Church Planting: Building Gospel-Centered Communities

hurch planting is about fostering a genuine community • that reflects the gospel's transformative power. As Steve Timmis puts it, it's a community shaped by the Spirit, modeling the reign of Christ and inviting others into this fellowship through the gospel. Our journey began in 2019 when we initiated church planting efforts in Medellin, Cebu. The following year, amidst the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, we successfully launched the Gospel Movement in Medellin. Our mission is clear: to establish disciple-making churches throughout the region by focusing on intentional disciple-making.

Reaching Our Communities

Our movement is dedicated to actively engage with the communities around us. We conduct weekly values formation sessions during the flag-raising ceremony at the Medellin Municipal Hall, which fosters a sense of community and shared purpose. Additionally, we hold Squad Weekly Interactive Meetings (SWIM) at the Medellin Police Station and facilitate spiritual enrichment sessions at the local military camp. Our campus ministry reaches several schools in Medellin, allowing us to connect with students and their families.

A key part of our outreach strategy is identifying "men of peace" in each community. These individuals help us initiate new outreach efforts and host Discovery Bible Studies through life group meetings. By building authentic relationships, we create opportunities for spiritual growth and community engagement.



Enriching Our Church and Supporting Others

Our church is committed to the principle of making disciples who make more disciples. We believe in a multi-generational approach to discipleship, where each person is empowered to share their faith with others. To strengthen our church, we have established a "Follow Me" group that consists of church leaders and willing members. In this group, participants receive training to deepen their spiritual lives, learn effective evangelism strategies, and gain skills for leading small groups. This training empowers them to start their own Discovery Bible Studies.

Furthermore, we extend our training efforts to other pastors and church workers through a Theology by Extension program at the Baptist Theological College. Our church has become a hub for training disciple-makers, utilizing resources such as T-Net (Training Network for Disciple Making Pastors and Churches) and the Disciple Making Center (DMC). As Matt Chandler aptly states, "Our goal is not a church planted but a church planting – a church planting more churches." This intentional approach to disciple-making offers a tremendous opportunity for both individual and collective growth.

Engaging in Small Groups

One of the most fulfilling aspects of our ministry is our commitment to small groups. Our trained leaders are successfully initiating their own Discovery Bible Studies, creating intimate spaces for study and prayer. After each worship service, it has become our custom to gather in small groups for prayer, reinforcing our sense of community and shared faith.

Some groups meet at different times to accommodate members' schedules. For example, Pastor Randolf leads a men's group, while Lory oversees a children's group. Other life groups are managed by trained church leaders who host meetings in their homes or nearby locations. This approach not only fosters community but also keeps costs low, ensuring everyone can participate.

Enlarging the Movement

Our initiatives have allowed us to plant multiple churches and establish numerous outreach efforts within five years. We revitalized a church in Dalingding, Daanbantayan, and started a new community of believers in Medellin.

An encouraging aspect of our work is the role children play in inviting their families to church. Every Sunday morning, we hold a breakfast ministry that provides children with a healthy meal. These children often invite their parents and grandparents to join them at church, which has led to families attending worship together.

By reaching out to fathers and creating family-oriented programs, we have seen more families coming together for worship. This holistic approach not only strengthens our church community but also reflects the gospel's message of unity and love.

Conclusion

In conclusion, our church planting efforts in Medellin, Cebu are centered around creating vibrant, gospel-centric communities. Through intentional disciple making, we actively reach out to our neighborhoods, enrich our church, and support other congregations. Igniting the Spark of a New Church Planting Movement

enter Point Church (CPC) is a Christ-centered, community-oriented, and mission-driven local body of Christ. The journey to planting this church began with a prayer drive.

We visited three potential locations, driving and praying for God's guidance. This process led to the creation of a prayer framework we call the "5 P's":

- **1. Place**: Identifying where God wanted us to plant the church. We considered three areas: Consolacion, Liloan, and Compostela.
- **2. Partners**: Seeking individuals who would join, invest in, and commit to the kingdom work.
- **3. Person of Peace**: Finding people God had prepared to receive us and our mission.
- **4. Peso**: Praying for God's financial provision to sustain the ministry.



5. Plan: Developing a strategy to reach the community effectively.

God, faithful to His promises, led us to Barangay Lamac, Consolacion — a strategic and populous area with adults, children, and young people eager for engagement. Over the past two years, we've witnessed God working through various initiatives to bless this community.

Community Impact

One significant initiative is a livelihood project supporting parents in earning a sustainable income. A mother participating in the program shared her gratitude, saying she not only gained practical skills in livelihood, health education, and gardening but also grew spiritually through small group Bible studies and values formation sessions.

Our gardening project has been another blessing, allowing families to harvest fresh vegetables for their daily needs. We also emphasize health education to promote physical well-being.

The most vital aspect of our ministry is Values Formation. Adults engage in small groups to study God's Word, pray, and encourage one another. Meanwhile, children participate in Bible classes and a feeding ministry, nurturing their spiritual and physical growth.

Answered Prayers

From the very beginning, we entrusted CPC to God, relying on prayers from many faithful partners. We are especially grateful for the guidance of mentors like Pastor Ricky Recodo and Pastor Mike Wells, who have been instrumental as spiritual leaders and counselors.

We also acknowledge the unwavering support of Cebu Gospel Church, whose generosity and prayers have greatly sustained this mission. By God's grace, CPC has grown in its three years, with families regularly attending worship services and church leaders committed to discipleship training. Many are now leading small groups and outreach programs, strengthening relationships within the community and beyond.

We are also partnering with fellow workers in Christ from northern Cebu, equipping them for discipleship-making. Although challenges and struggles arise, we press on, assured that our prayer warriors stand with us and that we serve a faithful God. Port Christian Center

E very December, we hear the sound of the children singing "We are the Boys, We are the Girls of the Port Christian Center..." They come to visit us to thank us for supporting them through our work in Missions.

Port Christian Center focuses on evangelizing children who have reached the age of accountability, accepted the Lord into their hearts as their Savior, and have been baptized. The youngest member is a little boy who is 10 years old.

Over the past three years, 18 members have been baptized at El Theological College, where the ceremonies are held. Port Christian Center holds Bible studies every Tuesday night for adult and young members. The center also organizes feedings every Thursday and Saturday evening, where volunteers, including sponsored members, teach and serve food to the children and help with cleaning afterward. Additionally, we have our Lunch Fellowships before the start of Sunday School and Divine Worship.

As we prepare for presentations, the children are offered music and voice lessons. Led by Pastor Ramon Dilao who teaches a wide variety of instruments, ranging from string to wind instruments—a gift from God that he has willingly shared with the children

of the Port Christian Center since its inception.

We plan to form a new group at the Port Christian Center, composed of alumni who have graduated from college and gone on to achieve success with God's guidance and the sponsorship of the Port Christian Center.

We pray that this new group will embody the spirit of Christians who have achieved newfound success in life and will continue to inspire the children of the Port Christian Center.

Bridging Cultures:

Mission Work Among Tribal Communities

alawan, often referred to as the "Last Frontier" of the Philippines is a home to unique blend of cultures primarily influenced by indigenous groups such as the Tagbanua, Batak, and Palaw'an. These communities face numerous challenges including limited access to education, healthcare and economic opportunities. By God's grace, we stand in the gap to provide support focusing on holistic development to bring the gospel and flourish in the community.

The last frontier of the Philippines needs our attention. Compared to 20 years ago, it is becoming more and more urbanized. New migrants are coming, some good and some not so good influencers.

Our ministry among the natives is as crucial as the outreaches in the city and slums areas. We are praying for a fruitful ministry of empowering the needy, undeveloped and underprivileged villages that are mostly indigenous people in the northern part of Palawan.

Their languages are endangered due to discrimination and disrespect by the lowlanders. But we know how precious they are in God's sight. We are aiming for a Batak and Tagbanua Caruray New Testament that will eventually be used to evangelize as well as to deepen the devotion of the believers.



Crossworld Mission - Palawan exist to know God and make Him known. We want to see tribal communities flourishing and displaying passionate love for God who will reach out to other tribal communities to love God also.

Our core values spells **LOVE** which means: Living a life that embodies the love of God to others. Obedience to the great commission and the great commandment. Vision for a great harvest for God's glory and Excellence of every believer.

Our strategies also spell **PEACE** which means: Promoting reconciliation that will lead to church planting, Equipping leaders, Assisting the poor, Caring for the sick and Educating the next generation.

We are reaching out to new communities, the seaside and mountainside villages. People's way of living is simple and indigenous. They rely on the provision from the sea and while farmers raise animals and plant root crops and rice. Most of them can hardly send their children to school but we are praying for provision. We are facilitating for some livelihood projects for the community to bridge them to other community stakeholders. Through these projects, we can build rapport to the families within the community enabling us to form Bible study group meetings in the houses and tree shades.

This December 2024 is the first year anniversary of our church in Decala, Caruray, Palawan. Praise God for the tribal leaders we discipled as a jumpoff of our church planting endeavor. Few weeks ago, the two successive typhoons destroyed our meeting place and washed out the trees on the shore that serves as our shelter during Bible studies. We are praying for a "kubo" and some benches or chairs to house our Bible study group.

As I minister to the Tagbanuas in the new church planting area, my wife is doing discipleship with the elders and families in the Batak village. Our discipleship thrust this year is "becoming big by being small."

CBDTI EXPERIENCE

ve always heard heartfelt stories from fellow church members about Ltheir experiences at CBDTI. They spoke of building lifelong friendships, connecting with others who shared their faith from across the Philippines, and how the camp became the highlight of their summer. Having never joined before, I was thrilled to hear there would be a camp this year. The thought of finally experiencing something so cherished by the ahias and achis in church filled me with excitement. I eagerly anticipated deepening my faith, forming meaningful connections, and creating memories to last a lifetime.

However, just days before the camp began, I faced an unexpected trial that shook my faith. It was a moment of heartbreak and confusion, leaving me questioning why God would allow such pain in my life. The excitement I once felt for the camp was replaced by apathy and discouragement. For the first time, I deeply questioned God's purpose for me. Why, I wondered, had He allowed me to face such a challenge? I felt abandoned, drowning in self-pity, and resentful at the thought of attending a camp meant to bring me closer to a God I struggled to trust.

On the first day of camp, I arrived at the venue feeling unmotivated, a shadow of the person who had eagerly awaited this experience just weeks before. But I tried to keep an open mind, praying for God to work in me and turn things around.

Throughout the five days, I found myself genuinely enjoying the camp. One of the most impactful moments was the outreach program on the second-to-last day. We ventured into communities around Bacolod, singing songs, teaching lessons, and sharing God's Word. It was humbling to see how small acts of service could bring joy and hope to others. In these often-overlooked communities, I saw how God's Word reaches even the most remote places. Despite limited resources and modest living conditions, the people were eager to hear about God's love. Their joy and openness reminded me that the Gospel transcends barriers-whether of language, geography, or circumstance.

One of the most powerful lessons came from our main speaker, Pastor Stephen Tan. He spoke about how we often complain about life's unfairness. As I met people in Bacolod who faced challenges of their own, I realized how true this was. Many of them lived in humble conditions, yet their faith was unwavering. Their willingness to listen and embrace the Gospel despite their struggles was inspiring.

I saw how I had been doing exactly what Pastor Stephen warned against—grumbling about my own struggles. But through his message, I began to see my trials differently. God wasn't punishing me; He was strengthening me. He allowed me to face hardships not out of resentment but out of love, teaching me to rely on Him fully. This realization tied deeply to the camp's theme: living as an authentic Christian.

Growing up in a Christian family, attending a Christian school, and being active in church, I thought I was living authentically. But I wasn't. I saw the cracks in my faith—I skipped church when I felt lazy, followed worldly ways, and doubted God's plans. I was a hypocrite, claiming to live a life of faith while my actions said otherwise.

And yet, God met me where I was. He saw my struggles and used this camp to rekindle my relationship with Him. Through the messages, the fellowship, and moments of quiet reflection, my eyes were opened to His grace. I understood that authenticity in faith isn't just about appearances—it's about aligning every decision, every thought, and every action with God's will.

As I left CBDTI, I carried with me a renewed commitment: to trust God more deeply, especially in struggles, and to stop relying on my own strength. This camp reminded me of His unfailing love and how He uses even our lowest moments to draw us closer to Him.

The speaker mentioned 5 compositions that define our "inner life". These are: inner compulsion, inner conscience, inner conviction, inner compass, and inner composure. Each of these aspects has an effect in our relationship with Christ. Please allow me to share.

First, **inner compulsion** talks about our "dark side" and the "empowering side". The "dark side" refers to the addiction of the soul which takes our attention away from the Lord while the "empowering side" refers to our hunger for God, the desire to know Him more.

I believe that everyone of us has something on our hands that takes our time away from God. Both young and old, aside from spending our time in school or at work, we have a lot of time watching dramas, playing on our phones, reading novels and list goes on. These take away our time from Jesus.

In fellowships or in worship services many of us are bowing our heads not because we are praying or taking notes but rather playing or reading from our phones or checking our facebook feed. Only a few people really seek and want to know more and be intimate with God. This is because we are caught up with what the world offers rather than what God has instore.

Second, **inner conscience** talks about our conscience—knowing what is right from what is wrong. Seeing or knowing Christians who turn a blind eye just to please or cover up someone or whatever their reasons is would speak a lot about their integrity. Our inner conscience helps us to be on the right track with God - without it what would become of us.

Third, **inner conviction** talks about our belief—what we hold on to and our conviction - what holds on to us. Our conviction says a lot about what we are and who we are. What we believe is like a legacy, the upbringing our parents or grandparents left us with which we now hold on to as we grow older.

Fourth, **inner compass** talks about our discernment—seeking knowledge on what is good or bad, true or false, based on our our Biblical foundation. If what we know about God and His word is shallow, we become an easy target to Satan'. Christians need to keep growing instead of being stagnant. Discernment and the use of our inner compass are critical in our Christian journey. Hence why it is importantly to both "sharpen" our ability to discern as well as "calibrate" our inner compass.

Fifth, **inner composure** talks about the wisdom—to know what to do and have the strength to do it. This last one is more challenging as godly wisdom has become expensive and rare commodity. Many knows a lot, but wisdom is scarce. A smart person knows what to say but a wise person knows whether to say it or not.

In conclusion I would like to quote our speaker: "Intimacy with God is our deep redemptive journey. Is our knowing, trusting, loving, and serving God and our surrender to Him meaning falling in love with Jesus again?" How much do you love Jesus?

2024's theme is "Reignite. Reroot. Resolve. Recharge."

U nbelievers need to have new roots in Christ, which starts at conversion. But for believers, each one is expected to deepen their roots as they continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ and relate with Him and His people in concrete ways.

Roots remind us of the parable of the sower in Matthew chapter 13 verse 21a that says, "But since they have no root, they last only a short time". Time is a good determiner, in this side of life, providing some" hints" of one's faith foundation in the Lord. Life will hit us on all sides in different degrees, threatening one's faith... our faith in God. How does a believer respond to the different circumstances thrown at him/her? Jeremiah 17:7-8 give us some clues:

⁷ "But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him.

⁸ They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

HEALTHY ROOTS = HEALTHY TREES

Spiritual roots are like the deep roots of a strong tree. The tree with strong roots that is continuously nourished, enabled to grow, stand strong, endure harsh winds, and weather and have resilient branches that open up to bear fruit.

New spiritual roots begin when we repent and believe in Jesus Christ, our conversion, but it should not stop there. A new believer must continue to deepen that relationship in Christ through the diligence in nourishing oneself in the word, constantly studying God's word. Jesus describes a wise builder in Matthew 7:24-25.

²⁴ "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.

²⁵ The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. Strong spiritual roots play a key role in the survival and health of a plant, it provides stability, keeping it from being blown away or washed away. They tap into the water needed for sustenance and find nutrients a plant needs to stay alive and produce fruit. Likewise, a Christian who not only, nourishes himself with the Word but also practices what He has read will be stable in his faith in Christ and will be able face difficult life circumstances.

If you are waiting to be spoon-fed, to shy away from "meatier" topics or get spiritual food from the weekly sermons at church (regardless of how it was preached) then there is a good chance that your spiritual roots are shrinking—leaving you undernourished.

It is our desire that we grow in our faith, it is possible that we've been Christians for many years but has never grown up spiritually, we desire that you grow some stability in your faith in Christ and begin "re-rooting" in the Lord through the diligence of studying His word not on a Sunday but in a regular daily basis. Keeping in touch with the Lord through prayer. 2 Peter 1:5-8,10 says:

- ⁵ "For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge;
 - ⁶ and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness;
 - ⁷ and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love.

⁸ For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁰ Therefore, my brothers and sisters, make every effort to confirm your calling and election. For if you do these things, you will never stumble."

Strong spiritual roots not only make us strong amid adversity. Like a healthy tree, it provides shade, shelter, and fruit that those under it can enjoy. Likewise, believers strong in the Lord are an encouragement to others, able to serve and minister to other's needs for they receive proper nourishment from the Lord and are to share it.

Psalm 1:2-3

² "but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night. ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers."

Let us develop a deep-rooted trust and faith in the Lord...not just simply to survive but to bear fruit that God expects and to be a blessing to others.

There comes a time in our lives when we feel as if the world is against us, and all we want to do is to lock ourselves in and shut out the world. I've done this for most of my life—it was one of the many mechanisms I had drilled into myself but had stopped using over the years.

When I had problems as a child, I would bury myself in books of mysteries, romances and fairy tales. It was my personal haven to imagine a world where everything was perfect. Although the characters in the stories faced adversity, I always knew there was a happy ending at the end of it all.

It was one of my favorite mechanisms to go inside a book and read it for hours and hours a day just to push reality out of my mind. As they say, "Out of Mind, Out of Sight."

After years of believing in our loving Savior, I felt that way once again. The feeling of wanting to shut the world out and go back to the perfect, peaceful world I've created in my mind all those years.

On July 30, 2015, the day before my grandmother's burial, my family hosted a mass that included the blessing of my grandmother's coffin. I stayed quietly inside the adjoined room that led to the kitchen and a twin-spaced bedroom, where I opened my notes to study for the exams coming that following week. I was so ready to give up, but God saved me. He saved me from wallowing in selfpity, closing in on myself, and hiding behind the shadows. I was saved from going back to the way I was before. I could feel the walls building up, but He tore it all down with one go.



I had only started to read the first page of my notes when my mother suddenly stormed into the room. She angrily shouted at my sister and me about how we should have been outside in the mass to wait for the part of my grandmother's blessing. As usual, she blamed us for disrespecting their religion and told us how bad children we were.

I was offended that they didn't seem to care that I was studying for my exams; and worse, that they accused me of disrespecting their religion. I started to feel tears forming in the corner of my eyes. However, I held it in and rushed out of the room as soon as the mass was over, but my mom found me and started shouting at me and my sister again.

That morning, my sister had already pounded the wall three times. She proceeded to punch the wall of the funeral home's comfort room four more times. Things went downhill after that. I always felt that my own parents didn't understand me, and I thought I was fine with that.

Still, every hurt bubbled to the surface every night, and the tears just wouldn't go away. No matter how many times I tried to hold them in, the tears kept flowing. The aching, which had nothing to do with the almost constant headaches I'd been having that day, was painful and heavy. I felt as if my heart was being torn and crumpled over and over until there was nothing left. The anger I had bottled and tucked away in the corner of my mind, for fear of what I might do, opened. And that is when all hell broke loose. I was ready to give up. The defense mechanism that I had built up through the years activated. I was starting to tell myself to shut down, lock up every single emotion I have, and practically be a robot. "Do everything that they want," I would say. "Don't feel anything."

These were circulating in my head, and I felt even more down when they started blaming the church. I was so ready to give up, but God saved me. He saved me from wallowing in selfpity, closing in on myself, and hiding behind the shadows. I was saved from going back to the way I was before. I could feel the walls building up, but He tore it all down with one go.

St. Peter Funeral Home provided us with a tribute. Along with it came the song "Blessing" by Laura Story, a video entitled "A Father's Love Letter," which was about how tears and sorrow can be a blessing in disguise, and a compilation of verses from the Bible that talks of God's love, His strength and mercy and the comfort He brings, respectively.

I also found that someone explained to my mother why we were inside the room and not at the mass. She understood then and there, but the damage had already been done. I cried and cried in plain sight yet hid it all at the same time. No one had noticed. Even when I tried to suppress the tears and the heavy ache, they were still visible.

After the tribute ended, I had fully cried all my tears out, but the heavy burden was still there. I thank God that anger hadn't exploded—if it did, then I have no idea what I would have done, and that is terrifying enough. However, God was gracious and answered my prayer. You see, I had asked for a miracle that night, and instead of giving me one, He gave me three: Assurance, Comfort and most importantly my Life—something I truly didn't deserve and with what was going through my head.

I wouldn't be here. I'm the sort of girl who comes prepared. I always have medicine in my bag for headaches, allergies, fevers, and even coughs and colds. You can only imagine how many pills were in my bag. I'm pretty sure I wouldn't be here any longer if He hadn't intervened at the right time.

Whether you're a parent, a teenager, or even a child, you need to know that what you say to others will hurt them. You might think that it's just words, but that could be the reason why that person you hurt never wakes up again.

Here's another piece of advice: always express your feelings to someone, whether they are good or bad. Don't bottle it all up and let it fester and grow, because it wouldn't do you any good. I know this makes you more vulnerable, but it's better to be open with our feelings than to let the emotions build up until you can't take it anymore and explode.

Heed my advice and take it from someone who has experienced it. Always remember: God is our Comfort and our Strength.

Joshua's story is one of unwavering commitment and resolve to trust and obey God, even when the odds seemed impossible. His journey invites us to reflect on our own walk with God, reminding us that faith often requires standing firm when the path ahead is unclear.

Joshua's first major test came when he led the Israelites into the Promised Land after Moses' death (1:1-2.) The task was daunting, and Jericho-a fortified city with towering walls-seemed unconquerable. Yet Joshua followed God's unusual command to march around the city for seven days, trusting in His promise (6:2-5). As a result, the walls of Jericho fell (6:20). We often face our own "Jerichos"-situations that seem insurmountable or where God's instructions defy logic. Joshua's resolve challenges us: Will we trust God's promises, even when they do not make sense? Faith means stepping forward even when the outcome is unclear. Joshua's confidence came from God's word: "Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their ancestors." (1:6). His example encourages us to hold on to God's promises, even when we cannot see the result.

A striking moment occurred when five kings allied against Israel, creating overwhelming number of enemies (10:5). Joshua marched into battle with faith, and in response, God made the sun stand still, ensuring Israel's victory (10:12-14). This shows us that when we stand firm in faith, God meets us with His miraculous power, providing what we need to overcome life's biggest challenges

(*Exodus 14*:14). I assume you are facing battles today. When the odds are against you, do you react with fear or faith? Joshua's life reminds us that God fights for us when we trust Him. Bold steps of faith allow God to work powerfully, just as He did for Joshua, "who put foreign armies to flight." (*Hebrews 11*:32-34).

Joshua's strength did not come from military skill but from his commitment to God's Word. From the start, God instructed him to meditate on the Law day and night (1:8). Joshua's dedication to Scripture was key to his success and the spiritual health of those he led. His life reminds us that our spiritual strength is deeply connected to our engagement with God's Word. In today's fastpaced world, it is easy to neglect time with God's Word. But Joshua shows us the importance of making Scripture the foundation of our lives. How might things change if we committed ourselves to regularly meditating on God's Word? *Ps* 1:2-3)

As Joshua neared the end of his life, he gathered the Israelites to renew their commitment to God. He boldly declared: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." (24:15.) His words challenge us to make a clear choice in our own lives (*Deuteronomy 30:19*). Joshua's life encourages us to renew our resolve, trust in God, and stand firm in faith. Like Joshua, we can confidently face challenges, knowing that God is with us every step of the way. May we, too, resolve and declare: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

AIN. This is the time of the year when we experience so much of it. It just pours - in the morning, in the afternoon or at night. Thank God many times it comes late at night till the early dawn. When I wake up to start a new day, I always thank God for cleaning the air. The best part is that I do not have to get wet walking in the rain as I travel to Sitio Dubai, Sudtunggan, Lapu-Lapu City for the Muslim Literacy Program.

Some people love the rain, others just do not like it, as it becomes inconvenient to go around our daily grind. But like it or not, life must go on.

When OM started the ministry in Sitio Dubai, I was assigned to spearhead it. For three days a week, I travel from my house to Lapu-Lapu City for at least 2 hours, taking four rides - a bus or jeepney and then a tricycle. Oh, and not forgetting the 25-minute walk I took to get to the main road. This is why it is very important for me that it does not rain in the morning. Thus, every night I would pray and ask God for it. And sure enough, God answers my prayers. Since the day we started early last year up until present, I have never gotten wet on my way to Sitio Dubai.

As such, I always give thanks to God, even boasting that he is indeed so good and faithful. Since then, I have always trusted He will do it again and again. I was certain He will never fail me. True enough, even if the day were cloudy, He would hold up the rain whenever it was time for me to travel from 6:30 am to about 9:00 am until I reach the madrasah, where we hold our classes with the children.

Until one day, a friend showed me a video from the series called "The CHOSEN." In one of the conversations between Jesus and James (who has a problem with his leg and could not walk normally). He asked, "Master, why didn't You heal me?" Jesus replied ".... because I trust you." He continued, "Little James, in the Father's will, I could heal, and you will have a good story to tell. But there are already dozens, hundreds and even thousands more. I believe that even if I do not heal you, you will live to show people you can be patient with what you are suffering here on earth, knowing that one day it will all be gone in eternity. Few are entrusted with this. Not many can understand this. James, I love you... the Lord gives, and He takes away.

I thought I understood what I just saw. But God wanted me to learn something, and He allowed me to experience it personally.

The following day, when I woke up, it was raining. As usual, I prayed and asked God to make it stop. As I was leaving the house, it was still drizzling. I continued to beg to the Lord. But as I walked along, it kept pouring. Then I remembered the video the day before. It was as if the Lord spoke right to me, "Ann, I could stop the rain as I always did every time you asked Me to. But if today I choose not to do it, what is it to you? Will you still be happy serving Me? Will you still say I am a good God? Will you stop believing, loving, and serving Me because I did not give you that for which you prayed?"

Suddenly, I was embarrassed before my Lord and Savior. I realized I have been selfish all along. I assumed that being a child of God, He will always answer YES to me, especially since I am sacrificially serving Him. But that very day, God made me learn a very precious lesson from His natural visual aid. Right then and there, I affirmed in my heart that no matter what the circumstance may be, rain or shine, I will serve Him faithfully. As I walked on, the rain stopped and I said to myself, "walking in the rain to serve my Heavenly Father is not so bad after all.

grew up in a religious family where going to church is a regular part of life. As a child, I knew about God, but I didn't think too deeply about Him—I just went with the flow. Deep down, though, I often felt a heaviness in my heart. I followed whatever my parents told me to do, but at one point, I started to hate going to Sunday school, and my family had no idea how I felt.

Things changed when our school held a program called Bible Week. It was during this program that I truly felt God's presence for the first time. I realized how lukewarm my faith had been, and throughout that week, I began to understand who the God really is. Around that time, in grade 4 or 5, I made the decision to accept Christ into my life.

One verse that became especially meaningful to me is Psalm 18:2: "The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold." This verse carved itself into my heart because I often felt so down, pretending to be happy and strong in front of others. It reminded me that I did not have to carry everything on my own. It speaks of God as a source of strength and protection, a fortress when you feel vulnerable, a deliverer when you're overwhelmed, and a refuge when you need a safe place to rest your weary heart. Pretending to be happy can be exhausting, and it's okay to acknowledge your struggles. I think that time I really failed most of the test and I feel so useless and always studies harder than any others. But because of that verse I got encourage on that on it was really miracle I got to honor list for the first time.

After that Bible Week, I can see God really guiding me and showing me that he is there. One of the most surprising ways God worked in my life was when my best friend who was Buddhist invited me to join a Bible study. She was my closest friend, and I never expected someone from a different faith to invite me to something like this. But God used her to draw me closer to Him, and through that, I began to learn more about God. From that moment on, I could clearly see God working in my life. I felt a significant shift in myself, and I could tell that my perspective on life had changed. I no longer saw things the same way as before and I found a deep joy and strength in God that I had never experienced before.

The decision to get baptized came after many things happened that made me want to take this step. It wasn't an easy decision; it took me a long time to make up my mind because it felt heavy. I prayed a lot because of this. But I realized that life is short, and if I do not do it now, then when? So, I decided that baptism would be my way of publicly declaring what God has already done in my heart.

My journey to this moment has been filled with challenges, doubts, and questions. Life has tested me in ways I never expected, and there were times when I felt overwhelmed and uncertain about where I was headed, especially this year. Acts 2:42

"And they devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

The concept of Recharge is a vital addition to the themes of Reignite, Reroot, and Resolve. While these traits are commendable on their own, as believers, we cannot fully embody them without the recharging power of the Spirit. In the Bible, the idea of recharging is closely related to the concept of renewal.

We see this in Isaiah 40:31, where the Lord renews our strength, enabling us to soar like eagles. The Hebrew word for renew conveys the idea of restoring something that was lost. Similarly, recharging our lives and faith is only possible when we draw from a source that gives freely—God Himself. If we attempt to recharge through worldly means, relationships, activities, or events, we end up filling ourselves with emptiness.

To truly understand renewal or recharging, the Bible emphasizes coming earnestly before God. This is why the Psalms are filled with imagery of being in God's presence or at His feet, expressing a longing to draw closer to Him. It is in this closeness that we are filled with His Spirit. Prayer and devotion are therefore essential, as they bring us nearer to God.

Likewise, worship and fellowship are expressions of our internal relationship with God made visible to the world around us. Being with fellow believers reminds us that our lives and time are not meant solely for ourselves.

This serves as both a caution and an encouragement: never forsake fellowship with God and with His people. One without the other is incomplete and can hinder spiritual growth.

On a personal note, I often struggle with thoughts of ending my service to God, wishing for an escape from life's burdens or the suffering yet to come. I know many of us can relate. In these moments of doubt, I turn to Boksu (pastor) not necessarily for advice but to share the weight of my burdens. He, too, wonders why God has not taken him after 50 years of ministry, yet he always leaves me with the same words: "God is not finished with us."

Whenever he says that, my complaints fade. I cannot fully explain it, but hearing a man of such faith, filled with the Spirit and love for God's people, always reignites my faith, keeps me grounded, and strengthens my resolve.

Lesson to learn: There are many who have not yet come to know the ture God. We need to act as God's messengers and spread the Gospel to them. (Matt. 28:19-20)

The shepherds immediately went to Bethlehem to see Jesus. They glorified and praised God. (Luke 2:8-20)

Lesson to learn: We must seek the Lord and praise Him. We must be witnesses of Christ with good testimonies for His glory. (Ps. 27:4)

King Herod

- He was called Herod the Great.
- He had 3 sons: Archelaus, Herod Antipas, and Philip.
- He ordered all the boys 2 years and under in Bethlehem to be killed.

His Role at Christmas: The Destroyer of Christ's birth

King Herod was disturbed, and told the Magi to find the child and report to him. But the Magi were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod. When King Herod realized he was outwitted by the Magi, he was furious and gave orders to kill all the boys, which were two years old and under in Bethlehem and within its vicinity. (Mat. 2:3-16)

Lesson to learn: Three Bible stories illustrated the consequences of jealousy. First, it drove Cain to kill his brother Abel. Second, it made Joseph's brothers sell him into slavery to Potiphar, Pharaoh's captain of the guard. Third, jealousy and fear caused Herod to order the massacre of all male boys in Bethlehem aged two and under. Jealousy leads to anger, anger breeds hatred, and hatred ultimately results in death. Therefore, we should never harbor jealousy in our hearts. (Phil. 2:3)

- He considered Jesus to be the light of the Gentiles and the glory of the Jews.

His Role at Christmas: The High Hope of Christ's birth

When Simeon's hope of seeing the child was fulfilled, he asked the Lord to dismiss him in peace. (Luke 2:25-32)

Lesson to learn: The signs of Christ's second coming are: earthquakes, pestilence, famines, wars, lightning, thunder, and hailstorms. All these events are happening now. Therefore, we must watch and pray. Be prepared to meet the Lord anytime. (Matt. 24:44)

She gave thanks to God and spoke about the Child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem. (Luke 2:36-38)

Lesson to learn: Every believer should attend church worship service regularly, and have a daily devotion with God through Bible reading and prayer. (Col. 4:2)

Lesson to learn: Let us emulate John the Baptist's virtues of faithfulness, humility and courage. Faithful to His work, humble to all the people, and courageous enough to preach God's message.

The 2025 theme, Pursue, Persist, and Prevail, encapsulates a powerful and purposeful journey in the Christian faith. It builds upon the 2024 theme of Re-ignite, Re-root, Resolve, and Recharge, taking the next steps in a faithful walk with Christ.

The 2024 theme focused on renewal, awakening a deeper desire for God, and setting a strong foundation for a lasting faith. Re-ignite called believers to rekindle their love for God, Re-root invited them to establish deep roots in the faith, Resolve encouraged a firm commitment to persevere, and Recharge was about being continually empowered by the Holy Spirit. This created a cycle, where each action led to the next, a continual process of renewal and growth.

With that foundation laid, Pursue, Persist, and Prevail answers the question: What's next? It emphasizes the ongoing nature of faith—faith that doesn't stop at renewal but actively moves forward. These three words are more than a call to action; they are a framework for a Christian life that endures to the end.

- 1. **Pursue** Faith is not passive; it requires a desire to actively seek God, to chase after His will, and to draw near to Him. The Christian is called to prioritize the pursuit of God's presence, His will, and His purpose for their lives.
- 2. Persist Faithfulness is a long journey, and persistence is key. Much like the resolve of 2024, persist highlights the need for endurance, especially when faith feels mundane or repetitive. It's about staying committed despite challenges, knowing that the reward of being a faithful servant is worth the effort.
- 3. Prevail Ultimately, the Christian journey leads to victory. The word prevail reminds believers that, despite the struggles of life, those who remain faithful will experience ultimate triumph with Christ. This isn't just about surviving; it's about overcoming and being victorious in the Lord.

In keeping with the 2024 theme's emphasis on faithfulness and renewal, the 2025 theme suggests that

faith is an ongoing, active pursuit. As followers of Christ, we aren't simply meant to start the journey—we continue with purpose and perseverance. And in the end, we will prevail because Christ has already won the victory for us.

To deepen the understanding of this theme, the Epistles of 1 and 2 Peter serve as a fitting foundation. Peter's letters are full of encouragement to continue in the faith, to endure suffering with hope, and to look toward the promised victory in Christ. They speak to the Christian's call to pursue holiness, to persist in trials, and to prevail in the hope of salvation.

In summary, Pursue, Persist, and Prevail is not just a theme but a call to action for every believer. It's a simple yet profound reminder that, having re-ignited and re-rooted our faith, we are now to actively pursue God's will, persist in faith through trials, and ultimately prevail in the victory Christ has secured for us. The alliteration of the theme is intentional, making it memorable and easy to internalize, while its meaning is rich with theological depth and practical application.

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FIND WHAT IS LOST

Our church's 2024 theme, Reignite, Reroot, Resolve, and Recharge, encourages believers to rediscover what may be lost in their spiritual journey.

Re-ignite: Rekindle passion for God.

Re-root: Anchor deeply in God's infallible Word.

Resolve: Commit to being Spirit-filled and a blessing to others.

Recharge: Draw strength from God, the source of love, hope, and truth.

REIGNITE THE FIRE

The theme word "Reignite" emphasizes the need to rekindle our spiritual passion amidst life's complexities. Many of us may lose focus, attending church without genuine worship, love for God's Word, or a heart for the lost. Reigniting our passion for the Lord is essential, as reflected in this prayer:

"Dear Lord, whatever it is I desire, may I desire You more... May You be more to me than anything in this world."

A reignited passion for the Lord leads to renewed love for His Word, as seen in Psalm 119:97-98, and obedience to its teachings (James 1:22). This passion extends to fulfilling the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20), reaching the lost and making disciples for God's expanding family.

If passion for the Lord, His Word, or the lost wanes, we must examine our faith (2 Cor. 13:5). True passion aligns all aspects of our lives with God's purpose.

MY FIRST CBDTI EXPERIENCE

Attending my first CBDTI camp was a transformative journey. Initially excited to deepen my faith and form meaningful connections, I faced an unexpected personal trial just days before camp, leaving me questioning God's purpose and feeling distant from Him. Despite arriving unmotivated, the camp rekindled my faith.

The outreach program profoundly impacted me as I witnessed the joy and openness of Bacolod's communities despite their challenges. Pastor Stephen Tan's message reminded me that hardships aren't punishments but opportunities for growth in faith. This realization aligned with the camp's theme of living as an authentic Christian.

Through the fellowship, teachings, and reflection, I recognized my hypocrisy in faith and embraced God's grace. The camp renewed my commitment to trust Him fully, especially in struggles, and live authentically by aligning my actions with His will. It was a powerful reminder of God's unfailing love and transformative presence.

NURTURING OUR INTIMACY WITH GOD

Many Christians struggle with intimacy with God, distracted by worldly pursuits. The IDMC conference emphasized cultivating the "inner life" through five aspects:

- **Inner compulsion**: Balancing distractions with a hunger for God.
- **Inner conscience**: Maintaining integrity and discerning right from wrong.
- **Inner conviction**: Holding firm to faith and beliefs.
- Inner compass: Using Biblical discernment to navigate life.
- Inner composure: Exercising wisdom and courage in actions.

Intimacy with God is a journey of knowing, trusting, and loving Him, requiring focus and surrender. As Oswald Chambers notes, staying centered on Christ allows God to use us meaningfully.

RE-ROOT

Spiritual roots are essential for both new and seasoned believers. For unbelievers, roots in Christ begin at conversion. For believers, faith must deepen through consistent engagement with God's Word, prayer, and application of biblical truths. Matthew 13:21 warns that without roots, faith falters under pressure, while Jeremiah 17:7-8 illustrates that trust in the Lord sustains and nourishes believers, like a tree planted by water.

Healthy spiritual roots provide stability, resilience, and fruitfulness. Strong roots are developed by daily study of Scripture, not relying solely on sermons or avoiding deeper spiritual topics. Deep roots enable Christians to withstand adversity, remain productive in God's work, and provide encouragement and blessing to others. As Psalm 1:2-3 reminds us, those rooted in God's Word will prosper and bear fruit, fulfilling His purpose for their lives.

A LIFE HE SAVED

There are moments in life when everything feels overwhelming, and shutting out the world seems like the only solution. I lived much of my life this way, burying myself in books and hiding my emotions. However, one night during my grandmother's wake, a family conflict left me feeling deeply hurt, misunderstood, and ready to give up entirely.

I was overwhelmed with anger, sadness, and the temptation to shut down emotionally. But in that dark moment, God intervened. Through a tribute at the funeral home featuring the song "Blessing" and the video A Father's Love Letter, God reminded me of His love, comfort, and mercy. That night, I prayed for a miracle, and He gave me three: assurance, comfort, and the saving of my life.

God taught me to express my emotions and lean on Him for strength. He remains my Comfort and Strength, always intervening at the right time.

RESOLVE

Joshua's story of unwavering faith and resolve demonstrated the importance of trusting and obeying God even in the face of impossible odds. When tasked with leading the Israelites into the Promised Land, Joshua followed God's commands despite the daunting challenge of Jericho. His faith in God's promises led to victory, showing us that stepping forward in faith, even when outcomes are unclear, invites God's power into our lives. His life teaches us that bold faith allows God to work powerfully on our behalf. Joshua's strength came not from military skill but from his commitment to meditating on God's Word. As he neared the end of his life, Joshua boldly declared, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord," urging us to renew our resolve to trust and serve God in all circumstances.

TESTIMONIES

Even though it rains frequently, I thank God for always holding it off during my travels to Sitio Dubai for the Muslim Literacy Program. Since this ministry began, I've prayed every night for dry mornings, and God has faithfully answered, ensuring I never got wet on my way to serve.

I watched a scene from The Chosen where Jesus tells James that trust in God is not dependent on receiving what we ask for. The following day, it rained despite my prayers. As I walked in the rain, I felt God asking, "Will you still serve Me even when I don't grant your request?" This moment revealed my selfishness, assuming God would always say yes because I was serving Him.

That day, I learned a precious lesson: rain or shine, I will serve Him faithfully. Truly, God is good!

Growing up in a religious family, I knew about God but didn't feel deeply connected to Him. As a child, I went through the motions, even resenting Sunday school. However, during a school Bible Week in grade 4 or 5, I experienced God's presence for the first time, realizing my faith had been lukewarm. I decided to accept Christ, finding strength in Psalm 18:2, which reminded me that I didn't have to bear life's burdens alone. This verse gave me encouragement during struggles, even helping me achieve my first honor list placement. God continued to guide me, surprising me through my Buddhist best friend who invited me to a Bible study. This deepened my relationship with Him and brought profound joy and strength. After much prayer and reflection, I chose baptism to publicly declare my faith. It symbolizes leaving behind my old self and embracing a life led by Christ, trusting Him completely in all things.

Growing up surrounded by Christian family and friends, I loved attending church every Sunday—not only to know God more but also to spend time with my friends. Church and school Bible studies strengthened my faith and filled me with awe for God's greatness.

However, the Covid-19 pandemic challenged me deeply. Being infected with the virus multiple times, I questioned why God allowed such hardships. Over time, I realized these trials were meant to strengthen my faith. Despite the struggles, God protected me, and I saw His hand at work. I experienced the warmth of God's love through the support of kind people around me.

Now, I am publicly declaring my faith through baptism, committed to growing in God's love and trusting Him even in difficult times.

RECHARGE

The Bible connects recharging to renewal, as seen in Isaiah 40:31, where God restores our strength to soar like eagles. True renewal comes only from God, not from worldly means that leave us empty. To recharge, we must earnestly seek God through prayer and devotion, drawing closer to Him to be filled with His Spirit. Worship and fellowship are vital expressions of our relationship with God, reminding us that our lives are not meant solely for ourselves. Neglecting fellowship with God or His people can hinder our spiritual growth.

In moments of doubt, I am reminded that "God is not finished with us." This truth reignites my faith, keeps me grounded, and strengthens my resolve to continue serving Him.

PERSONALITIES INVOLVED IN THE NATIVITY STORY

The story of the first Christmas includes key personalities who played instrumental roles in the birth of Jesus.

Angel Gabriel announced Christ's birth, teaching us to accept God's work. **Joseph**, obedient to God, showcases the importance of faith and submission. **Mary** selflessly offered her body to fulfill God's plan, reminding us to be living sacrifices.

Angels acted as messengers of good news, inspiring us to spread the Gospel. **Shepherds** witnessed Christ's birth and praised God, demonstrating humility and devotion. The **Magi** worshipped Jesus with gifts, urging us to honor God with our resources. Conversely, **King Herod**, driven by jealousy, sought to destroy Christ, cautioning against envy.

Simeon and **Anna** exemplified hope and devotion, while **John the Baptist** prepared the way for Jesus, modeling humility and faithfulness. These personalities involved in the Nativity Story inspire us to serve, worship, and embody virtues that we can use to spread the kingdom of God.

While Re-ignite, Re-root, Resolve, and Recharge focused on rekindling faith, establishing deep roots, committing to perseverance, and being empowered by the Spirit, the 2025 theme moves believers forward in their spiritual journey.

Pursue calls Christians to actively seek God's presence, will, and purpose. **Persist** emphasizes endurance in faith, especially during challenges, while **Prevail** reminds believers of ultimate victory through Christ. Together, these steps reflect an ongoing, purposeful, and triumphant faith.

Rooted in the teachings of 1 and 2 Peter, the theme encourages perseverance through trials, pursuit of holiness, and hope in salvation. We hope this inspires believers to move beyond renewal, embracing a lifelong, victorious walk with Christ.
