think about it, I simply cannot comprehend just how much of a debt that we once owed was completely and permanently cancelled for the sake of love. This gift is God's grace. From my point of view, I see God's grace as something very precious and important in my life. God gave me a journey that I can look back with pride and awe. God showed me His grace through instances that were rare.

I came from a non-Christian family and I believed that as long as you were behaving morally, then that was all there was to it in this life and the life after that. I never understood God's grace, and never knew what He wanted in my life. I just simply thought of Him as someone who could judge you when you die. If you behave morally, then you get to stay with Him in Heaven. If you did things that were not good by moral standards, then you deserve to go to hell. Simply put, I had a typical mindset of the afterlife.

But one fateful night, being a Grade 2 student, I never would have expected that people of my age at that time would ask themselves of what they were doing, what the direction they were taking so far in their lives, and whether the things they believed in were the right thing or not. I struggled long and hard to find the answer to this "right path" I have been constantly looking for. For the first time in my life, I felt so helpless that tears could not come out and all I could do was sit down and stare at the floor.

My mind was drifting in thought: If I were to die now, where would I go? It was one of the most frustrating moments I have felt so far in my life, but that was also the time when I started to learn God's grace, although it was just a glimpse.

I learned that the only way to salvation was through Jesus Christ and if you obey His Word, you would be saved. Upon hearing that, I felt a surge of relief that there was a way to salvation, that there really was a "right path".

At that point, all I understood was that Jesus died for my sins and if you follow every word in the "prayer" the teacher tells you to follow, then you can go to heaven. But something in my heart urged me to go even further. I felt a thirst that I wanted to quench so bad. I wanted to read the Bible.

With no one to teach me and just borrowing my sister's Bible (because I did not have any), I began reading. I started at Genesis and then Exodus and eventually finished the Pentateuch but gave up reading by the time I reached Joshua.

It took me 2 years to finish the first five books of the Bible, and after reading Genesis and Exodus I felt as though I was starting to understand God's plan. But upon reading Leviticus, I started questioning the purpose of God putting all these laws that I barely understood, and how were they able to keep up with all the laws if they couldn't be grateful to God for even a week after being saved by the Egyptians from the Red Sea.

With these kinds of thoughts, I just kept on reading until I gave up on the book of Joshua. Once I gave up reading Joshua, I stopped caring about God and Christianity. I thought that was the end of my spiritual life, that that was all there was to it. But God had other plans; He reminded me that he who began a good work in you will be faithful to complete it at the day of Jesus Christ. All I have to do was to keep running, because it is not we who run the race. It is the Holy Spirit running the race, making sure that I finish this race...

A year after I gave up reading my Bible, PCGS had its Christ Emphasis Week for the elementary department. I was assigned to a male Values Education teacher named Pastor Alfie Bugtai. By the second day of the week, I saw God's grace as Pastor Alfie shared more on God's Word. At 11:21 AM, on July 31, 2010, I accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior.

It is not because of our moral goodness that we are able to go to heaven; it is because Jesus died for us and gave us a way to heaven. I saw salvation more clearly than I have ever seen in my 11 years of life at that time. For the first time, I saw that life was not all about who was the greatest or who was the smartest, but it was all because of Jesus that we are saved.

Eventually, I started taking my walk with Christ a little more seriously after accepting Christ as my Lord and Savior. But God did not want me to just simply pray and trust in Him; He also wanted me to learn more about Him through His word.

At one point, I lost all my friends due to a rumor that I was gay. In all honesty, I felt terrible. All the people I trusted and once talked to started ridiculing me, telling me that I did not belong with them because I was different from them. With all those thoughts running through my head, I started becoming more and more depressed and I grew lonelier and lonelier as time passed.

Then one day, Pastor Alfie showed me a passage from the Bible in the Gospels talking about

Jesus' crucifixion. Upon reading that passage, a fire within my heart lit up. I had the urge to keep reading, and so I started reading through the Gospels and then the Book of Acts, then the Pauline Epistles and I ended up finishing the New Testament in four months. Never have I felt so contented and filled with the Spirit than those four months. Though my circle of friends was small, I had the Bible that kept me going.

In his book "Necessary Endings," Dr. Henry Cloud writes that there are three types of people: the wise, the foolish, and the evil. You cannot deal with them the same way.

If you try to deal with a foolish person in the same way that you deal with a wise person, he will drive you crazy. You will lose time, resources, and heart. And if you deal with an evil person at all, you might lose your business or your life.¹

A wise person adjusts his behavior when shown the right way. The foolish person, on the other hand, becomes defensive when given honest feedback. They start to think a lot of excuses. It wasn't their fault! Blame the machine! Their co-workers! Even the weather!

Any businessperson will tell you that the most valuable commodity they own is time. Everybody has twentyfour hours a day, and there is no way to get more. Time represents money, and so we must guard it with all diligence.

As such, we should identify what type of person we are talking to, be they an employee, a customer, or a supplier. Are they wise and willing to learn? If so, you can take time to help or enlighten them. Or are they foolish, very defensive, and are not open to new ideas? If so, not only is your effort a waste of your time, it is even resented by the fool! It's better to just avoid them and spend your time on other things.

How to Manage a Difficult Employee

Dig Deeper. Investigate what is causing the employee's behavior, and offer to help with the underlying issue.

Give Direct Feedback. Some people don't realize the impact of their own behavior. Give honest feedback grounded in the work, and not a personal attack.

Explain the Consequences. Find out what the employee cares the most about, and put that at stake if they don't change their behavior.

Accept that some people won't change. There are just some people who won't change, and do this for fun and believe they can get away with it.

Document everything. It is very hard to fire someone without just cause. Gather all the evidence for when the time comes to let them go.

Quarantine them. Toxic attitudes can quickly spread like a disease. Put as much physical distance between them and other employees as possible, and try to minimize their interactions.

Don't get distracted. It is draining to manage a difficult employee, but don't forget they are not the only one you are managing. Keep yourself healthy, and surround yourself with supportive and positive people

Many people think that being generous in business is a waste of money. Why should you treat people better and give them more than what is expected of you? They equate giving with losing. But is having a reputation for being generous and helping others really a bad business strategy? What does being generous in business mean anyway? To quote from a Forbes Magazine article:²

It's about being willing to give a piece of yourself or offering an invaluable gift of your time and expertise or extending your network to someone you care to have a relationship with. It's about caring enough to make someone else successful first ... It's about empowering those around you through a simple word of encouragement and inspiration at a time when it matters the most. All without expecting something back.

In short, it means you must treat others as human beings and be generous to everything you do and everyone you interact with. Not just to your

employees and customers, but also to your business partners and even the community around you. Although you may feel that this is an unnecessary expense, it actually makes very good business sense today, when competition has shifted from price to service quality.

Take for example, the case of online shoe retailer Zappos. Founded in 1999 and later acquired by Amazon.com in 2009, Zappos, under its CEO **Tony Hsieh**, decided on a unique approach to both customer service and working culture – generosity!

The company has a reputation for dedicated employees willing to go above and beyond the call of duty to meet the needs of every customer and make them happy. Its free returns, generous 365day return policy, and habit of surprising customers with random free upgrades from standard to overnight shipping, puts a smile on the face of customers. As Hsieh said in an interview, "The shoes may wear out, but they will always remember that feeling they got from the experience.³"

While these policies can be quite expensive and are strictly not necessary, Hsieh was maximizing the customer experience and not efficiency. In a Harvard Business Review article, Hsieh attributes Zappos' growth due to investments of time, money, and resources into three key areas: customer service, company culture, and employee training.⁴

Many companies used the power of generosity to increase the power of their brand and the dedication of their stakeholders. **Tom's Shoes**, which donates a pair of shoes to a child in a poor country every time you buy a pair of shoes from them.

Lego, which ranks second on the Reputation Institute's 2019 Most Reputable Companies Worldwide, made public commitments to protect the environment and practice ethical business.

Even **Microsoft**, which was reviled not so long ago as the "Evil Empire," has a good reputation today because of the philanthropic practices of both the company and its founder Bill Gates, who has dedicated most of his \$90 billion fortune to charity before his death.⁵

LESSON 7 Live Within Your Means

PROVERBS 12:9

Better to be lowly and have a servant than to play the great man and lack bread

Pretending to be bigger than you are is a sure way to run into trouble in business, and a common reason why small businesses fail.⁶ Many business owners confuse initial success with opportunity instead of focusing on slow but steady growth.

You only need to look at one of China's "ghost cities" in order to appreciate the danger of living beyond your means. Real estate developers invest a lot of money into new planned cities, hoping that manufacturers will come in, and bring in the workers and their families. Most of these investments were financed with loans, which left the developers in a very dangerous situation if the occupancy rate turns out to be low.

When the "if you build it, they will come" adage goes terribly wrong, you are left with nothing, except for the shells of empty buildings, most of them half-finished. The problem is so prevalent that China's commerce minister warned that companies should not "expand blindly."⁷

Overexpansion is a problem even for big firms, especially in the food industry. **Subway's**, the biggest fast-food chain in the world, grew rapidly to over 27,000 stores at the end of 2015. But store sales declined due to oversaturation, and many franchise owners are now in open rebellion against the franchisor.⁸

In the Philiippines, **Global Restaurant Concepts Inc.**, the local franchise holder of California Pizza Kitchen, International House of Pancakes, and Applebee's, went from zero to 19 food outlets in 3 years. But in 2000, they were forced to closed seven stores.

The 2000 global economic crisis undoubtedly played a major role in the decision. But the main culprit was inventory leakage. Because of their rapid expansion, the company failed to maintain its internal control system. Because of this, the company suffered losses from food wastage and theft.⁹

Seven Ways Rapid Growth Can Kill Your Business

- 1. Cash Flow. Many people cannot distinguish between profit and cash flow. A business that's growing needs a lot of free cash flow to invest in fixed assets. However, if a business invests too much, it will start to bleed cash. If this keeps up, and even if a business remains profitable, it will not take long before regular suppliers cannot be paid, and the business and must declare bankruptcy.
- 2. Working Capital Requirements. Another common source of confusion some people have is the difference between revenues (sales) and profit. Money coming in from customers should not be considered profit, because you need to pay all of your expenses and replace the goods you just sold. Working capital increases when your business grows, and a business that grows too fast will quickly find its situation unsustainable.
- Operational issues. As a business grows, so does the complexity of its day-to-day operations. It becomes very challenging to manage so many moving parts and can easily overwhelm the novice businessman.
- 4. Customer service issues. A fast-growing business will often face high demand for its goods and services. This may overwhelm its ability to meet the needs of customers, and the satisfaction rating and brand reputation will suffer.

In May 2019, the restaurant group owned by celebrity chef **Jamie Oliver** closed, closing 25 restaurants and leaving over 1,000 without jobs.¹⁰ While some are blaming the Brexit decision and increased competition from other casual dining restaurants for the closure, cash problems from recent expansions were the root cause for the collapse.

Take Solomon's wisdom to heart. Live within your means, and don't try to be someone you're not. You (and the bottom line of your business) will be much happier that way.

- 5. Human Resource risks. Working for a small firm is very different from working for a bigger firm. The culture in a smaller firm can be more caring and personal, while big firms have strictly professional relationships and even office politics. This can turn off some of your best and earliest employees. A business may begin with a set of values, but they can easily be overwhelmed by the values of the new hires due to expansion. In a big firm, there are more opportunities for tension between employees, and this can drain valuable time from a company's managers. Time that they could have spent on other more productive pursuits.
- 6. Decision-making changes. As a company grows, the founder must step back from day-to-day operations and delegate responsibility. Therefore, he or she is more disconnected from the customer and the rank and file employee, which will affect the quality of decision-making.
- 7. Leadership risks. Some people are good at taking risks, while some are better as managers. As a company expands, the management and leadership skills become more important than entrepreneurial ability. Any leadership faults will quickly be exposed and affect the company.

Elon Musk, CEO of electric carmaker Tesla Inc., is a visionary often compared to Thomas Edison, who is perhaps America's greatest inventor. In addition to his vision for environmentally friendly cars and a solar-powered society, he has dreams to offer space tourism, shoot people through underground tunnels in a "Hyperloop", and even colonize Mars.

Unfortunately, he has a habit of behaving erratically, with problems controlling his mouth. In 2018 alone, he insulted stock analysts covering his company, smoked marijuana live in an interview, and made a joke on Twitter that caused the U.S. Securities & Exchange Commission to charge him with misleading investors.¹¹ Tesla was already in poor financial condition in 2018; its CEO's antics made the situation worse.

Elon Musk is not the only offender. **Michael Leary**, CEO of discount airliner Ryanair, called customers who show up at an airport without a boarding pass as "stupid." **Chip Wilson**, the founder of Lululemon (seller of yoga-inspired athletic apparel), suggested that some customers were too heavy for his company's yoga pants. **Mike Jeffries**, the CEO of fashion retailer Abercrombie and Fitch, once said¹² he only wants to sell clothes to "cool, good-looking people."

Joseph Calata was hailed as a genius when he became the Philippines' youngest self-made billionaire.¹³ The fall from grace was swift. In quick succession, the company was investigated by the PSE for stock manipulation, and the SEC ordered the delisting of Calata Corp. from the stock exchange due to several violations of securities laws.

The less Joseph Calata says, the better for him. But he can't resist defiantly playing the victim.

The unapologetic Calata cried Filipino crab mentality, saying that the violations were all honest mistakes all young entrepreneurs can commit. This defiance caused the SEC to impose a harsh penalty, banning him from leading or sitting on the board of a publicly-listed company for life.

The Chinese saying 「病從口入, 禍從口出」 literally translates as: "Disease goes in through the mouth, and trouble comes out through the mouth." This advice exists in many other languages. English has "If you don't have anything nice to say, don't say it at all." Bisaya has "daghang sulti, daghang sayop; way sulti, way sayop" — more talk more mistakes, no talk, no mistakes.

These adages apply equally to business as they do to life. If you say good and sensible things, you will reap its fruits. If you can't control your mouth, and either say something bad about someone else or start blurting out your company secrets, that's when you get in trouble. In the past, what you say might blow up very fast, but just as quickly be forgotten once something more juicy comes out.

Today however, everything that you say and do can be preserved forever on the Internet and circulated again and again on social media for years to come. So, since something said or done decades ago can and will return to haunt you, be very careful what you say!

RIVER, SEA, AND MOUNTAIN

hen the Israelites departed from the bondage of slavery in the land of Egypt, they had to pass through wilderness, leap over rivers, and climb through high mountains before they could reach the promised land of Canaan.

Similarly, when a Christian is running the race to heaven, he must also experience hardship, climb over mountains, and ford rivers and seas before he can reach the heavenly home. Let us examine the path taken by the Israelites:

1. NILE RIVER (EXODUS 2:3-10)

When the new king of Egypt saw that the Israelites had become numerous and very progressive, he ordered all Hebrew babies to be killed when they were born.

When Moses was born, his mother kept him for three months. But later, when she could no longer hide him, she placed the child in a papyrus basket coated with tar and pitch and left him at the bank of the Nile.

His sister Miriam stood at a distance to observe. Later, when the daughter of Pharaoh went down to the **Nile** to bathe, she saw the baby crying and pitied him. She adopted him as her child and named him "Moses," which meant "I drew him out of the water".



3. RED SEA (EXODUS 7-11)

Pharaoh hardened his heart and would not allow Moses to bring the Israelites out of Egypt even after experiencing the Nine Plagues. But after the Lord slaughtered every first-born son of Egypt, he summoned Moses and Aaron and urged them to hurry and leave the country with the Israelites.

But later, when Pharaoh saw that there were no one left to serve them, he changed his heart again and took his best chariots along with his armies to pursue the Israelites. When the Israelites saw the **Red Sea** in front of them and Pharaoh's army behind them, they were frightened.

But God performed a miracle by opening up the **Red Sea** and allowed the Israelites to pass through. Those chariots, horsemen and armies of Pharaoh who followed them were all swept away, lying dead in the shore.



2. MOUNT HOREB (EXODUS 3:1-10)

The Lord had seen the misery of His people in Egypt and heard their cry of suffering. So He appeared to Moses at **Mount Horeb** via the Burning Bush. He was sending Moses to Pharaoh to bring His people out of Egypt.



4. MOUNT SINAI (EXODUS 19)

The Lord called Moses to the top of **Mount Sinai**. He spoke to him the 10 Commandments and told His people to obey them.



6. JORDAN RIVER

The **Jordan River** played an important role in several Biblical events:

- When the Levite priests carried the Ark of the Covenant and set foot at the Jordan River, its water flowing downstream was cut off and stood up in a heap. All the people of Israel passed by until the whole nation had completed the crossing on dry ground. (Joshua 3)
- Naaman's leprosy was healed at the Jordan River (2 Kings 5:1-14)
- Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist at the Jordan River (Mat. 3:13-17)





5. MOUNT NEBO (DEUT. 34:1-8)

Moses climbed to the top of **Mount Nebo** and the Lord showed him the whole land that He had promised to the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.



7. MOUNT GERIZIM / MOUNT EBAL (JOSHUA 8:30-33)

Joshua built an altar on **Mount Ebal** and offered a Burnt Offering and several Fellowship Offerings. Joshua copied the law of Moses onto stones there.

All the Israelites were standing on both sides in front of the Levite priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord. Half of the people stood in front of **Mount Gerizim** and half of them in front of **Mount Ebal**.

Afterwards, Joshua read all the Word of the Law to the whole assembly of Israelites about the Blessings and the Curses – just as it was written in the Book of the Law.

SYMBOLISM

What do the RIVER, SEA AND MOUNTAIN symbolize?

1. Nile River: Salvation

Moses was saved by Pharaoh's daughter, who drew him out of the water and adopted him as her son. Similarly, we are saved from the bondage of sin by Jesus' blood and are called the "children of God."

2. Mount Horeb: Ministry

God called Moses to go and lead the Israelites out of Egypt. God is also calling us to go and preach the gospel and serve Him.

3. Red Sea: Separation

The people of Israel was free from the bondage of slavery. They passed through the **Red Sea** to reach Canaan, the land of milk and honey. God wants to separate us from the bondage of sin and bring us through life's journey to His glorious kingdom in heaven.

4. Mount Sinai: Obedience

God had given the Ten Commandments to the Israelites at **Mount Sinai** for them to observe. Today, God also gives us His Word - the Bible for us to obey.

5. Mount Nebo: Faith

God showed to the Israelites all the land He had promised them at Mount Nebo. Similarly, God will fulfill all His promises to us if we trust in Him.

- 6. Jordan River:

7. Mount Gerizim: Blesssings

Mount Ebal: Curses

If the people of Israel disobey God's laws, they will be cursed. If we disobey God's Word, expect curses to befall us.

Introduction

William Ross Wallace wrote in 1865 a poem entitled "The Hand that Rocks the Cradle is the Hand that Rules the World." What did he mean with that poem? Mothers have a special role and an important responsibility given by God that is to care and nurture their children. They have a privileged opportunity to make an influence and impact their children who will eventually impact our society and our world.

Wallace is a native of Lexington, Kentucky. His father, a Presbyterian pastor, died when he was just an infant. He understood the difficulty and struggles of a single mom, widowed and facing parenthood alone. She needed to be both the provider and nurturer. Although today, many families are operating on a dual-income family, meaning both parents are working. Needless to say, raising a family alone is a huge and difficult task.

Let me share a stanza of this poem that reflects how Wallace honored mothers. First, he acknowledged the divine mission of mothers. Second, he reminded mothers of the opportunity to teach their children to trust in God. Lastly, Wallace believed that the success of a person is attributed to the hardship and sacrifices of a mother.

> Woman, how divine your mission Here upon our natal sod! Keep, oh, keep the young heart open Always to the breath of God! All true trophies of the ages Are from mother-love impearled; For the hand that rocks the cradle Is the hand that rules the world.

Dear mothers, and even fathers, grandparents, aunts, and uncles: if the Lord has placed in our hands that opportunity to influence and minister to a child, DO NOT TAKE THIS LIGHTLY. This is a very important responsibility. The daily opportunities to see them, talk to them, listen to them, play with them, read to them, advise them, pray with them, and model for them what it means to love the Lord and trust the Lord are oh so precious. The family is the basic unit of a society. It is imperative for us as Christians to build godly families to the praise and glory of God. For a godly family will affect and influence a community, a society, and a country.

So how can a mother best make a lasting impact on her children? It's by discipling them.

Paul discipled Timothy, but Paul acknowledged in this letter to Timothy the impact and influence of two godly women who greatly influenced and impacted the life of Timothy. Paul did not grab all the glory to himself for having a faithful disciple like Timothy. Instead, he encouraged Timothy by reminding him of his godly heritage that he was actually first discipled by his mother Eunice, who in turn was discipled by his grandmother Lois.

Acts 16:1-2 says, "Paul came to Derbe and then to Lystra, where a disciple named Timothy lived, whose mother was Jewish and a believer but whose father was a Greek. The believers at Lystra and Iconium spoke well of him."

In this passage, we see that Timothy was a believer and a disciple (meaning growing and exemplifying faith and devotion to God) and was highly-regarded. He had a good testimony and people liked him. He brought honor to his parents and even grandparents. Lois and Eunice must be very proud of him.

By using the life of Timothy, and the impact of his mother and grandmother in his life, I want to share these three points on how we can disciple our children.

How Do Mothers Disciple Their Children?

1. Mothers must pass on a godly heritage.

What do I mean by a godly heritage? A heritage is the transmitted ancestral or cultural traditions, customs, and practices. As Chinese-Filipinos, we want to impart to our children our ethnic Chinese heritage by passing on the cultural traditions like employing the *Minnanhua* language, attending Chinese school, celebrating Chinese festivities, and at times even encouraging our children to find a Chinese life partner. A godly heritage is to pass on to our children Christian traditions, practices, and beliefs, with the hope that they will adhere to these and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ. Proverbs 22:6 (NASB) says, "Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he will not depart from it." Even though Eunice married a Greek and lived in Lystra (present day Turkey), she maintained her Jewish heritage by being God-fearing. Lystra became a Roman colony in 6 BC. It was possible that Lois and Eunice were part of the Jewish diaspora that went to Asia Minor and settled there.

Why did the Jews leave Jerusalem? We need to remember that in the Old Testament account, going to exile was the ultimate punishment of God for the Jews' idolatry and unfaithfulness. Not all Jews scattered during the Babylonian Empire were able to return to Judea with Ezra and Nehemiah during the Persian Empire.

This could be the case of Lois and Eunice. Living as diaspora Jews, they did not forget or give up their godly heritage. The fact that Eunice gave her son the name Timothy or Timotheos in Greek, which means "honoring God" or "precious to God," showed how she passed on that godly heritage.

Why did Eunice marry a Greek man? It could be because of love. It could be because there's no Jewish male available. At one point in the history of the Chinese in the Philippines, there were more Chinese males than Chinese females. This led to scarcity of Chinese women for marriage. This scarcity led to many Chinese men finding Chinese Mestizas or Filipinas for marriage.

Despite the fact that Eunice married a Gentile, she passed on a godly heritage to her son Timothy. Eunice's marital situation did not discourage her from maintaining her faith and passing her godly heritage to her son. She could have taught him Hebrew, brought him to the synagogues, made him memorize the Scriptures, obey the Jewish Law and etc.

As mothers, we can pass on a godly heritage by setting up a godly environment in the home. Make sure that God is honored, and His word is taught in the home. Practices like praying before eating or sleeping are good ways to honor God. Reading the Scriptures together, or teaching them how to read or establish daily quiet time, is crucial for them to see the relevance of God's Word in their lives.

We pass on a godly heritage when we give testimonies of how God answers our prayers, how awesome are his creations, how he performed miracles and wonderful acts of grace. It is important we audibly tell our children that our God is real and not just a fairy-tale character.

2. Mothers must pass on their faith.

A godly heritage may not necessarily result to faith in God. A godly heritage can simply be practicing Jewish culture and traditions. In the case of Timothy, his mother not only passed on a godly heritage, but also her faith to him. What proof do we have? Timothy was already a disciple—a follower of Jesus—when Paul met him. He was first discipled by his mother and grandmother (2 Tim. 1:5). We can presume that these godly women taught him the teachings of the Scriptures even before they had heard of the Gospel about Jesus. The teachings of the Scriptures can be said as foundation for faith in God and eventually faith in Jesus.

When Paul and Silas came to Lystra by AD 48 during their first missionary journey, Lois, Eunice, and Timothy could have heard them preach the gospel, saw them perform miracles, and witnessed how they endured persecutions. The missionary journey of Paul and Silas did bear fruit such that by the time Paul journeyed again to Lystra, he encountered Timothy as a disciple who is highly-regarded by the believers.

We need to remember that it is our responsibility to share the Gospel, but we can never force our children to come to faith. Nevertheless, we must continue to pray for them and pray with them.

I remember sharing the Gospel message when Johann was two years old and he prayed with me then. But I know I needed to fan the fire and constantly helped him to understand the Gospel message. When he turned four, he joined his very first VBS. His counselor shared the Gospel message to him, and he also prayed to accept Jesus. When the counselor told me this, I cried. I was filled with joy because I felt assured that he understood the gospel message even in his young age.

When Johann reached eight, he decided to have his baptism. The Kentucky church we attended back then allowed child baptism with parental consent and the Sunday School teacher's recommendation. At first, I was anxious that Johann might not fully understood what baptism was all about. After my husband talked to him about baptism and following Jesus, both of us, as his parents, were assured that he was sincere in his desire to be baptized. On that chilly Easter Sunday of 2012, my son was baptized and made a public declaration that he wanted to follow Jesus. My heart was filled with joy. How can we pass on this faith?

First, pray. My good friend Teena one time shared with me that she would lay her hand and pray for her daughters before they left for school. She has been doing this practice since they started schooling. She said this helped her children recognize that God cares for them and that they can trust in Him. Further, this practice also helps them realize that God is sovereign, and they should seek to live for God and seek His help always. When my son started going to school, I also started to do this every morning. I pray a simple and short prayer (since we often are in a hurry to catch the school van) but it seeks God's blessing, protection and strength for the day.

Second, share the gospel message in portions or based on the age level.

Third, model your faith. Live in godliness and in fear of God. This brings us to the third point.

3. Mothers must pass on godly character.

Having faith in God and having Christ as Lord and Savior ought to lead to a godly character. But we all know that this is not always the case. As Christians, we are bombarded by various trials and temptations that may cause us to respond the wrong way and sin against men and against God.

No wonder Paul reminded us in Romans 12:2 that we should be careful not to conform to the pattern of this world, and its sinful and dark influences and practices. Rather, we should be transformed by the word of God and live holy lives.

As parents, every day, we exemplify what it means to be Christians. How we respond in trials and temptations will also reveal our faith and devotion to God. It is crucial then that the fruit of the Spirit is evident in our daily life. Bill Bright was greatly used by God as he established Campus Crusade for Christ. In his biography, he mentioned the impact of the sacrificial love of his mother, Mary Lee. Mary was a Methodist who experienced personal conversion at age 16. She was a devout Christian. She woke up early in the morning for her devotion and attended church regularly. She was a schoolteacher before marriage. With this training, she made sure her children developed intellectually. She read to them nightly.

The year before Bill was born, Mary Lee had a still birth. She became wary for the next child. She prayed to God if this child is born healthy and well, she would dedicate him for the Lord's use. Mary Lee never revealed this to Bill until later in his life when he became involved in the ministry. She remarked that she didn't want to influence him to enter the ministry. She wanted God to work in him and influence him to the ministry. Bill's fond memories of her mother are her sacrifices and her toil. In his own words:

"She (mother) was a very humble, quiet, gracious woman ... At mealtime, she was always the last person to eat because she wanted to be sure that everyone else was served first. Mother would eat what was left over. We lived five miles from the nearest community. Many times I would walk or run home from school, and she would walk a mile or two from our house to meet me, as she did with the rest of the kids. Then we'd stroll back together and talk about what was on our mind."

Conclusion and Challenge

Mothers, God gave us children not just for us to have heirs. God gave them to us to influence them to be good citizens and good parents themselves someday. Furthermore, to make a lasting impact, we must seek to impart to them a godly heritage, a godly faith and a godly character.

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. **Romans 12:2**

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND PAPER: THE

SADDUCEES

Origin and source

As early as the Maccabean period (164 BC - 63 BC), a Jewish sect was founded that would be known as the Sadducees.¹ This Sect was known for arising from the Jewish society's priestly aristocrats and this particular sect was more focused on acquiring political influence within the nation than on the religious aspects.²

This group was directly opposed by another Jewish sect known as the Pharisees, who were known for their mastery of Jewish laws. Whether it was from their differences in what they taught or towards political domination of the nation, these two groups were at odds with each other.³

Throughout the Maccabean period to the Roman occupation of Jerusalem (63 BC – 70 AD), these two groups would lay claim on the support of various high priests or political rulers to acquire political or religious leverage over one another.⁴ However, the origins of the Sadducees remain a mystery, as scholars have not discovered their true origins.

But as speculations go, these are some of the theories that scholars believe to be the origins of the group known as the Sadducees.

- Because of how closely the word Sadducee is to the word Zadok, this group is closely associated to a high priest named Zadok, who was the high priest during the reign of King David and his son Solomon.⁵ Most scholars point out that this Jewish sect originated from the priestly line of Zadok.

They derived their origins and role from the Greek word "syndikoi," which means judges or fiscal.⁶ This term would refer to an individual who would have responsibilities and authority in regards to upholding the law or having a mediatorial role, which coincidentally was what the Sadducees were known for.⁷
- 3. The origin of their name was derived from the Hebrew word "saddiq," which would mean the righteous ones.⁸ The problem with this theory is that there is no reason to think that the Sadducees claimed to be known or characterized themselves as the "righteous ones.⁹"

As it stands, these are the most probable theories that scholars provide in regards to the origin of the Sadducees. Consequently, theory number one is more widely accepted by scholars to be the most plausible of the three.

Development towards the NT Times

As early as 30 B.C., the Sadducee sect had suffered an abysmal loss of influence and power due to political affiliation that did not bode well for the group.¹⁰ It was only from 4-6 AD during the Roman occupation that the sect was able to acquire limited power due to their relationship with their Roman occupiers.¹¹

The reason why the Sadducees would try to build a relationship with their conquerors was because they came from aristocratic backgrounds and would prefer to maintain the status quo.¹² Consequently, the Sadducees would lean towards Hellenistic tendencies in order to maintain good relations with Rome. This led to an inevitable hatred from Jewish people as Jews saw the compromise of their culture an act of treason against God.

But on the part of the Sadducees, they were trying to ensure peace with Rome.¹³ Because of their ties with the Roman occupiers and their strict observance to Roman policies, the Sadducees were extremely prejudiced towards popular movements that had political overtones. Their prejudice was seen more vividly when the masses had started proclaiming a certain person to be the Messiah—Jesus.¹⁴

The Sadducees were also very exclusive of their circle of membership, ensuring only those of aristocratic background could join the group, thus assuring their dwindling numbers and immense unpopularity among the masses.¹⁵

Though small in numbers, the Sadducees were the primary members of the main Jewish tribunal leadership, the Sanhedrin.¹⁶ The Pharisees, on the other hand, had the approval of the Jewish people and compared to them, the Sadducees were viewed by the masses as crude, coarse, vulgar, and boorish people.¹⁷

Significance during Jesus' time

Contrary to what the Gospels say with regards to the Pharisees and Sadducees being portrayed as a similar group,¹⁸ they in fact were opponents of each other and one of the main issues they had towards one another was their varying or contrasting doctrinal views.¹⁹

A particular doctrinal issue that created problems against the Pharisees, which apparently was the main problem they had with Jesus Christ, was that the Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection of the dead. Their doctrinal view of the resurrection was directly against Christ's teachings of the resurrection;²⁰ this became a characteristic of the Sadducees as they were depicted in the Gospels.²¹

The Sadducees would confront Jesus by asking him questions regarding the mysteries of the resurrection and its absurdity, as was written in the Gospel of Matthew.²²

This particular contrast of ideals was not enough for the Sadducees to be alarmed with Jesus' ministry.²³ They were only concerned of the ministry of Jesus when people had started to recognize him as the Messiah. This ensured that the Sadducees would have to put an end to Jesus' life and the proclamations of him being the new king.

The Sadducees, being the majority members of the Sanhedrin, gave Jesus no chance of a fair trial or any other sentence but death; this was to safeguard the peace they had with Rome. The Sadducees would continue to persecute the Christians as they would perform miracles and testify of the risen Christ.²⁴

However, the fall of the Jerusalem temple in 70 AD proved to be too much of a political upheaval for the Sadducees to maintain their power and influence. This incident would eventually cause their demise and the total disappearance of the Jewish sect known as the Sadducees.²⁵

Other Information

In regards to their opposing doctrinal views with the Pharisees, the Sadducees had one in particular that would cause the most agitation between the two sects. The Sadducees had denied the authority of oral law.²⁶ In short, the Sadducees only viewed

the Laws of Moses as authoritative and everything else, be it the prophets or other books, as simply just books. Another doctrinal view that the Sadducees had was their rejection of the concept of fate and the acceptance of the idea of free will.²⁷

The group known as the Sadducees was not entirely a bad group of people. Despite having ulterior motives to maintain their political standing, they still managed to procure peace with Rome, be it for a limited time. Although the Gospels would depict this group as being quite similar to the Pharisees, they in fact were at odds with each other.

The Sadducees, being of significantly wealthy backgrounds, secured great political position within the Jewish community. However, they would fall prey to unpopularity as they tried to grovel towards their Roman occupiers to maintain the peace and the power they so enjoyed.

Within the records of the Gospels, it was depicted that the Pharisees and Sadducees would only be united in regards to their opposition to Jesus' ministry and that these two groups would go on to continue opposing the Christians as mentioned in the book of Acts.

Historical Background Paper: The Sadducees

The Sadducees was a relatively small religious sect, admitting only those of aristocratic background, that gained political power through its collaboration with the Roman occupiers.

Contrary to the Biblical portrayal, the Sadducees and the Pharisees were at odds with each other, with the resurrection of the dead being a major sticking point.

The Sadducees ensured Jesus' conviction through their majority control over the Sanhedrin, and continued to persecute early Christians in order to placate Rome.

Since their power base was strongly linked to the Temple of Jerusalem, the sect could not survive the Temple's destruction in AD 70, and soon disappeared into obscurity.
